Imagine flying over the United States in a small private plane at twilight Wednesday night. You could watch fireworks going off beneath you in all directions, as every town celebrates the birthday of the nation. They celebrate because, on July 4, 1776, the Declaration of Independence was announced publicly.

The Declaration was basically a list of the reasons why the 13 colonies had broken ties with their mother country, Great Britain. It was written by a committee headed by Thomas Jefferson. It stated that all people have a right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. By the time the Declaration was produced, the Revolutionary War had already been going on for some months. It would take eight years for the colonists to win the independence they prized so greatly.

Traditional celebrations for Independence Day include torchlight parades, bell ringing, picnics, family reunions, band concerts, and, of course, fireworks. It's a time for fun and a time for reflection, too. People give thanks today for a beautiful country and for a system of government that is admired all over the world.

Even in the United States, the poor and some minority citizens are often robbed of



their basic rights. Frederick Douglass, the great anti-slavery writer, was once asked to give a speech on the Fourth of July. Pointing out that many African Americans were still held as slaves, he told those who had asked him to speak, "The blessings for which you on this day rejoice are not held in common."

Our bright celebrations this day are done in the hope that one day all will be free, that one day the earth itself will shine with liberty.



People say they go to or belong to Our Lady Star of the Sea. What does that mean to you?

Is it a church, a parish, a community, or a family?

Church can mean a building or the Church that Jesus established.

Parish brings to mind a place of worship, perhaps with a school and more. Community usually

refers to a group of people having something in common.

Family denotes a group that is more connected, related, or otherwise tied together.

The answer is "all of the above". However, it is important to recognize that not everyone would think or respond in this way.

We know from the Acts of the Apostles, that the early Christians lived in close communities and treated one another like a family. They encouraged one another in love and good works. (see Hebrews 10:24-25)

Not everyone today thinks of the parish as a family. However, it is still true that "In love, he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus Christ..." (Ephesians 1:4-5) So, if we are adopted, then we are all part of the same family.

> In discussing the importance of the parish family and ways it can be fostered, Unleash the Gospel ties all of this together very well:

The Church is the context given by God in which we encounter Jesus Christ God relates to his people not as isolated individuals but as a people, a family, united with one another in deep bonds of love (Eph 4:1-6). # FORMING OUR FAITH

### Be the Domestic Church-Part II

The term "Domestic Church" refers to the family, the smallest body of gathered believers in Christ. Though recovered only recently, the term dates all the way back to the first century AD. The Greek word ecclesiola referred to "little church." Our Early Church Fathers understood that the home was fertile ground for discipleship, sanctification, and holiness.

In the second article in our series on Domestic Church, we will look at creative ways to connect our faith with everyday activities. Encourage your child to explore their spiritual side through play. Ask your child what they think heaven looks like and have them draw a picture of it. Have your child make up a prayer to thank God for a beautiful flower or sunset.



Expose your child to Scripture through board books such as Bible Animals, videos such as Veggie Tales, stories of the saints—heroes of our faith. Formed.org (info elsewhere in bulletin on how to sign on) has many videos for children such as the Brother Francis series, Jesus Stories, and videos on various saints. Also take advantage of the spiritual lessons in secular TV shows and movies. One dad uses *Star Wars* DVDs with his twins to reinforce the presence of God. "I tell them Yoda is my favorite character, because he calls on a higher power that enables him to do great things in life," he says.
