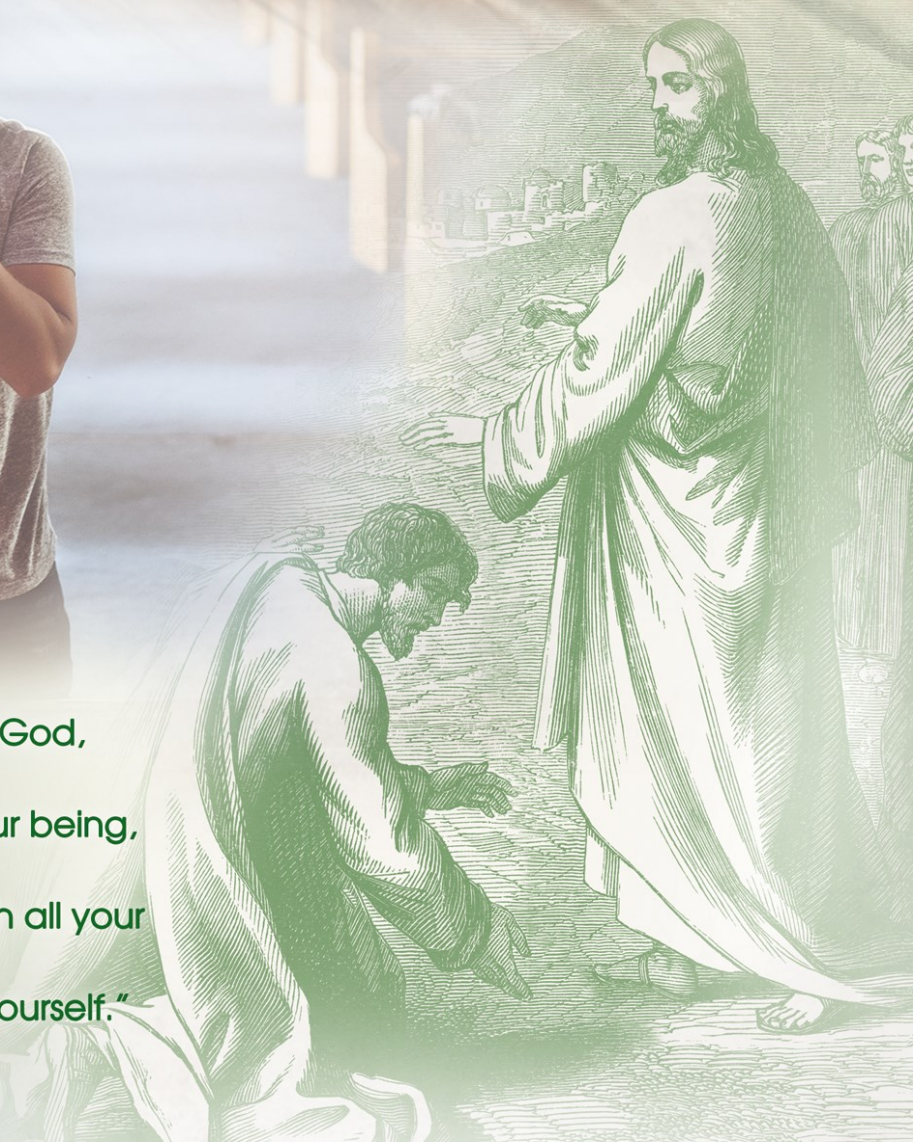

As I mentioned a few weeks ago, July is the time when there are changes in parishes. It is the start of the fiscal year and time for the normal and "usual" assignments to begin. However, sometimes not everything follows that smooth and easy.

As you will read from Matthew Jakubisin himself in this bulletin, he has accepted the position of Director of Music and Organist at St. Andrew Cathedral in Grand Rapids and will be starting there August 1 with his last weekend here at Star of the Sea next weekend.

Matthew came to us just after completing his masters degree from St. John's University in Collegeville, MN. He was young (and still is) and so talented and gifted not only in his organ playing but also in his sense of liturgy and prayer. He was very impressive during his auditions, especially with his organ playing. You can tell he was not the normal church organist. You could almost tell back then that he was destined for something more than a parish organist. I always knew his talent would take him to other places, or someone would take him from us! I just hoped we would have him a few more years than three. It is no surprise that Matthew is now the organist for a cathedral. It is his destiny and I think his dream. He loves playing the organ especially big impressive ones that can fill up a huge church or cathedral with such profound and gorgeous sound! He has also taken our choir to new heights and setting them forward for greater accomplishments.

When Matthew came to tell me of his new position, he said "the Holy Spirit has been moving." Without a doubt the Holy Spirit has truly been moving here at Star of the Sea in many different way. Matthew's contributions to the parish were more than in terms of music. He really was the force behind our parish Facebook postings the past two years and other social media. He was a great staff member that we all enjoyed being around. He volunteered as the 'dining room manager' during the Fish Frys and assisted in so many more tasks



around the office. He will be missed by me and the staff in many ways.

