Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office or online at olsos.org during regular office hours. Or notify the Parish Office of address changes.



Bulletin articles are due by 10:00 a.m. on Friday. Submitted bulletin content is subject for approval. Here we are in the middle of summer. I hope it is going well for you. I know the weather has been a little crazy, but what do you expect here in Michigan?

Around campus here we continue to use the summer to make improvements as we are able by the time and resources allowed. Besides the usual school cleaning and inspecting of machines and items, we have done a little painting in the church gathering spaces and the vesting room hallway. Hopefully you also saw that the wall around the tabernacle has also been painted in a blue-grayish tone ("whirlpool" is the specific color name). The goal was to draw subtle attention to the wall, with the tabernacle and surrounding window a little more highlighted. Given many of your comments, we seem to have accomplished that goal. We also hope to have a possible solution to the air conditioning, or lack thereof, in the church. A little history...a few years ago, during an extremely hot and humid weekend, we lost "a leg" of power going to the church AC and had to replace a compressor, and with that, the coolant. Since then, the air "conditioning" has not been the same since we would often have 75% humidity in the church. (Change in humidity was also not nice for the good functioning of the organ.) To compensate the increase of humidity the temperature is lowered to make it comfortable somewhat in church. Nonetheless, the situation continues this summer. Hopefully we think we have a solution that will not involve replacing the whole system. Pray that this might be possible!! You should also see soon necessary repairs in our main parking lot. Taking care of this situation now should also delay total replacement of the parking lot for more years to come.

Thank you for your continued support of the parish, especially during the summer. Our programs and ministries continue, though parish life might be less active, and they still need support in terms of physical and financial resources.

** Thank you for your fervent prayer to the Holy Spirit in unleashing the Gospel, as we



pray in church every Sunday, especially as we pray to bring about in "this place, and this time," the kingdom of God. Your prayers have been beneficial as we start to finalize our Missionary Strategic Plan to move the parish from "maintenance to mission." It has been a good but a bit tiring summer challenge!

** This weekend we welcome Fr. Mario Amore as additional "help" at our weekend Sunday Masses. He is the pastor of St. Aloysius in downtown Detroit. He will usually be presiding at the 8 am Mass every other Sunday.

** It is time for a little rest and relaxation. Know of my prayers for you during the next weeks.

Dear friends,

My name is Fr. Mario Amore and I am very honored to serve, even in a limited capacity, at Our Lady Star of the Sea.

I was ordained in 2015 and am a classmate of Fr. Brian Meldrum and a friend of Msgr. Smetanka. As of July 1, I am the Administrator of St. Aloysius Parish on Washington Boulevard in Downtown Detroit. Before that, I served as an Associate Pastor at Our Lady of Sorrows in Farmington and St. Hugo of the Hills in Bloomfield Hills. I have visited your community a few times in the past—several years ago as a substitute musician, and more recently for an Advent night of reflection. I am continually impressed with the beauty of your parish and the faith of you, its parishioners. Because St. Aloysius only a 10:30 Mass on Sunday morning, I am able to offer myself in service to Our Lady Star of the Sea for your 8am Mass.

Now, for a bit more background on my current assignment. St. Aloysius has been served for the past 27 years by the Franciscan Friars of the St. John the Baptist Province. When the Franciscans no longer had a priest to send to serve as Pastor of St. Aloysius, they returned the parish to the administration of the Archdiocese of Detroit. We are a diverse community and serve four major groups: the homeless and those in need in the downtown area; men and women who work downtown; parishioners who make St. Aloysius their home on Saturday evening or Sunday morning; and those who are away from the Church or who have never been evangelized—particularly people (millennials) my age living in the city.

Not only are we a parish, we also run two different nonprofit organizations. The first is St. Aloysius Neighborhood Services which feeds, clothes, and provides for the needs of the homeless and elderly in the area. Last year, we served 400 seniors with monthly groceries and more than 20,000 individuals. We have groups that volunteer each day going out on the streets with sandwiches and hygiene products. Additionally, we employ a nurse who provides free care to those who would otherwise not be able to get the medical attention they need. She also serves as an advocate for issues facing our homeless and elderly.

The second organization that we run is St. Dominic Outreach Center. Each month hundreds of eligible individuals and families living in our community receive bags of groceries, clean high-quality clothing, new cribs and mattresses for newborn infants, and hygiene supplies. Once a ministry of the now closed St. Dominic church, St. Aloysius parish saw the need to continue this valued ministry and has been doing so since 2006.

I feel so blessed to serve these wonderful communities, and I look forward to being part of yours!

UNLEASH THE GOSPEL

go and make disciples

We have been invited to journey with our brothers and sisters in the Archdiocese to Unleash the Gospel.

Many have said to me that Unleashing the Gospel, evangelizing, is not new to us at Star. Encountering Christ, growing in our personal relationship and then sharing the good news of what Christ has done for us is familiar to us. In fact, the etching on the doors to the Pointe are the words Encounter, Grow, Witness. So yes, that movement and evangelizing is not brand new to us.

We have been moving in the direction of becoming intentional disciples for a long time. Some are further along in the journey than others and it is always changing and challenging.

This was in an article 4 years ago. So yes, again not new but evolving:

"We have heard a lot about discipleship in the last few years. Here at Star we are committed to move from maintenance to mission and help all of us become intentional disciples of Jesus. To this end, we need to focus on our personal relationship with Christ."

Discipleship begins with an encounter with Jesus Christ. We encounter Him in the sacraments, scripture and in others. Discipleship is the consistent following of Jesus as He becomes the center of our lives. Have we grown in our personal relationship and have we challenged ourselves to do more to bring others to Christ? Very pointedly, do we think of ourselves as disciples?

I think we are more comfortable with the idea that disciples are exceptional people and we are just ordinary Catholics. It's been five decades since the Second Vatican Council when we were all called to holiness and discipleship. Discipleship is still a difficult concept for many of us.

We all have different spiritual styles. Our prayer styles differ, our service styles may differ, but all have a common goal of doing God's work. And here's some good news, you already have been doing things that help you grow in your love of God. Those acts help you share that love and help you become a true disciple.

Begin or enrich your personal relationship with Jesus. Ask the Holy Spirit to show you how you can be a "joyful disciple" using your own unique gifts.

Ask yourself these questions this week. Can we see discipleship in our Catholic way of life? Can we come to think of ourselves as disciples?

That's what the movement to Unleash the Gospel is telling us—that we are all called to be disciples not just an exceptional few. How that looks for you and me will be different because of our unique gifts.

My hope and prayer is that the Holy Spirit inspires all of us to Unleash the Gospel in our hearts and in our lives.
