Every now and then there is time when a number of sacraments are celebrated. especially the Sacraments of Initiation! There is a baptism next weekend as well as Confirmation and the following weekend we have our celebration of First Eucharist! It is a wonderful time of the year where we see God's gracious gifts being bestowed upon us through the Church.


What are the sacraments? This little review from the US Bishops might be helpful:

"We recognize that the Sacraments have a visible and invisible reality, a reality open to all the human senses but grasped in its God-given depths with the eyes of faith. When parents hua their children, for example, the visible reality we see is the hug. The invisible reality the hug conveys is love. We cannot "see" the love the hug expresses, though sometimes we can see its nurturing effect in the child.

The visible reality we see in the Sacraments is their outward expression, the form they take, and the way in which they are administered and received. The invisible reality we cannot "see" is God's grace, his aracious initiative in redeemina us through the death and Resurrection of his Son. His initiative is called grace because it is the free and loving gift by which he offers people a share in his life, and shows us his favor and will for our salvation. Our response to the grace of God's initiative is itself a grace or gift from God by which we can imitate Christ in our daily lives.

The saving words and deeds of Jesus Christ are the foundation of what he would communicate in the Sacraments through the ministers of the Church. Guided by the Holy Spirit, the Church recognizes the existence of Seven Sacraments instituted by the Lord. They are the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist), the Sacraments of Healing (Penance and Anointing of the Sick), and the Sacraments at the Service of Communion (Marriage and Holy Orders). Through the Sacraments, God shares his holiness with us so that we, in turn, can make the world holier." (www.usccb.org)

Please pray for our young brothers and sisters who are in their final preparation stages for Confirmation. Next Sunday Bishop Hurly will administer the sacrament upon them. I know so many of them are awaiting this sacrament with great anticipation! They have been "fired up" by their preparation and are now ready to go out and be an ambassador, a missionary, a disciple for Christ! They ARE ready to make the world holier...and that is exactly our goal in their whole preparation process. Unfortunately, sometimes their fire is dampened by others,



be it their parents, siblings, other relatives, friends, etc. We have to remember that they still need our support and encouragement to be a disciple on fire with and for the Lord. Parents and family members need to take them to Sunday Mass and receive the sacraments. We all need to let the fire of the Spirit do its work and lead us to a deeper faith and commitment to community, especially through service to one another. Their role as a young adult in the Church is not over, as some think it is. Confirmation is NOT araduation from religious formation...it is only the beginning! And how the world needs young people on fire with Jesus and their faith.

Pray also for our younger brothers and sisters who will be receiving their First Holy Communion in a few weeks. This also is an important beginning...not a single accomplishment but a step that feeds the journey. We recognize, as adults, how important it is to receive the Eucharist each week to keep us going and growing with the Lord. We need to show them the significance and reverence we have for this treasured gift! Our witness to this is the best teaching.

Let me also add a word or two about another important sacrament. Anointing of the Sick. Remember that it is no longer (necessarily) "last rites." Nor should anyone wait until the last hour of a person's life. It is good for a person to be anointed at the beginning of a sickness and then also along the way if the illness progresses. Through this wonderful sacrament, we ask the Holy Spirit to come and provide healing, both physical and spiritual. Hence, the strength of the sacrament exists throughout the length of a serious sickness not just at the end.

** May we all allow the powerful presence of God to assist us this week along our path to holiness!

As I've written before, one of the things that stands out for me during the 50 days of the Easter season is that there is no reading from the Old Testament at Mass other than the responsorial Psalm. I don't know about you, but I really like reading about the early days of the church when the ideas and beliefs we hold true were being formulated and how the organization of the Church as a worldwide movement was being developed.

As we hear the words of The Book of Acts or Acts of the Apostles, it probably

should be called "Some" Acts of "certain" Apostles because it focuses on some of the missions of Peter and Paul only.

Acts is the story of how the first disciples carried out the mission entrusted to them by Jesus.

It's uplifting and encouraging to read about the first evangelists. The apostles and St. Paul were excited about the person and message of Jesus. They had encountered Jesus as a Savior, who by His cross and resurrection, triumphed over sin and death and who sent His Holy Spirit to accompany His followers in all things.

As you've read often in this column, each one of us is called to bring Christ to others. It is our primary and essential mission!

If bringing Jesus Christ to all is good news why do we need to be reminded that our mission is to joyfully share this? Why do we need to convene a Synod to find ways, to "change the very DNA" of the Archdiocese of Detroit and discuss what the archdiocese needs to do in order to become a "band of joyful missionary disciples"?

There are volumes written about how we, as a church, moved away from our mission to evangelize.

We need to know that the Good News of Jesus Christ we are sharing reaches all people in their very basic needs. Simply, God loves and forgives us unconditionally, we belong to the family of God, we are worthwhile and there is a purpose for living.

There are enough words, enough documents and enough teaching. It's time to put those words and teachings into action.

Let's do as the early disciples did. Encoun-

ter Jesus, Grow and share His message, "go teach all nations".

"I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!" Luke 12:49

When St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits, would meet to form young Jesuits for their work to evangelize the world he would end every meeting with one phrase: "Go, set the world on fire."





Peace Be With You!




On this third Sunday of Easter, we continue to hear Gospel accounts of Jesus' appearances to his disciples following his Resurrection. Today's reading follows immediately after the report of Jesus' appearance to his disciples on the road to Emmaus.

Consistently in the reports of Jesus' post-Resurrection appearances, Jesus greets his disciples with the words, "Peace be with you." This is a most appropriate greeting. The disciples have witnessed the death of someone they loved, and they now fear for their own lives as well. Peace is what they need more than anything else.

So many of us are too familiar with worry and anxiety—about today, about tomorrow, and even about eternity. So often, if we pay attention, the bible tells us that we are not to worry. Jesus tells us repeatedly that we are not to be afraid.

As you think about your life, where do you see a need for the peace of Christ that erases hostility and brings people together in unity? How might you be an agent of Christ's peace in your relationships at work? At home? In your church? In your community and beyond?

PRAYER: Lord Jesus Christ, you are our peace. In you, I experience inner peace that exceeds all understanding. Yet, your peace touches more than my soul. You have come to bring peace among people, to erase hostility, to enable human beings to live together with love, justice, and fruitfulness. Thank you for the peace that you alone give. May I live today in your peace, seeking to be a peacemaker in all of my relationships. Bring peace to this broken world, Lord! Amen.
