The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

Bulletin articles are due by 10:00 a.m. on Friday. Submitted bulletin content is subject for approval.

For many people Lent is a time for them to experience the Sacrament of Reconciliation, also known "penance" or "confession." It is also in line with the Church's teaching that people are to confess grave or serious (mortal) sin at least once a year and people with less serious or "venial" sins are strongly urged to do the same. It certainly is in keeping with the understanding of Lent as a time to be renewed in our baptismal promises. It truly is a sacrament of healing. As we come to the Lord with contrite hearts for the sins we have committed, the weight of sin is lifted by the abundance of the Lord's mercy and forgiveness through the sacrament.

For the past 6 weeks I have urged parishioners to go to the fabulous FORMED website. [On a laptop or desktop computer, go "olsos.formed.org" and register or create an account. When you go to the site in this fashion, our parish code is already included. If you have a tablet or smart phone, try the above but it seems there are often difficulties. If that is the case, go to "formed.org" website, enter parish code "dce1b7" and then register by creating an account.] I suggest you watch "A Lent to Remember," three 30 minute videos that are very informative and helpful. Or you can watch the "Forgiven" series on the same site. Either way you should profit from these videos especially if you have some fears or questions about confession. The wonderful aspect of the FORMED website is you can watch anything at any time you want without even coming to church! No need to be embarrassed that you might not know something of the faith or our religion.

Confession is certainly a sacrament of healing. To unburden our souls with the weight of our sins is what the Lord wants for us. That is why He came to us and died on the cross for us! Now, if however we think we don't sin in our life, or that we will decide what sin is, or we don't like admitting to anyone that we have done wrong...then there are other, and larger, issues that need to be addressed!



There are two big opportunities this week to experience the sacrament especially in a communal setting (with individual confession): Thursday afternoon, at 1 pm, at St. Margaret church and Thursday evening, at 7 pm, at St. Paul church. (Next Monday are two other opportunities: 1 pm at St. Pio church and 7 pm at St. Joan of Arc.) Of course, there are the many other "private" times that parishes offer. The point is - now is a good time to go! Do not be afraid! (If you are, watch the videos!)

** Next Sunday is already Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week. Here is my usual appeal that if you have never come to a Holy Week liturgy, please think about it! These liturgies are at the heart of the Church's liturgical life!!

** This Friday will be your last chance this year to come to our Fish Fry! Thanks to all who volunteer to make them possible, from the Fry-ers to the servers to the dish washers. Everyone has a vital role in making them run so smoothly!

** We are wrapping up the details for the donor board which will acknowledge those who donated \$300 or more to the **Changing Lives Together** initiative. If you are one of those donors and you have not returned the letter you received 8 weeks ago with your information, please do so this week. Thank you.





Family Connection

Family life is often a balancing act in which we prioritize and attend to a variety of competing needs. We learn the value of putting others' needs ahead of our own. In family life we also learn that when we make personal sacrifices to serve others, we gain so much more than we may have lost.

As you gather as a family, talk about how important it is to your family life to gladly serve one another. Ask each person to consider the last time that another family member asked for help. What was your response? Did you cheerfully try to honor the request, or did you ask "Why me?" Read today's Gospel, John 12:20-33. How do you think Jesus would want us to respond when someone in our family asks for help? Invite each family member to make a commitment for the next week to try to respond cheerfully to requests for help. Pray together, asking God's help with this commitment. On March 19th, we celebrate the feast day of St. Joseph the Husband of Mary. We know Joseph loved Mary and Jesus and his one concern was for the safety of this child entrusted to him. Not only did he leave his home to protect Jesus, but upon his return settled in the obscure town of Nazareth out of fear for his life. When Jesus stayed in the Temple we are told Joseph (along with Mary) searched with great anxiety for three days for him (Luke 2:48). We also know that Joseph treated Jesus as his own son for over and over the people of Nazareth say of Jesus, "Is this not the son of Joseph?" (Luke 4:22)

Joseph is the patron saint of the dying because, assuming he died before Jesus' public life, he died with Jesus and Mary close to him, the way we all would like to leave this earth.

Joseph is also patron saint of the Universal Church, families, fathers, expectant mothers, travelers, immigrants, house sellers and buyers, craftsmen, engineers, and working people in general.

We celebrate two feast days for Joseph: March 19 for Joseph the Husband of Mary and May 1 for Joseph the Worker. March 19 has been the most commonly celebrated feast day for Joseph, and it wasn't until 1955 that Pope Pius XII established the Feast of "St. Joseph the Worker" to be celebrated on May 1. This is also May Day (International Workers' Day) and believed to reflect Joseph's status as the patron of workers.



In this column we've talked about the three pillars of Lent prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Today let's look at one of the many ways we can pray.

Of course, there is but "one Lord, one faith, one baptism" (Ephesians 4:5) but there are as many ways to pray within the Church as there are members.

Last week we were inspired and lifted by the special ministry of Awaken with praise and worship

and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, the very special devotion in which to encounter Jesus.

For generations American Catholics lived out their faith by routinely practicing habits of devotion, both public and private. Particular devotions changed over time, but the habits endured. In the

past, Catholics didn't have Bible study or the faith formation programs that we have now. Deep questions of theology usually meant little to them, but they clung to these ingrained habits of devotion both public and private. These devotions embodied their faith more than any set of dogmas.

Devotions include prayer customs that have grown out of a variety of cultures and circumstances.

Several examples of Catholic devotions include the Rosary, the Stations of the Cross, the Sacred Heart of Jesus, The Divine Mercy devotions, the various scapulars, novenas, pilgrimages and devotions to the Blessed Sacrament and to Mary.

Of course, we need to be careful that devotions don't become skewed toward superstition—"If I do this a certain thing will happen". Some of the practices might be quirky but can be harmless, like burying a plastic statue of St. Joseph to help sell a home.

Devotions are unique expressions of faith, but they should never interfere with the Church's liturgy or mission.

Each of us is called to encounter Christ, grow in our relationship with Him and share the Good News we have heard and believe.

The imagery and ritual of popular devotions make them powerful tools of evangelization. Reciting prayer before meals, ashes on our foreheads, displaying a religious statue or praying the Rosary can start conversations and attract interest.

In The Joy of the Gospel, Pope Francis recognized the evangelizing power of popular devotions. He wrote, "Let us not stifle or presume to control this missionary power."

We need to embrace the teachings of Christ and we have an infinite number of choices of how to express that faith.

And in all those expressions it's important to remember that each one of us is called to "Unleash the Gospel".

Our Lady Star of the Sea offers many opportunities for private and public devotions all year long in addition to the seasonal and yearly devotions. These next two weeks especially will afford us the chance to establish a deeper relationship with Christ our Savior.
