Happy Easter! Can you imagine what it must have been like to be those apostles and followers of Christ? Put yourself in their shoes. For the past couple of years you have been through all the ups and downs with this man who has been your teacher, your mentor, your friend. You have seen him sought after by thousands of people to hear him or simply to see him pass by. You have seen the crowds bow down and laud him only to have those same people yell "crucify him." Then they did. All your hope and dreams seemed lost. There was a definite darkness surrounding you. A huge void. Probably asking, "what has happened? Now what?" And then it happened. Open your spirit to Jesus and let him bring you joy and peace as you become his friend and follow him. Rejoice and be glad! This day is for you!!

Pope St. Leo the Great called it "the greatest feast". It is the Resurrection of the Lord that we celebrate today.

Christ's rising on the third day after He died is a key part of the Good News we talk about week after week in this column.

The first Easter Sunday was the time the Good News began to be realized. Christ has died; Christ is risen!

In time, it was more fully understood that His Resurrection means our resurrection! That gives all of us hope - hope in our own resurrection.

The following excerpt from the Catechism of the Catholic Church (#651-655) discusses the significance of the Resurrection.

"...Christ's Resurrection is the fulfillment of the promises both of the Old Testament and of Jesus himself during his earthly life. The phrase 'in accordance with the Scriptures' indicates that Christ's Resurrection fulfilled these predictions."

The truth of Jesus' divinity is confirmed by his Resurrection. He had said: 'When you have lifted up the Son of man, then you

will know that I am he.' Christ's Resurrection is closely linked to the Incarnation of God's Son, and is its fulfillment in accordance with God's eternal plan.

"Finally, Christ's Resurrection - and the risen Christ himself is the principle and source of our future resurrection: 'Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive. The risen Christ lives in the hearts of his faithful while they await that fulfillment."

Our forty days of preparation has been a time during which we have tried to adjust our priorities so we can become more like Christ. We now approach Easter Sunday with a joyful heart.

We have something huge to celebrate. Yet, there is more. We can share the hope and joy we have by bringing Christ to others through our love and mercy.

Let the risen Christ live in your heart. Let your life reflect this Easter joy.

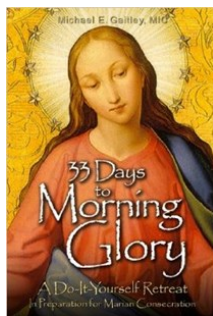

Why are Catholics “obligated” to participate in Sunday Mass?

Throughout life, many people might, at one point or another, wonder why do we have to go to Mass every Sunday and holy day.

We come up with reasons not to go:

- you don't like the music or the homilies,
- people don't acknowledge me,
- Mass is boring, repeating the same thing each week,
- we say we can pray on our deck or anyplace at home.



Here are some good reasons why the Church teaches that we are to participate in Mass every Sunday

- 1) It fulfills God's commandment to make one day holy, setting aside time to return to God. Mass helps us to see and hear things according to God's perspective as he inspires and challenges us.
- 2) We actually receive Jesus in His word and in His Body and Blood! It is a gift of Love from God who asks us to love others.
- 3) We are communal people, not isolated individuals. Even gathering with people we do not know gives us affirmation or encouragement. We see and know we are not alone in our life and struggles.
- 4) People need our prayers and when we do this in Mass we join in a special union that unites heaven and earth.
- 5) Each Mass has a special message for us. It is easy to leave with at least one inspiration that can impact our life situation.
- 6) It gives us the opportunity to stand up for what we believe, especially in a very secular world. We commit ourselves in our beliefs which strengthens us.
- 7) At Mass we admit that we have sinned and made some mistakes. However the Good News is Jesus still loves us, especially by giving the gift of Himself.
- 8) Much of our life is filled with rituals, i.e., doing the same thing. We have our rituals at home, work, in sports and recreation. The ritual or “sameness” of the Mass (and Church) allows us to be transformed in deeper ways that we might not even be aware of.
- 9) We need to talk to God and He talks to us through His Word, the music, the homily, and each other. When we stay on our deck or in our home and offer a few quick prayers instead of Mass, we are missing this important dialogue!
- 10) We need to experience that which is “bigger” than ourselves. At Mass we share in the death and resurrection of Jesus. It gives meaning to our life and a sense of destiny. It gives a peace and tranquility that the world can not give.

Helps for taking children to Mass:

- decide ahead of time what Mass to attend
- bring a picture book about Mass for the younger children
- sit near the front of church where they see the action of the Mass
- celebrate good behavior by doing something special after Mass.



Tips for parents of teens:

- if your teen loves the faith and Mass, take the opportunity to strengthen relationships with him/her and his/her's with God
- if your teen doesn't like to go or is indifferent, explain that there are some things in life that are good for us despite our feelings. Mass is not about feelings but rather giving ourselves to God and knowing what He wants us to do.
- witness to your faith by participating and celebrating the Mass as it strengthens your life!

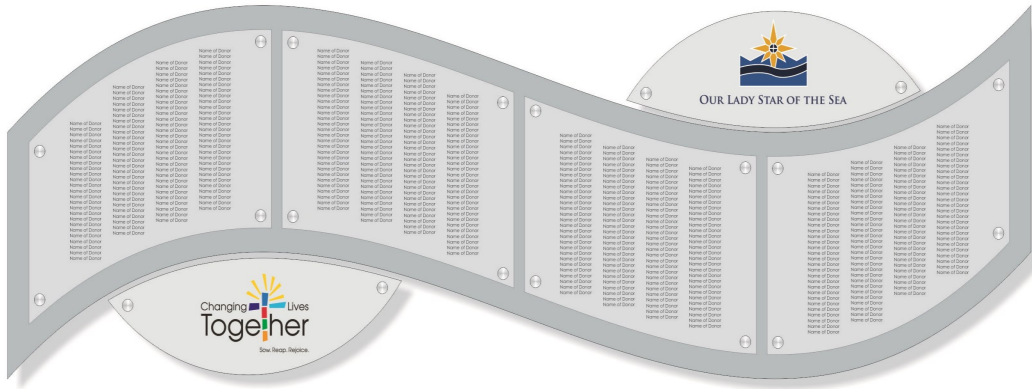
