prayer to St. Joseph entrusting the Church to his care:


Father, you entrusted our Savior to the care of Saint Joseph.



Three weeks ago, we had our Parish Mission. What a blessing it was to have Fr. Steven Bell present 3 evenings of inspiration and encouragement on The Hard and Healing Work of Mercy.

He emphasized throughout that we need to remember who we are and whose we are. He gave us tools to help us remember and to help us weather the times of adversity, hurt and pain.

Are you still hearing "be who you is and not who you ain't....?"

Did the Mission challenge to "use mercy to move from bitterness into the freedom of love" touch you?

Have Fr. Steven's challenges and tools to get through those tough situations helped you in your faith journey? Did they help in dealing with hurt, anger, bitterness.?

As Catholics, we've learned that we must forgive and love, even those who hurt us. We must love as Jesus loves us. After Jesus and His apostles finished the last supper, Jesus gave the ground rules for how He wanted his emerging family to relate to each other.

"I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another.

This is how all will know that you are my

disciples, if you have love for one another."

John 13:33-35

That "as-I-have-loved-you" kind of love is where we often get stuck.

Fr. Steven reminded us that God is with us and that is how we navigate the tough and hurtful times—we rely on Him. We need to cling to Him instead of trying to solve things all by ourselves. The real power in the hard and healing work of mercy is our relationship with Jesus who has promised to be with us always.

We hear often and we write often in this column about our relationship with Him. A deep relationship with God

enables us to trust in His mercy and compassion even when we cry on His shoulder and complain about the hurts and pains of our lives.

Your life story is probably different than mine and you and I may be in a different place in our story. But remembering who we are and Whose we are will help us through the suffering and pain that may come our way.