We will miss Matthew and all that he is for us. The Holy Spirit has been good in directing him to this new position, something that is "right up his alley" and so much closer to his family and hometown. I cannot blame him at all in jumping at the opportunity especially given his talent and gifts. I know he will do extremely well at St. Andrew Cathedral. (I also know and trust the Holy Spirit will be helping us in our search for new Music Minister here at Star of the Sea.)

Next Sunday, we will have a chance to wish him farewell after the 11:30 Mass in The Pointe.

\*\* Next weekend, we welcome Father Moise Sabaga of the Society of African Missions, who will be here for the annual Mission Appeal. We, as Catholics, are privileged to belong to a universal Church—that is, one to be found ministering in every land throughout the world. We as Americans are privileged to live in a land of plenty and prosperity. Through our blessings and gifts we show our concern for those less fortunate than ourselves, and to help them in some practical manner when we have the opportunity to do so. A second collection will be taken up next weekend after you hear Fr. Moise.

\*\* It is no surprise to find out that the focus on life dinner where Abby Johnson is to speak was very quickly sold out. Unfortunately, there are no more tickets available for the dinner.

\*\* There is a citizen's petition drive going on now to prohibit the dismemberment abortion procedure in Michigan. This procedure involves the tearing a live baby apart limb by limb inside the womb and

individually removing each of the body parts. This petition drive operates under a committee named **Michigan Values Life**. It is organized by Right to Life of MI and is supported by the Michigan Catholic Conference (MCC). (There is another petition drive out there from the Michigan Heartbeat Coalition. For many good reasons, IT IS NOT SUPPORTED by MCC.) About 340,000 valid signatures from Michigan voters is needed by Dec.15, 2019. # FORMING OUR FAITH

## *Why Should I enroll my child in Faith Formation Class??*

For children and young people, religious education is where the parish accompanies their parents on the journey of sharing the Gospel with their children and forming them as they grow into mature young Catholic Christians. It cannot be emphasized enough that the parents are the first, and best, teachers of their children. What you do in your home will echo down the years of the lives of your children. YOU are the **Domestic Church!** And the Our Lady Star of the Sea religious education program is here to help in this process.

The first task of religious education, at home and at the parish, is evangelization. That means developing a personal relationship with Jesus. Pope Francis put it this way in his letter "The Joy of the Gospel" --

*"Jesus Christ loves you! He gave his life to save you; and now he is living at your side, every day, to enlighten, strengthen, and free you."*

When you were baptized, and when a child is baptized, by the Grace of God we receive the capacity to believe, what is known in Latin as "virtus fidei" -- the virtue of faith. But the Sacrament of Baptism is not magic. To grow in the Christian life, to become a true disciple of the Lord, requires explicit personal faith -- the "actus fidei" or "Act of Faith." Parents promise this on behalf of their children at baptism and it is their responsibility to help their children to "act on their faith" in accordance with age and maturity.

*The parents are the first and best evangelizers of their children. The major sacramental moments that children experience -- First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation -- are important way stations on the journey of faith, but the journey doesn't end with them, it only begins.*

## UNLEASH THE GOSPEL

### go and make disciples

The term "missionary disciple" may seem new, but what it means is not at all new. It's much like what happened during the time of Christ and after His Ascension.

Ordinary people heard about Jesus and became "followers", learning about His teachings and believing in His promises. That's the "disciple" part.

That changed their lives. They felt the love of Jesus and their joy was evident. They were anxious to share that joy and the reason for it with other people. This is the "missionary" part.

In the latter part of the twentieth century, there began a gradual reawakening of the missionary nature of the Church and its members.

Last week's article about missionary disciples had a focus on informally sharing God's love with people we encounter who are struggling in some way. These would be people we know or that would cross our path.

Another part of missionary discipleship is its social dimension. It involves people we would not necessarily know like the poor and the vulnerable. This social aspect of missionary discipleship is also driven by God's love.

"...to receive God's love and to love him in return with the very love which is his gift, brings forth in our lives and actions a primary and fundamental response: to desire, seek and protect the good of others." Pope Francis (The Joy of the Gospel)

Those we don't encounter are the object of this part of missionary discipleship and the action on our part is different.

One way is going out to where the people are, such as soup kitchens. Another is working through organized efforts, such as parish clothing and food drives. For those unable to participate in those ways, prayer is an option. Finally, there is financial contribution.

In works of love, we encounter Christ in the people we serve.

Jesus said "...what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me. (Mt 25:45)

"Let us not hesitate when the Spirit calls." (Pope Francis)
