The summer is here and the month of June is going. July is around the corner and that means changes among the clergy in the archdiocese. While there are no changes to the clergy assigned here you will experience the effects of the changes elsewhere! Let me explain.

Many of you will remember Brian Meldrum who was here at Star (weekends and breaks) while he was in the seminary. He was ordained a priest three years ago and then was assigned to Our Lady of the Lakes in Waterford. Well Fr. Brian Meldrum has been assigned graduate studies at the Catholic University of America in Washington D.C. for the next four or five years. He will be studying sacred scripture and to earn a S.T.L. (Licentiate in Sacred Theology) and then a S.T.D (Doctorate). So once again... his residence when not studying in Washington D.C. will be here at Star of the Sea. (At least that is the plan!)

So what does that mean? First Fr. Brian is not on vacation though it may look like it! He tells me he has to begin his studies of the foreign languages he will be required to know (at least reading and writing) as part of his degree requirements, i.e., Latin, French,



Greek, Hebrew and German. Second, while he has no "assignment" for weekend Masses, etc., the word gets out fast and I think he is almost "booked" at other parishes filling in where needed for weekend Masses. He will be presiding at a number of our weekday liturgies here as needed or willing. Third, throughout the year, or years, you will be seeing him around here at various vacation times either concelebrating at Mass or presiding.

Fr. Meldrum's assignment is special. Obviously it is out of the ordinary for a parish priest. Nonetheless he responded to the Archbishop's request to do so in order to have scripture scholars available teaching

future priests and lay ministers of the Church at Sacred Heart Major Seminary. (Fr. Brian has been teaching some classes at SHMS over the past three years and he is good at it!) But it is not easy! (I have to say he at least has a whole summer to adjust and prepare to go to CUA. When it happened to me 30 years ago I had two weeks notice from getting the assignment and showing up in Washington!) It is not the life one anticipated when getting ordained. After 5 years of school it will probably be at least 5 if not 10 yeas teaching in the seminary and then who knows what the Good Lord has in store for him! So it is the start of something different in ministry...something that is very important for the future of the Church. Pray for Fr. Brian during this transition time before school starts. And if he talks to you in different languages...just smile, nod your head, and say "God Bless you" and then quickly walk away!!

Summer is officially here!

Summer is a good time to step back and retreat from the pressures and demands of evervday life.

But do we actually take the time to rest?

Often our culturally-conditioned tendency to work or be busy endless hours is a badge of honor that validates our work ethic.

We feel compelled to always deliver consistently high performance, push our limits. Extraordinary performance cannot be sustained indefinitely.

Perfection is something that even Catholics have named our endgame. That's tiring.

It is true that, as Catholic Christians, we are supposed to strive to become more like Christ every day. But Jesus' perfection is far from what we are pursuing.

Honestly, I think Jesus got tired. He did everything with passion. He felt deeply, passionately, intensely. Remember He was human as well as divine.

I think that when Jesus was preaching to thousands, performing miracles, traveling, teaching his disciples, loving his friends, warring with the Pharisees and getting tempted by the devil, he got tired.

But Jesus knew something that we do not. He knew how and when to retreat, when to get away from it all.

As Jesus became more and more successful He "often withdrew to the wilderness for prayer" (Luke 5:16). And he encouraged his apostles to do the same.

He said to them, "Come away by yourselves to

a deserted place and rest a while." People were coming and going in great numbers, and they had no opportunity even to eat. So they went off in the boat by themselves to a deserted place. (Mark 6:31-32)

Scripture tells us that Jesus "got away" often. He knew that he needed time away from the crowds in order to pray. He didn't just sneak in a few moments of prayer between preaching. He didn't just have a quiet time in the morning. Jesus took time away from his busy and growing ministry in order to be quiet with his Heavenly Father.

Shouldn't that tell us something? If the Son of God needed to retreat, to back away every

> now and then and take time for rest, reflection and prayer then don't you and I need to do the same?

> Jesus retreated from the crowds. Jesus retreated from

his disciples. Jesus spent time alone. Jesus rested. Jesus prayed.

"Come away by yourselves and rest a while." This is an excellent time of the year to get away from day-to-day demands. It's a time to change your routine. It's a time to renew and re-energize spiritually, mentally, emotionally and physically. Slow down and just relax.

Speaking of taking time to renew and re-energize, Jean and I will be taking a break from writing our weekly articles in the summer. We will be presenting re-runs in this space. Our regular column will resume in September.


