The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

** Believe it or not, Ash Wednesday is this Wednesday, March 6. Though it is not a Holyday of Obligation, many people treat it as such. See our schedule elsewhere in this paper. Remember, the distribution of ashes takes place after the homily, not at the end of the Mass or service. (And no... selfimposition of ashes is not allowed!) What is important is not just getting the ashes marking our forehead but coming together as the Body of Christ with the scripture and prayers that accompany the action of receiving the ashes.

** As you will see later in this paper, we are



presenting something different for you this Lent. We have a challenge for you and your family. We have 40 suggested "activities" for you and your family (younger children) to do. Most of these are pretty simple, like attending a weekend Mass as a family! Then we have 20 more super challenges for adults...though they are not all that difficult either, e.g., sign up for a daily Lenten reflection to be delivered to your phone every day, watch a 20 or 30 minute video or pray the whole rosary and not just one decade of the rosary. A little more time but a lot more profit! So I hope you can take this little challenge as a family and as an adult. Overall, they do not take much time compared to all the things you do. Give it a try and see how you do. When you complete a task cross it off. The real challenge would be to see if you can cross off every box. During the Easter season, we will have a little celebration for all those who worked on the challenge and have something to show for it.

The word "holiness" may bring to mind one or more of these thoughts: the saints, priests and religious, lots of prayer, even "that's not me". Pope Francis would not entirely agree.

In a recent apostolic exhortation, his "modest goal is to repropose the call to holiness in a practical way for our own time, with all its risks, challenges

and opportunities." (Rejoice and Be Glad: The Call to Holiness in Today's World, 2018) He says it is Jesus who

calls each of us to holiness. Vatican II describes the path to holiness as being "Each in his or her own way".

Every person in this world has a mission. "A Christian cannot think of his or her mission on earth without seeing it as a path of holiness." With God's grace, we can perform our mission and be holy.

Pope Francis writes that we need to be "living our lives with love" in whatever role we have in life. He says that by doing small things we will grow in holiness. They could be things we could just as easily not do or require a little sacrifice or make us go out of our way or consciously decide to avoid. Pope Francis points out that our mission must be intertwined with Christ's mission. That means we are to "build with Him that kingdom of love, justice

and universal peace".

With the start of Lent, this is great food for thought. Here are some questions to ask ourselves.

What do I think my mission is? (Think about what takes the majority of my time.)

Am I living out my mission intertwined with Christ's mission? How can I inject His mission into mine remembering that "little things" can make a difference?




Join the Lent Book Club
