ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

Bulletin articles are due by 10:00 a.m. on Friday. Submitted bulletin content is subject for approval. For many people Lent is a time for them to experience the Sacrament of Reconciliation, also known as "penance" or "confession." It is also in line with the Church's teaching that people are to confess grave or serious (mortal) sin at least once a year and people with less serious or "venial" sins are strongly urged to do the same. It certainly is in keeping with the understanding of Lent as a time to be renewed in our baptismal promises. It truly is a sacrament of healing. As we come to the Lord with contrite hearts for the sins we have committed, the weight of sin is lifted by the abundance of the Lord's mercy and forgiveness through the sacrament.

If you want to become more familiar with the sacrament, I urge you to go to the FORMED website and watch the short videos for either "A Lent to Remember" or "Forgiven." (If you are not registered, go to "olsos.formed.org" and it is simple to register.) Either one of these videos you should profit from especially if you have some fears or questions about confession.

Confession is certainly a sacrament of healing. To unburden our souls with the weight of our sins is what the Lord wants for us. That is why He came to us and died on the cross for us! Now, if however we think we don't sin in our lives, or that we will decide what sin is, or we don't like admitting to anyone that we have done wrong...then there are other, and larger, issues that need to be addressed!

There are two big opportunities this week to experience the sacrament especially in a communal setting (with individual confession): Thursday afternoon, at 1 pm, at Our Lady of Hope Parish (St. Germain church) and Thursday evening, at 7 pm, at St. Pio church (13 Mile Road west of Gratiot). (Next Monday are two other opportunities: 1 pm at St. Margaret church and 7 pm at St. Joan of Arc.) Of course, there are the many other "private" times that parishes offer. The point is - now is a good time to go! Do not be afraid! (If you are, watch the videos!)

** There has been a lot of talk about the movie "Unplanned" and the success it has been in telling the true story of Abby Johnson. One movie description is: "As one of the youngest Planned Parenthood clinic directors in the nation, Abby Johnson was involved in upwards of 22,000 abortions and counseled countless women on their reproductive choices. Her passion surrounding a woman's right to choose led her to become a spokesperson for Planned Parenthood, fighting to enact legislation for the cause she so deeply believed



in. Until the day she saw something that changed everything." Last weekend it was playing to sold out houses! Since things can change quickly in the movie industry, check local listings for places and times.

It has been interesting to see the hoops or conflicts it had to overcome to share this true, real life movie. Many television stations refused to show the trailer or promote the movie. Strange things were happening on Twitter as for a while the Unplanned account was suspended, it has also had 150,000 followers then all of sudden only 215 followers! Individual people also could not "follow" Unplanned! So the Holy Spirit has been with the message of this movie and is working hard to help make this movie!

** Next Sunday is already Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week. Here is my usual appeal that if you have never come to a Holy Week liturgy, please think about it! These liturgies are at the heart of the Church's liturgical life. It is the greatest week of the year in terms of what we celebrate and how we celebrate our liturgies. On Holy Thursday evening, during the Mass of the Lord's Last Supper at 7 pm, we have the "washing of the feet," following the command of the Lord that we hear in the scripture that night. It is a powerful ritual...to see and to be a part of. However, we always have a difficulty to get people to volunteer one of their feet! Might you consider that this year?? We are looking for all ages, male and female. What you have to do is pretty simple. After the homily you come up to a chair with 5 other people, remove a shoe and sock (if wearing one), a little water is poured over your foot, it is dried and that is it! If you are willing to participate in this beautiful ritual, please let me know via email or phone! Thank you.

** This Friday will be your last chance this year to come to our Fish Fry! Thanks to all who volunteer to make them possible, from the Fry-ers to the servers to the dish washers. Everyone has a vital role in making them run so smoothly!

FORMING OUR FAITH



Stations of the Cross

Another Lenten devotion that has been long encouraged by the church, and is especially useful during Lent and Good Friday, are the Stations of the Cross, a way to pray and meditate on Christ's sacrifice for us.

The Stations are divided into fourteen stations from the time Jesus was condemned to his burial. The devotion was developed during the Crusades when the knights and pilgrims began to follow the route of Christ's way to Calvary. This devotion spread throughout Europe and was promulgated by the Franciscan friars in the 14th and 15th centuries.

Eventually, the Stations of the Cross became an important teaching tool, and the popularity of this devotion inspired some of the greatest examples of medieval Christian art.

At Our Lady Star of the Sea, we observe this Lenten practice on the Fridays during Lent at 7:00 pm. On Good Friday, the Stations will be prayed at 1:00 pm. If you have never participated in the Stations of the Cross, plan to add this to your calendar as we count down the days until we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday, April 21!!

Acts 1:8

Responding to questions from his apostles just before His Ascension, Jesus said: "... you will be my witnesses...to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8) Being a witness for Jesus applies to all the faithful and it was confirmed by the Church as recently as the Second Vatican Council.

Being a witness for Jesus is sharing something we know or have experienced. It

does not mean that we need to be an expert witness, such as someone trained in theology or apologetics. We just need to

share what we know. However, we cannot share something we do not have. In other words, to share Jesus, we really need to know Him.

Here are some questions we can all ask ourselves. Our answers might be a rough gauge of how well we know Jesus.

What is my relationship with Jesus and how has it changed over time?

How often do I pray and in what ways, for example, memorized prayers alone or with others, prayers in my own words from my heart, or prayer based on Scripture readings? What is it about my Catholic faith that is most important to me?

How am I nourishing my faith so it remains strong and even grows?

What role has my faith had in getting through difficulties in my life?

These questions can give each of us ideas on areas we could strengthen and what

we might share with others. This part of being a witness is about sharing Jesus with our words. The other part of witnessing is

sharing Jesus through our deeds, that is, sharing His love and mercy.

When we are Jesus' witnesses in the world, we can help others in many different ways, such as these from the Prayer of St. Francis of Assisi:

"Lord make me an instrument of your peace Where there is hatred let me sow love Where there is injury, pardon Where there is doubt, faith Where there is despair, hope Where there is darkness, light And where there is sadness, joy."




