Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Here we are in the middle of what we would call "summer," i.e., those days between Memorial Day and Labor Day. We do so many things during summer like "enjoying" hot and humid days, extra time for outdoor recreation, more walks and even more just sitting on the deck, looking at the garden and soaking up the surroundings and evening calm.

As much as summertime can be a busier time than the rest of the year, we still need to rest. In today's Gospel the apostles come back after spreading the message of Jesus to many people; Jesus knew they were busy. He told them to go to a deserted place and rest, for they couldn't even eat with the crowds around them.

As I listen to many people, I so often hear how busy people are today; Going from one activity to another, either for themselves, their children or grandchildren. It seems people think they have to be constantly involved in "doing" something. One drawback to that can be the difficulty to then be quiet since, one is not being entertained or surrounded by some noise. At some point, we need to rest, do less, do something different than the



normal. That is what the Sabbath is about. That is what "Sunday" is about.

Many, many years ago, when I was in grade school, every Sunday we, as a family, went to the 6 am Sunday Mass (yes, Masses were that early back then) then shortly after that, off to (usually) Bloomer State Park for a picnic and our own fun activities, often with our cousins, and then came home around 7 pm. Probably three Sundays a month we did this. Yes, fewer things were open back then, but it was still so good for us to focus on faith, family and fun. Today there are far more distractions with Sunday sports, shopping

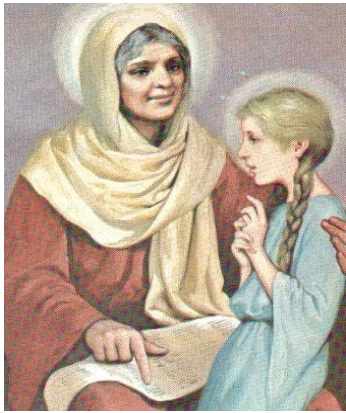

The Knights of Columbus—

From the day of the founding of the Knights of Columbus by Father Michael McGivney in 1882, the organization has been dedicated to its first established principle, charity. With membership in excess of 1.9 million Catholic men, charitable contributions of the Knights of Columbus have grown for 18 consecutive years and are approaching \$200 million. Likewise, charitable service hours have risen to 72 million hours annually or near a full workweek on average for each member.

At Our Lady Star of the Sea Parish, the Knights of Columbus focus upon the Core Principles which have developed and been refined over the last 136 years of its existence.

Charity – Love thy neighbor as thyself and support both spiritually and materially.

Unity – We support fellow Brother Knights as the means to assisting our Parish and Community.

Specifically, the OLSOS Council conducts annual fundraisers such as the St. Nicholas Pancake Breakfast, the Italian Dinner, the Spring Social, and the Tootsie Roll Drive. These events involve the participation of the School faculty and parents, the Parish Office, Clergy, and the extended Parish population.

The fundraisers are conducted with key beneficiaries who include St. Aloysius Outreach Center, St. Patrick's Senior Center, St. Charles Kitchen, and the special needs children and adults in our Community and State. In excess of 500 meals are prepared by the OLSOS Knights of Columbus Council for the homeless and needy in addition to seasonal clothing. Further benefit is provided to Seminarians, Right to Life agencies, and Special Olympics.

Men 18 years of age and older are encouraged to consider membership or to make inquiries regarding the OLSOS Knights of Columbus Council. There are no volunteer or meeting quotas required.

UNLEASH THE GOSPEL

go and make disciples

Today let's look at one of the many ways we can pray.

Of course, there is but "one Lord, one faith, one baptism" (Ephesians 4:5) but there are as many ways to pray within the Church as there are members.

This spring we were inspired and lifted by the special ministry of Awaken with praise and worship and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, the very special devotion in which to encounter Jesus.

For generations American Catholics lived out their faith by routinely practicing habits of devotion, both public and private. Particular devotions changed over time, but the habits endured. In the past, Catholics didn't have Bible study or the faith formation programs that we have now. Deep questions of theology usually meant little to them, but they clung to these ingrained habits of devotion both public and private. These devotions embodied their faith more than any set of dogmas.

Devotions include prayer customs that have grown out of a variety of cultures and circumstances.

Several examples of Catholic devotions include the Rosary, the Stations of the Cross, the Sacred Heart of Jesus, The Divine Mercy devotions, the various scapulars, novenas, pilgrimages and devotions to the Blessed Sacrament and to Mary.

Of course, we need to be careful that devotions don't become skewed toward superstition—"If I do this a certain thing will happen". Some of the practices might be quirky but can be harmless, like burying a plastic statue of St. Joseph to help sell a home.

Devotions are unique expressions of faith, but they should never interfere with the Church's liturgy or mission.

Each of us is called to encounter Christ, grow in our relationship with Him and share the Good News we have heard and believe.

The imagery and ritual of popular devotions make them powerful tools of evangelization. Reciting prayer before meals, ashes on our foreheads, displaying a religious statue or praying the Rosary can start conversations and attract interest.

In The Joy of the Gospel, Pope Francis recognized the evangelizing power of popular devotions. He wrote, "Let us not stifle or presume to control this missionary power."

We need to embrace the teachings of Christ and we have an infinite number of choices of how to express that faith.

And in all those expressions it's important to remember that each one of us is called to "Unleash the Gospel".

Our Lady Star of the Sea offers many opportunities for private and public devotions all year long in addition to the seasonal and yearly devotions. Even in the summer!

Thursday evenings in the summer the outdoor Rosary is prayed in the rose garden on Morning-side at 7:30p.m., weather permitting.

These opportunities will afford us the chance to establish a deeper relationship with Christ our Savior.

The Good News ~ Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

FORMING OUR FAITH

Be the Domestic Church—Part 4 *Prayer*

In the Catholic tradition, the family holds a special place--especially in the formation of faith. So important, in fact, that the family is called "the domestic church."



Don't wait for holidays to make religious traditions a part of your life, especially the tradition of prayer. Saying grace before meals and prayers at bedtime are two proven ways to form your child in our faith.

Grace before meals can be a time to thank God for blessings received or sharing "God Sightings" - encouraging your child to put into words something that they saw or experienced that day that was from God. At bedtime, my sister would make the sign of the cross on her children's forehead along with saying, "God bless you and keep you safe." Remember our Guardian Angel prayer that we all said as children? Share that wonderful belief that there is a special angel "assigned" to each and every one of us who is there to help and protect us.

In addition to traditional prayers like the Our Father and Hail Mary, teach your children that prayer is really just talking to God, that we can use our own words to tell Him what we are thankful for, what we may be anxious about, what our needs are. Our God is a loving God who is always waiting to hear from you!

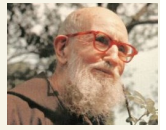
