Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

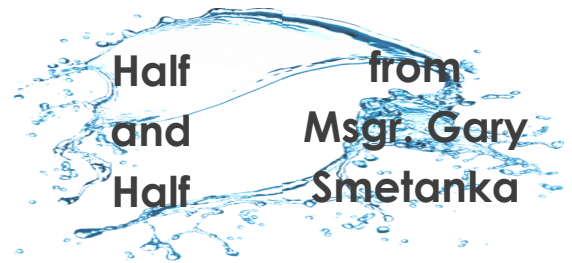

Summer is usually a quieter and easier time especially in parish life. Not this summer!

As we have been trying to keep you informed, Star of the Sea has been selected to be one of nine parishes to begin the next phase of Unleash the Gospel. This is the time for a “re-founding” of the parishes so that everything we do directs us to be more effective witnessing to Jesus and the Gospel in our lives. “Everything” is “how we pray, how we minister and how we serve.” The vision, set forth by Unleash the Gospel, is that each parish community reflects God’s vision, i.e., places “where individuals and families encounter Jesus anew, grow as his disciples, and are equipped to be witnesses of the Risen Christ.” Hence, the next phase is “Sent on Mission.” Just as Jesus sent his disciples out so He does us.

Two weeks ago, included in our bulletin, was the overview of this present process for each parish to respond to the propositions that came forth from Synod 16 regarding parish, families, communications, and schools or catholic education. We have been praying and asking the Holy Spirit to reveal to us “what are we to do?” So the task, simply put, is ...to dream big, think “outside the box” and develop a “strategic plan” that is actionable, concrete and measurable in our mission-centered focus. There are five main areas of focus: parishes, families, parish culture, catholic schools, and communication and technology.

Monday night, July 1, a “skeleton” version will be presented. We will begin at 7 pm in the church with a short presentation, exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, time in prayer before the Lord, and then have that prayer lead us into The Pointe for a focused discussion regarding the vision that was presented. (Since it is the first Monday of the month and our usual monthly Eucharistic Holy Hour begins at 7:30 pm, Fr. Brian Meldrum will continue in church with the Holy Hour and prayer. How good it is that some will continue to pray as others “work.”) There, centered on the propositions, we continue to ask for the



Holy Spirit to guide us. Following Monday night, the Visionary Team will continue the process and write the plan which will then be presented to the AoD Unleash the Gospel Council.

Hopefully, this information is somewhat helpful. Remember, however, that we are a pilot parish so we are moving and learning and moving and developing all at the same time! Please consider joining us Monday night. It’s exciting to see where the Holy Spirit is leading us!

** Our prayerful good wishes and blessings upon Fr. Marko as he begins his new assignment Monday as pastor of Moses the Black (former Madonna) parish in Detroit. He certainly has made an impact during his two years providing “clergy assistance” on the weekends. This is his first pastorate which is exciting and challenging! Please continue to pray for him and all those priests who are beginning new assignments on Monday.

** Thank you for all your support of the parish in so many ways! Today, Sunday, we end one fiscal year and begin another on Monday. God bless you for all your prayers and dedication to Our Lady Star of the Sea parish.

** Please join at July 4 at St. Joan of Arc at 9 am for Mass to celebrate Independence Day! The parish office will be closed Thursday and Friday to celebrate the holiday.

REGISTER NOW FOR 2019-2020 FAITH FORMATION

Our Faith Formation programs are designed to partner with parents in sharing the light of our rich Catholic faith with our children and youth. Through class room activities, service projects, and spiritual experiences we help the children to ENCOUNTER Jesus, GROW in their faith, and be a WITNESS to the love of God for everyone. Classes are offered at the following timeframe from September to May:

Hours for Faith Formation Classes:

- **CHILDCARE MINISTRY**— For 12 months thru 3 year olds during the 9:30 am Mass. Held in the Lower School. *There is no tuition charged for this program.*

- **KINGDOM KIDS SUNDAY PRESCHOOL – For 3 year old – Kindergarten Sundays** during the 9:30 am Mass. Classes held in the Lower School. *There is no tuition charged for this program.*

- **GRADES 1-6**

Tuesdays, Session I- 4 -5:30 pm. Session II-6:30-8 pm.

go and make disciples

As we look forward to celebrating Independence Day, we think about the principles upon which this country was founded 243 years ago. Our democracy is built on the right to freedom of religion, speech, the press and to the rule of law.

In the United States, people are free to worship whatever religion they choose. Not so in Myanmar where the Rohingya (Muslims from the Rakhine region) are not recognized by the government and killings, attacks and burning of villages have forced hundreds of thousands to flee to other countries.

Not so in the Middle East, where Christians and others have fled to other countries due to attacks by extremists, wars and other horrible situations.

Thankfully, this is not the case in the U.S. In fact, religious organizations have had a huge impact in education, health care, and child welfare by building and then serving in those institutions.

The Catholic Church follows the commission given by Christ to "go and make disciples" which is bringing people to Him and sharing His mercy and compassion with others. As His disciples, our work goes beyond Church walls. We strive to think less of self and more of others – key to

advancing the Kingdom of God on earth.

So, we donate clothes to St. Vincent de Paul, bring items for monthly Christian Service outreach, work in soup kitchens, bring Holy Communion to the homebound, and make contributions to areas we cannot reach.

In recent decades in the U.S., there have been attempts and action by government aiming to make faith-based institutions and individual businesses abandon certain beliefs in order to continue to serve. Some of these measures sound reasonable on the surface, but upon further examination are found otherwise for those committed to holding onto their beliefs.

That is why it is important to keep informed through Catholic sources such as the Michigan Catholic Conference (micatholic.org/advocacy/advocacy-issues/) and the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (usccb.org/issues-and-action/index.cfm). Each provides not only information, but what we can do about it.

Yes, Independence Day is a time for celebrating and thankfulness, too. But, let's not forget all the places that do not have freedom of religion. And remember to be aware of threats to live out our Gospel values.
