ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

Bulletin articles are due by 10:00 a.m. on Friday. Submitted bulletin content is subject for approval. "The church draws her life from the Eucharist. This truth does not simply express a daily experience of faith, but recapitulates the heart of the mystery of the church." Pope St. John Paul II wrote that to the Church 16 years ago.

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*). We have this great feast to increase our appreciation of this great gift of the Eucharist in our Church and in our lives.

It can be so simple for us to take for granted this great gift of the eucharist. Maybe we think we come to Mass so often and it usually seems to be the same thing over and over and over again. (Even though not everything is the same thing, that is what some people think.) However, if we really contemplate what Christ has done for us in giving us His Body and Blood for our very lives through the celebration of the Mass, we can only be drawn into "profound amazement and gratitude." As Pope John Paul II wrote in his conclusion of his encyclical: "In the humble signs of bread and wine changed into his body and blood, Christ walks beside us as our strength and our food for the journey, and he enables us to become for everyone witnesses of hope. If in the presence of this mystery, reason experiences its limits, the heart, enlightened by the grace of the Holy Spirit, clearly sees the response that is demanded and bows low in adoration and unbounded love."

Some people think of the Eucharist only as the physical, i.e., the sacrament, or the

consecrated host and Precious Blood. That is certainly one aspect of the Eucharist. Hopefully we place the physical sacrament into the whole context of the Eucharistic Liturgy or the Mass, because it is from the *celebration* of the Eucharistic Liturgy that we receive the Blessed Sacrament in the host and the Precious Blood. Hence, the Church places utmost importance on the whole Mass and utmost importance on participating in the whole Mass. In "the old days" people were taught that one had to be present at Mass by the proclamation of the Gospel "for Mass to count." In one way that teaching still holds true. Yet, on the other hand, one should be present for the whole celebration of the liturgy of the Word, i.e., by the time of the first reading, for "Mass to count." The Church wants us to experience the presence of God in all these liturgical elements, not only through the Eucharistic elements. The Church also believes so much in this great gift of Jesus himself that she obligates us to participate in this Eucharist each and every Sunday (keeping God's commandment to "keep holy the Sabbath") not just when we feel like we should come to church or when there are no sports event, practice,

shopping trip or other things to do on a Sunday! This feast is also a good time to remember to be present until the end of Mass as well. The point of Mass is not to simply receive Holy Communion and then leave but the whole experience is important. (Do you visit a family members house on Thanksgiving and walk out once you eat the turkey?)

The celebration of the Mass is truly awesome indeed and maybe, ultimately, too mind boggling for us! But the Church gives us the celebration of Mass and the Eucharist so we can encounter Christ in our daily life and then be transformed into that image and presence of Christ in the world around us. The readings and homily are meant to point out how the Word of God we hear at Mass is being encountered by us and is alive indeed in the midst of our lives as we hear it! With hearts of gratitude for that presence and action of God in our midst, we then offer that sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, i.e., Jesus in the Eucharist. Jesus then becomes food for our daily journey so we can be Christ to others in our daily life! Yes- it is mind boggling indeed!

There are many things that I learned in all my years of Catholic education by the Adrian Dominican nuns and the Jesuits at University of Detroit.

Two of those things still stand out. One is the fact that in grade school, because the Mother Superior was Irish and our pastor was Irish, we learned Irish songs for assemblies, and we had St. Patrick's Day off. For almost all the time in grade school we thought the feast of St. Patrick was a holy day of obligation.

The other thing and certainly the more important was learning about the teachings of St. Thomas Aquinas.

In developing his theory of how God's grace works, one of St. Thomas' famous statements is "grace builds on nature."

That's a great thing to hear when we are being asked to Unleash the Gospel and trying to see where God is leading us.

Grace doesn't destroy who we are or make us into completely different people. God's grace perfects us in our uniqueness. Grace takes all our talents and gifts, our personalities and lifts them up to a higher level.

St. Peter is the perfect example. There were so many times when he just didn't get it right. His passionate nature

led him to be impetuous and quick-tempered. He tried to walk on water but ended up in the sea.

He was awed by the Transfiguration of Jesus. As Jesus is speaking to two of the figures most central to the Jewish faith, Peter talks about building three tents to memorialize this while the most extraordinary scene is unfolding before him.

When they came to get Jesus in the garden Peter reacted violently. "Then Simon Peter, who had a sword, drew it, struck the high priest's slave, and cut off his right ear." John 18:1

He denied Jesus three times even after vehemently vowing he would never do so.

Peter grew and changed during his time with Jesus. God took his passionate nature and used it to build His Church.

God does the same for us. Whether we are forceful or gentle by nature God refines those traits for us to do His will.

Grace doesn't make us all Irish because we honor St. Patrick, nor does it change us into brilliant scholars because we admire St. Thomas Aquinas. But what it does do is empower us to be more loving and merciful as we strive to become Christ in the world.



CSA—Sacred Heart Major Seminary

On June 8, Archbishop Allen H. Vigneron ordained three men to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Detroit at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

Fathers John McKenzie, Adam Nowak, and Derik Peterman studied to become our shepherds at Sacred Heart Major Seminary, which is the college and graduate seminary of the Archdiocese of Detroit. Sacred Heart's student body also includes seminarians studying for the priesthood for other dioceses throughout the country and world, and religious orders. Lay women and men earn graduate and undergraduate degrees and diplomas in religious studies at the seminary to serve in parish ministry throughout the Archdiocese.
