ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



Last weekend it was Sacrament of Confirmation and this Sunday it is First Holy Communion. It is that time of the year when these two sacraments are celebrated with great joy, and rightfully so!

The past year brought many changes to our life. Activities we were accustomed to doing we could not. Many of our patterns and routines of our life are different. We don't go to

the workplace. We don't go to the classroom. We don't go to meetings with the people but rather see each other through a computer. Amazing but not the same. The same with our worship. Unfortunate but necessary, for a year people were dispensed from the obligation of participating in Sunday Eucharist (but not dispensed from keeping holy the Sabbath). Amazing technology, e.g., "live streaming," keep people connected and are given a view into an activity they can not physically present. This has certainly kept many people "connected" to the parish when for their safety they must stay home and apart from larger groups of people. I know many people have stated how much they enjoyed this connection and replacement for participating in Sunday Eucharist. Unfortunately, many people continue to think that watching Mass at home is a real replacement for participating in Sunday Mass! What is missing is, first and foremost, not being able to receive the Eucharist, the Body of Christ. This profession of our faith, receiving the Body of Christ, is essential for us and our life in Christ, What is also missing is the community we gather with. God made us a people in a community, created out of the community of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Yes our family is a community but our larger family of faith gives us greater support, encouragement, inspiration and strength. The bottom line is there is no replacement for gathering as the Body of Christ (his Church every Sunday and every time we gather for Mass) to receive the Body of Christ to be the Body of Christ and witnesses in the world around us.

Yes, making our First Holy Communion is extremely important in our Christian life as another step in completing our Sacraments of Initiation. (The Sacraments of Initiation are Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.) Our first holy communion is so important because it now allows us to receive Jesus (Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity) in Holy Communion, every Mass, every week, for the rest of our life. Not just once. Not just twice. Thousands of times because Jesus knows we need him every day of our life! For those of us who received our First Holy Communion years ago, every time we receive Holy Communion should be just as exciting and amazing as our First!






Stewardship Thoughts

In St. John's Gospel, Jesus proclaims, I am the Good Shepherd, giving us the beautiful image of Him as shepherd attending to us, His flock. In contrast to the hired hand that bolts at the first sign of trouble, Jesus will never desert His flock. However, he is concerned for other sheep that do not belong to this fold. St. Peter, in the Acts of the Apostles, reminds us that there is no salvation through anyone else but Christ. In St. John's First Letter, he affirms that we are children of God through the great love of the Father for us. And yet, he observes that the world does not know Him. Evangelization is the consistent theme in these readings. One way to take the Catholic faith to the streets is to join a local St. Paul Street Evangelization team, or to volunteer at a local soup kitchen or homeless shelter serving our less fortunate brothers and sisters.
