On this Second Sunday of Easter, also known as **Divine Mercy Sunday**. It was Saint Pope John Paul II that assigned the title "Divine Mercy Sunday" to the Second Sunday of Easter. He personally knew Saint Faustina, the religious sister in Poland to whom Our Lord appeared under the title of Divine Mercy. The Holy Father shared in the special devotion of St. Faustina and was the one who helped promote her canonization. How amazing and appropriate that he died the evening before during the liturgical celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday.

The image of Divine Mercy, i.e., a depiction of Christ with red and white rays emanating from his heart, is on display by our Easter cross however, you usually find it the rest of the year by our confessional. .

Jesus wants us to know of his great mercy, but we need to place our trust in him. It seems today that we need to know of Christ's mercy more than ever. With the many conflicts we see in our world today and the search of peace for so many people in their personal lives, we need to know that it is in Jesus that we find shelter and refuge. Especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we find an abundance of Christ's mercy freely given for us. Our present Holy Father, Pope Francis, has already made numerous mentions about our need to open up our hearts to receive the Lord's mercy and to share it with others!

It is the desire of our Archbishop that as many people as possible should have available to them the indulgences that are attached to this day. This is available through the extra prayers we will say at Mass specifically for this purpose.

** It was good seeing many of you at the liturgical services celebrating the Paschal Triduum, i.e., Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion and the Easter Vigil. It was especially delightful to see many of our children and youth present. Since all of these liturgies are different than "normal Mass," they are perhaps a little more appealing to them. It is also a time for them to experience the beauty and richness of them so that they might become more regular worshipers at them in the future. While many were present, there were still plenty of available seats!

** Thanks to everyone who gave Easter Memorials or Thanksgivings. Thanks to you, we should enjoy the floral abundance of Easter throughout the whole season!

UNLEASH THE GOSPEL

go and make disciples

Today we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday with a special devotion which focuses on Christ's limitless mercy and love for mankind.

In today's Gospel, the Apostle Thomas personally experiences this divine mercy of God.

Are you a doubting Thomas? Can you relate to him in any way?

Citing Matthew 28:16-17, some theologians have said that Thomas was just more honest than some of the other disciples, saying what others were thinking.

"The eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had ordered them. When they saw him, they worshiped, but they doubted."

The verses right after that are the reason we exist as a Church, as a parish:

"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20

Each one of us must bring Christ to others in our own unique way. Our archdiocesan goal to Unleash the Gospel strives to help each one of us obey that command to evangelize. It can be as simple as just telling our faith story.

In his Pastoral Letter, Archbishop Vigneron states, "It is as the Church of Christ in southeast Michigan, founded by Christ and alive in Christ, that we take up in earnest the new evangelization."

Are you ready to accept the challenge to Unleash the Gospel, evangelizing, in a culture

that has given rise to a new religion, secularism, complete with a set of rules and "doctrines"? A "religion" that says truth is relative, that our beliefs are in transition and depend on the popularity of those beliefs and the social context of each particular situation.

Does that pervasive culture sometimes foster doubts that the Church knows what it is doing? Do you doubt that we can stand up to the "spin" and derision our beliefs are getting—that the core beliefs of the Catholic Church are antiquated, narrow-minded and judgmental?

"The world needs our courageous witness more than ever."

I think doubt can be a natural part of our faith journey. It can lead us to exploring the history and teachings of our Catholic faith and lead us into a strong-

er and more meaningful relationship with Jesus.

If you're doubting, then be an "honest Thomas." Be real. Don't pretend. Tell God exactly where you are and ask for his help.

Jesus met Thomas right where he was. And he offered himself to Thomas: "Here, touch me, and believe."

And Thomas said, "My Lord and my God!"

Doubting Thomas, became faithful Thomas, bold Thomas, believing Thomas. The world needs our courageous witness more than ever. Turn your doubts into bold belief.

In 2001, Pope John Paul II announced that the Sunday after Easter would be Divine Mercy Sunday. This announcement was the culmination of Jesus appearing to St. Faustina and asking her to instill a day dedicated to His Mercy. On this Sunday, a Plenary Indulgence can be received.

A plenary indulgence means that by the merits of Jesus Christ, the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints, the full remission of the temporal punishment due to sacramentally forgiven sins is obtained. The person becomes as if just baptized and would fly immediately to heaven if he/she died in that instant.

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy

We invite you to pray the Chaplet of Jesus The Divine Mercy in the Adoration Chapel immediately following the weekday morning Masses and at 3:00 p.m. on Wednesday afternoons.

If the Chaplet is new to you, just come to the Chapel where fellow prayer warriors will take you through it in about 7 minutes.

We'll learn it together, and then go on our way touched by His Mercy.

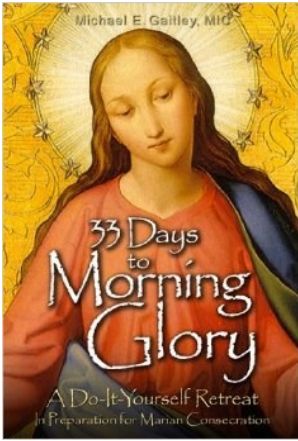
Faith Formation in Action!

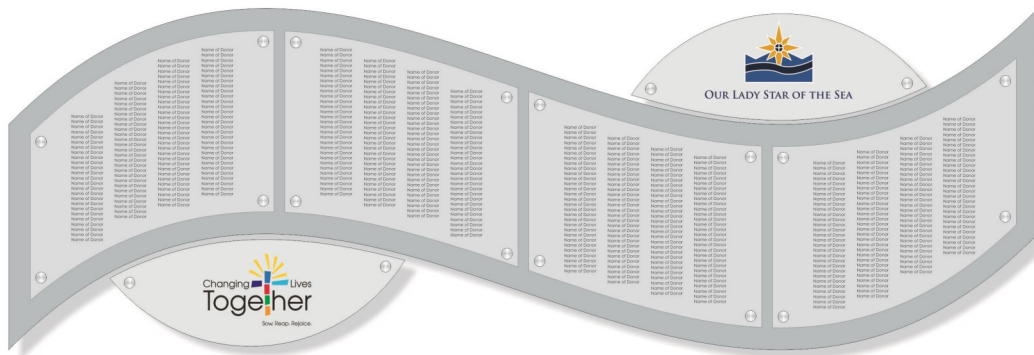
