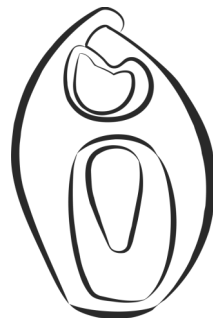
The focus of their ministry is particularly to mothers and children and

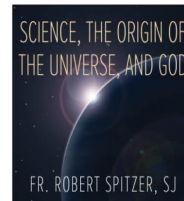

Evangelization is a term that still sounds unfamiliar or raises questions for some Catholics.

Reclaim the Fire: A Parish Guide to Evangelization by Rev. Martin Pable does a great job of explaining the background and meaning of Evangelization.

I would like to share Fr. Pable's lists of what Evangelization is not and what it is. Below are the items that he lists. My comments are shown after each one.

What Evangelization Is Not:

- Trying to fill up our empty pews
- It never should be about the numbers. The driving force should be bringing people to Christ.
- Sheep-stealing from other faiths
- All people are welcome in the Catholic faith whether they previously had other religious beliefs or none at all. Plus, part of our approach is respect for other religions or faiths.

"The message of Jesus is love which compels us to share it and work toward a just society."

- Engaging in biblical shoot-outs
- This usually doesn't end in a positive feeling or outcome. Evangelization is more about what people believe and what is in their heart.
- Shaming people into conversion
- It is hard to believe that this would ever work. Instead, the approach needs to be one of gentleness and understanding.

What Evangelization Is:

Growing in our own relationship with Jesus Christ

This is about recognizing the presence of Christ in our daily lives and responding to His love and teaching. It is a way of life that can begin at any age.

Living our faith in action

This is modeling our life in the way that Jesus lived and according to what he taught us.

Sharing our faith with others

A faith story tells others how our faith helped us with a difficult time in our life. We also share our faith by showing God's mercy to others by treating them with compassion and understanding.

Inviting others to faith

Jesus said to "go and make disciples..." (Matthew 28:19-20). Being welcoming and building relationships are two initial steps in understanding a person and gaining their trust. Every situation is unique, but with the help of the Holy Spirit, we can do our part in leading others to or back to Christ. Working to transform society with Gospel values

The message of Jesus is love which compels us to share it and work toward a just society. Our role is important, involving our neighborhood, workplace, and other organizations. Focus areas are: respecting life at all stages; support for the vulnerable members of society; the importance of marriage and the family; and religious liberty.
