### ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

### MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

### PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes.

**Adults over 21** need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

## Half and Half from Msgr. Gary Smetanka

In one week, on Saturday March 13, the general dispensation regarding the obligation for Catholics in the Archdiocese of Detroit to participate in Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation will be lifted. It has been a whole year since this dispensation came down for all Catholics in the Archdiocese. Hard to believe. Never did I think or imagine, that the decision made a year ago would still be operative one year later. We have made some great progress as our churches were opened for the celebration of the sacraments last May. Gradually more people, thanks be to God, have returned to church to receive the sacraments, that's what is essential for our spiritual life. Here we are a year after first shutting things down. Last March I was thinking ... maybe in a few weeks, or certainly a few months, we would get "back to normal" and life would go on. We know now that our life will not be as we knew it for some time. Wearing masks will probably be part of our daily routine for many more months, as we continue to show our care and compassion for those with whom we live, work, shop and socialize. Even in church, masks and distancing between households will be around for a while!

Next weekend, as the general dispensation to the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass gets lifted, please become familiar with the personal dispensations that support the circumstances for many people. If you are sick yourself, please stay home and know you are dispensed from the obligation. If you are caring for an elderly person or one who is health compromised, you have the personal dispensation. If you have a fear of contracting a serious illness by being in a crowd, you have the personal dispensation. However, if you are out and about engaged in non-essential activities, then the personal dispensation is NOT for you. You have to be honest with yourself, not simply saying, "we are good with just watching on tv" ...or saying a few prayers at home.

As we expect a few more people returning home to celebrate Sunday Mass, I ask for your patience and cooperation in order to truly welcome and accommodate those returning to Mass. If you are sitting in one of the longer pews, please either move toward the center of the pew or allow others to move to the center in order to sit some larger families. Also, remember masks are required, covering the nose and the mouth, in our care and concern for others. [Even if you have received all your vaccine shots, you can still be the carrier of the virus and masks help to reduce that transmission.] Thank you for helping to welcome back to Sunday Mass those who join us next weekend and the weeks ahead.

\*\* This Thursday we have a special Lent prayer service at 7 pm. This type of service is often referred as a "Taize" prayer service. Taize is a small town in France where an ecumenical monastic community, since 1940, have drawn many thousands of people into a wonderful prayer service. These services are pretty simple in terms of music, often repeating simple phrases. Many people know of the song, "Jesus, remember me, when you come into your kingdom." As it keeps repeating, this is Taize in its simple but profound prayer. With a very creative and focused environment, often dimly lit with many candles, it draws participants into some deeper meditation, often a source of healing and peacefulness. If you have not experienced such a prayer, please join us Thursday night! Don't be surprised if you really enjoy it!

 \*\* Last Saturday I think the full moon effected our electronics. ## Come Home to Hope General Dispensation Lifted March 13

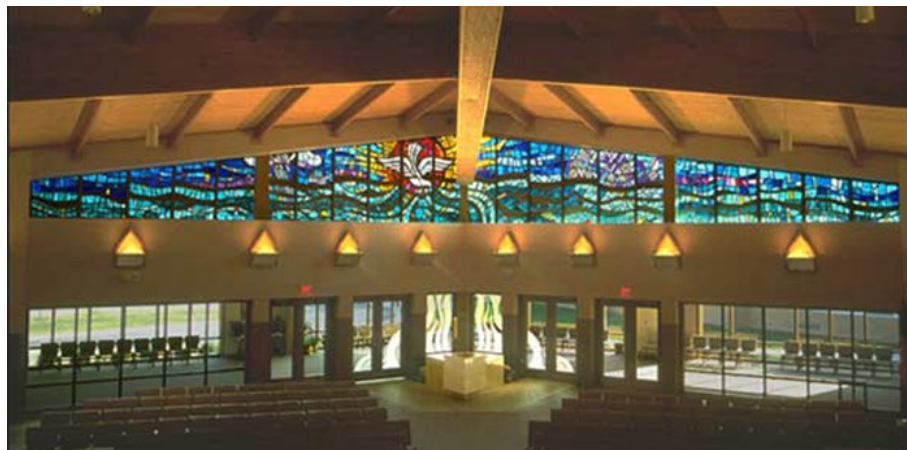
Beginning Saturday afternoon, March 13, 2021, the general obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is **reinstated** for the Archdiocese of Detroit. Considering the grave obligation we have to be physically present with our brothers and sisters on Sunday and Holy Day, each of us is asked to make a good and sincere judgement as to whether the following circumstances apply or not.

