The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



go and make disciples

The feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary is celebrated on Friday, May 31. The Visitation is recorded in the first chapter of Luke's gospel and is also the second Joyful mystery of the Rosary.

The angel had told Mary that her cousin Elizabeth, in her old age, was with child. So, she visited her and stayed with her for a while to be of assistance. They shared with each other the joy that filled their hearts because of what God was doing in their lives. What an act of outreach on Mary's part!

Among her many roles, Mary is both the mother and a disciple of Jesus.

As a mother, she was concerned when separated from Jesus and then joyful when he was found in the temple. And just think of her day-to-day work as a mother nurturing her Son.

She demonstrated discipleship throughout her life. At Cana, Mary's involvement in her Son's miracle showed concern for the people. During Christ's passion and death, Mary's presence demonstrated her deep compassion for those who are suffering. After the Ascension while awaiting the Holy Spirit, Mary and Christ's disciples prayed together. The gift of the Spirit empowered them to spread the Good News of our salvation.

Through all of this, we see Mary's deep faith in God which is exemplified in her response to what He asked her to do.

Faith, outreach, concern, compassion and joy in spreading the Good News are attributes of present-day disciples or evangelizers.

Why did Mary act in this way? And why should we?

"The Holy Virgin made of her existence an unceasing and beautiful gift to God because she loved the Lord. Mary's example is an incentive for all of us to live in charity for our neighbor, not out of some sort of social duty, but beginning from the love of God, from the charity of God." (Pope Francis)

The answer to both questions: love of God.
