In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

Bulletin articles are due by 10:00 a.m. on Friday. Submitted bulletin content is subject for approval. Last weekend we heard in the Gospel about the vine and the branches. Jesus is the vine and we are the branches. We can not live apart from the vine. We are also reminded how all the branches are connected to the vine (or the trunk). In the long run we are closer and more connected to each other than we think!

This weekend the command to love is heard loud and clear. We are to love one another and in that love we have life eternal in Jesus Christ. This is who we are and what we do, bringing the love of Jesus to all! We share the Good News of Jesus Christ through words and actions in the lives of people in many different life situations.

The message these two weekends remind us of who we are as members of the Catholic Church. We are not an isolated community. We belong to a larger Body. A larger living organism that is able to do more than we could ever possibly do ourselves. This is the understanding of the Catholic Services Appeal. We, here at the parish, certainly benefit from many of the CSA funded programs and ministries. But what is more important is that it enables each one of us to participate in the wide reaching arms of the Church, to those in need, i.e., those in need of education, encouragement, counseling, organization, spiritual renewal, conscience and religious formation, and Christian outreach. The programs and ministries of the CSA does far more than we can ever do, either as individuals or as a parish community. It puts into action that which we pray about and profess at Sunday Mass. It helps us to reach out to our society which is in such



great need to hear the Word of Christ and change its culture to ways of love.

Yes - we expect many services in many places, e.g., hospital chaplains, college campus Newman Centers, youth and young adult outreach, etc., but maybe don't bother to think who provides or funds all of our expectations or programs that we take for granted. The CSA is not about money. It is about mission. Yes, as with everything, money is needed for the mission to be accomplished. The bottom line is that we have to provide it. Somehow these ministries and programs need to be funded by the "larger Church" because they are beyond separate and individual parishes. In the Archdiocese of Detroit, all of this and more is funded by the CSA. And the real beauty is that one gift, one pledge, shares in over 100 vital ministries and programs.

As you know, each parish in the Archdiocese of Detroit is given a CSA "target" (which they must meet either from the direct contributions of the parishioners or else it comes from the operational budget). <u>Money pledged and</u> received in excess of the target is returned to

the parish without any further assessment - so every cent comes back to the parish free and clear! [This is how many parishes fund special projects. We can do the same!] It is also important to know that the distribution of the CSA money is overseen by the lay Archdiocesan Finance Council and none of it has ever been used, or will be used, for any lawsuits or any special projects outside the Archdiocese, other than those US Conference of Catholic Bishops collections. All the money goes exactly to those programs and ministries stated in the brochures of the Catholic Services Appeal.

Every year I wonder and worry if the parish will meet its goal. But I have confidence and faith that everyone will seriously reflect upon their blessings from God and consider giving to the CSA. I hope that each family finds something within their means to support the CSA. This is another component to our general financial






How can you share the love that you have received with others? With your family members? With your friends? With your neighbors? With those who are strangers to you?

Love is the thread that pulls our Scripture readings together today.

I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I love you.

Love is the subject of sermons, articles, books, songs, seminars, workshops and conversations. Love is a feeling and an action. Love in its purest divine form is far beyond our comprehension.

When we talk about evangelization we use the words, encounter, love, grow, share, and joy.

We are asked to Unleash the Gospel, evangelize, "go and make disciples." We are told to tell our faith stories with love and joy. This can seem daunting. But the good news about being able to spread The Good News is that our Lord can inspire and enable us to do things far beyond what we could ever think to do on our own, things we think impossible.

Pope Francis in "Evangelii Gaudium" ("The Joy of the Gospel") states this: "The joy of the Gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus." "With Christ joy is constantly born anew...I wish to encourage the Christian faithful to embark upon a new chapter of evangelization marked by this joy...."

How do we get that joy to fill our hearts? How

do we feel the fire of love and desire to share God's love for us? How do we encounter Jesus to fill our hearts? We need Christ.

We know that we encounter Jesus in many ways. We encounter Him in the Scriptures, the sacraments, and in other people. We encounter Him in all creation. We encounter Him when we help others, when we pray for others, when we give our time and talent for a good cause.

> Are you full of joy? Do you need a refilling encounter with Jesus? To start, ask Jesus in prayer for help. Let me share this prayer that I came across a couple of years ago.

"Jesus, I need a fresh encounter with you! Please fill

me with your Holy Spirit and with this bring me your joy. By your grace, I throw open the doors of my heart to you now. Please take my burdens and worries and give to me yourself! Please, dear Lord, come and fill me to overflowing so that I may spread Your joy to all I meet! Thank You, Lord! Amen."

We are challenged to encounter Jesus each day and make our love and joy the real deal. Let's do it!

Math Zoo Project

As an end of the school year project, the second graders have begun their "Zoo Files" Project. This project is a fun way to apply many of the math skills they have learned over the school year by creating their very own zoo!

Students are given a budget to purchase animals, plan out their zoo grounds, add new exhibits, and run a souvenir shop. They also have to plan out the zoo keeper's schedule along with a feeding schedule for their animals. Students will then graph and write about how their business is doing.

Second graders will work both independently and they will also collaborate with classmates about what works and what needs improvement. Afterwards, in order to promote their zoo, students will create a brochure, including safety rules and maps for guests. Second graders will have the opportunity to share their creativity with the class.

As the project wraps up, students will visit the Detroit Zoo in the beginning of June with the first grade class. This will allow students to compare their zoo creation with a real zoo!
