How is Lent going? There is still time to make it significant for you! There is still time to pick up some extra scripture reading, spend some extra time in prayer, be more aware of where your almsgiving can make a significant difference, enter into a fast from food, television, social media or other aspects of life that distract us from being focused on the Lord and his will for you.

Last week Thursday, during the little snow episode, Fr. Brian Meldrum and Fr. Mario Amore gave a wonderful presentation on all that we need in the Eucharist. I am so thankful for the 30 people who showed up because I was hoping for 6 people given the weather! These two priests, with their God given musical talents, deepened our understanding of the beautiful gift of the Eucharist. It was evident that no one wanted their presentation to end! It certainly was a great prelude to Awaken! the following night.

On Friday April 6 Awaken! will return for another evening of praise, worship, dynamic preaching and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. We had about 300 people last Friday and I am sure we will have more next time. The band is terrific and you can't help to be drawn into the music! Mark your calendar now for the next Awaken! on Friday, April 6 right here at Star of the Sea.

These are really powerful nights with the Blessed Sacrament. I am never surprised when I hear that some type of physical or spiritual healing has taken place during the evening. That is how powerful some of these nights are!! If you were there and you had some type of healing or conversion, or you know someone who has, please let me know!!

** Holy Week is not that far off! It is the greatest week of the year in terms of what we celebrate and how we celebrate our liturgies. On Holy Thursday evening, during the Mass of the Lord's Last Supper at 7 pm, we have the "washing of the feet," following the command of the Lord that we hear in the scripture that night. It is a powerful ritual...to see and to be a part of. However, we always have a difficulty to get people to volunteer one of their feet! Might you consider that this year??



We are looking for all ages, male and female. What you have to do is pretty simple. After the homily you come up to a chair with 5 other people, remove a shoe and sock (if wearing one), a little water is poured over your foot, it is dried and that is it! If you are willing to participate in this beautiful ritual, please let me know via email or phone! Thank you.

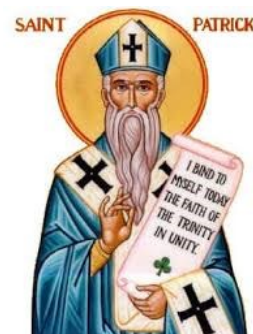

How's your Lent going?

As we continue our Lenten journey to be changed by His glory and continue to try and make this the best Lent ever do we need to get back on the path? Do we need to change paths?

Because I love the devotions associated with Lent, one of my intentions was to pray the Stations of the Cross every Friday with others here at Star. Well, as usual for most of us, life's circumstances changed that.

"...there's still time to get back on track."

Feeling a little discouraged, this Scripture passage from the responsorial psalm on February 18th spoke to me. (How God speaks to us was discussed in the column two weeks ago.)

Your ways, O LORD, make known to me; teach me your paths, Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my savior.
Psalm 25

What stood out for me was that both ways and paths are plural. And the other important thing that stood out was asking the Lord to teach me His paths. Well, that's a start. That's prayer which is an important part of our Lenten observances. That's good.

Our journey through life is full of paths. Life presents us with lots of options, some insignificant, some very significant.

For the significant decisions of choosing which path to take, God's truth is what guides us.

Truth in our current culture seems to be anything you want it to be especially in political issues. I cringe when I hear celebrities say that they have to live their own truth. What does that really mean?

God's truth is what guides us and keeps us going the right way. Jesus said "I am the Way, and the Truth and the Life". Even if we haven't done everything we had planned for Lent, there's still time to get back on track.

Let's just pray and ask God to guide us. If Jesus is walking this journey with us, we are heading in the right direction.

Jesus isn't just guiding our way, He is The Way.

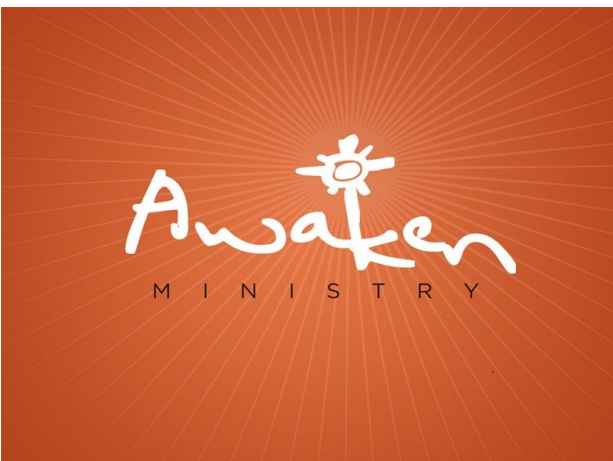
