This weekend we hear an important message, something that is central and essential to what we do and who we are. In essence the message was not about money. The emphasis is central to the Church, who we are as Church, and what we do as Catholic Christians - bringing Jesus Christ to all! This is what we are to be about, i.e., sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ through words and actions in the lives of people in many different life situations.

The message reminds us of who we are as members of the Catholic Church. We are not an isolated community. We belong to a larger Body. A larger living organism that is able to do more than we could ever possibly do ourselves. We here at the parish certainly benefit from many of the Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) funded programs and ministries. But what is more important is that it enables each one of us to participate in the wide-reaching arms of the Church to those in need, i.e., those in need of education, encouragement, counseling, organization, spiritual renewal, conscience and religious formation, and Christian outreach in many ways. The programs and ministries of the CSA does far more than we can ever do, either as individual or as a parish community. It puts into action that which we pray about and profess at Sunday



Mass. It helps us to reach out to our society which is in such great need to hear the Word of Christ and change its culture to ways of love.

Yes - we expect many services in many places, e.g., hospital chaplains, college campus Newman Centers, youth and young adult outreach, etc., but maybe don't bother to think who provides or funds all of our expectations or programs that we take for granted. The CSA is not about money. It is about mission. Yes, as with everything, money is needed for the mission to be accomplished. The bottom line is that we have to provide it. Somehow these ministries and programs need to be funded by the "larger Church" because they are beyond separate and individual parishes. In the Archdiocese of Detroit, all of this and more is funded by the CSA. The real beauty is that one gift, one pledge, shares in over 100 vital ministries and programs.

As you know, each parish in the Archdiocese of Detroit is given a CSA "target" (which they must meet either from the direct contributions of the parishioners

or else it comes from the operational budget). Money pledged and received in excess of the target is returned to the parish without any further assessment – so every cent comes back to the parish free and clear! [This is how many parishes fund special projects. We can do the same!] It is also important to know that the distribution of the CSA money is overseen by the lay Archdiocesan Finance Council and none of it has ever been used, or will be used, for any lawsuits or any special projects outside the Archdiocese, other than a few US Conference of Catholic Bishops national collections. All the money goes exactly to those programs and ministries stated in the Catholic Services Appeal.

Every year I wonder and worry if the parish will meet its goal. But I have confidence and faith that everyone will seriously reflect upon their blessings from God and consider giving to the CSA. I hope that each family finds something within their means to

support the CSA. This is another component to our general financial stewardship. Even \$5 is an important gift if it comes from one’s treasure! (There is an easy way to charge your gift or give online so please give us a call and we can assist you in the process.) Your generosity to valued programs and ministries of the Church has been very much appreciated in the past because it gets to the heart of the mission of the Catholic Church. Remember, your gift is far reaching in opening doors for people to encounter Jesus. May God continue to bless you in your sharing of the future ministries and programs in our Church of Detroit.

# UNLEASH THE GOSPEL

## go and make disciples

Readings from the Acts of the Apostles are part of the liturgy at Masses during this Easter Season. Written by Luke, they tell us about the early Church after the Ascension of Jesus and how the apostles continued the work He had begun.

One of their first actions was appointing Matthias as successor of Judas. Peter, who was then in charge, said they wanted someone who they knew and had been with them from the beginning, since the baptism by John. Such a person, having seen and heard Jesus, would be able to be a witness to His message and promises in spreading the Good News to other people and nations.

Having identified two individuals, they prayed about it, saying "You, Lord, who know the hearts of all, show which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this apostolic ministry from which Judas turned away...." (Acts 1:24-25) The two were given lots, with Matthias being selected.

This is the first example of apostolic succession. "The Apostles are the pillars of the Church. And the bishops are the pillars of the Church. The election of Matthias was the Church's first episcopal ordination". (Pope Francis)

We really don't know what sort of reaction Matthias had to his election, but we can imagine what it might have been. It could have been any number of feelings, such as: a sense of humility; honored at having been chosen for such important work; wondering if he was up to the challenges ahead.

We, too, have been chosen. By our Baptism, we have been chosen as sons daughters of God, part of His family.

God was asking Matthias to do more. Are we being asked to do more? What will be our response? Will we have an open heart ready and willing to offer our time and talents and share His love and mercy?