While the *general dispensation* is removed, there are specific instances where the dispensation will continue, as well as those circumstances where there is no obligation in the first place. One does not have an obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days in the following circumstances and can have a **personal dispensation**:

1. You are will or your health would be significantly compromised if you were to contract a communicable illness. Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass,
2. You exhibit flu-like symptoms. Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass,
3. You have good reason to think you might be asymptomatic of a contagious illness (e.g, you were in recent contact with someone who tested positive for an illness. Please use the dispensation and do not attend Mass,
4. You care for the sick, homebound, or infirmed,
5. You are pregnant.
6. Those y65 years of age or older (per the CDC recommendations for high risk people)
7. You cannot attend Mass through no fault of your own (e.g., no Mass is offered, you are infirmed, wanting to go you were prevented for some reason behind your control (e.g., your ride did not show up, the church reached its capacity)).
8. If you have significant fear or anxiety of becoming ill by being at Mass.

[These categories will be reviewed in due course and revised as needed.]

Those within categories #1-8 above must still observe the Lord's Day and are encouraged to spend time in prayer in Scripture, meditating on the Lord's passion death and resurrection.

## A Guide for Confession

Begin your confession with the sign of the cross, "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Bless me Father for I have sinned....it has been \_\_\_\_\_ weeks (months, years) since my last confession.

Say the sins that you remember. Start with the one(s) that is most difficult to say. After confessing all the sins you remember since your last good confession, you may conclude by saying, "I am sorry for these and all the sins of my past life."

Listen to the words of the priest. He will assign you some penance. Doing the penance will diminish the temporal punishment due to sins already forgiven. When invited, express some prayer of sorrow or Act of Contrition such as:

### **An Act of Contrition**

*(two similar Acts of Contrition are posted in the Confessional)*

*O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended you and I detest all my sins, because I dread the loss of heaven and the pains of hell. But most of all because I have offended you, my God, who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve with the help of your grace, to confess my sins, to do penance and to amend my life.*

*Amen.*

### **At the End of Confession**

Listen to the words of absolution, the sacramental forgiveness of the Church through the ordained priest.

- As you listen to the words of forgiveness, make the sign of the cross with the priest.

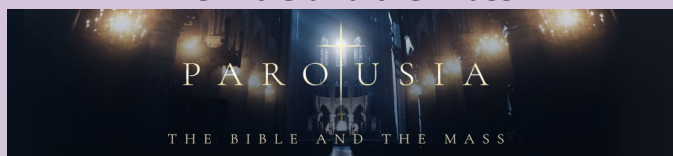

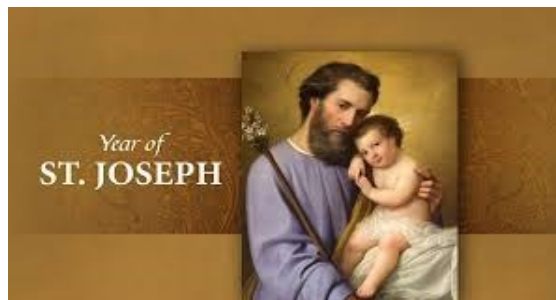

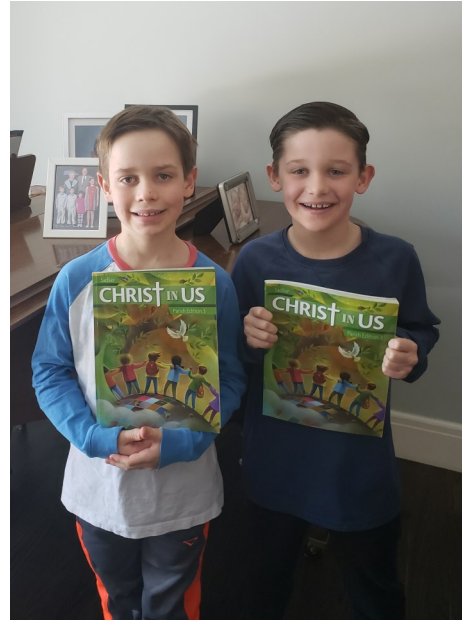
