Thank you for your good wishes regarding my recent birthday and vacation. The time away was very good up north. Weather was almost perfect (though I would have been happy for some much needed rain), company was delightful, it was nice not wearing a watch and not setting alarm clocks! It was a nice easy pace and always so different than "big city" and lots of business. In addition, I just never know who I might meet!!

After Sunday Mass in Alpena, I stopped at this little grocery store to get a few things for the next couple of days. So I am standing at the old fashioned meat counter and I get asked by this gentleman, "Are you Gary Smetanka?" That immediately piques the curiosity! Is it someone who really knows me or do I look like someone else? (Many people get me and Fr. Jim Commyn mixed up.) And where do they know me from? So I said "yes" and then I started to recognize the face. It was the Bishop of Fairbanks, Alaska, Chad Zielinski. Here in this little grocery store we meet and he remembered me. He was in his home town visiting his mother. (Alpena is also the home town of the present Apostolic Nuncio of Turkey, Archbishop Russel, and was the home town of Bishop Kenneth Povish, former bishop of Lansing.)

Bishop Zielinski was one of my students at Sacred Heart Major Seminary and was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Gaylord in 1996. After a few years, he was released to serve in the military Archdiocese and was in various roles as chaplain for a few years.



Having enlisted in the Air Force prior to being a seminarian, serving three tours of duty in Iraq and Afghanistan, he was quite comfortable serving and ministering in the military. In 2012 he was called to serve as the chaplain at the Air Force base in Fairbanks, Alaska. It was there in 2014, in the middle of the night after an exhausting day, he got a call from the Nuncio (the Pope's representative in the US) informing him he was appointed as Bishop of Fairbanks. Well...he told the Nuncio on the phone that he obviously had the wrong number, the wrong person, it can't be him and he hung up and went back to bed. A few hours later, the Nuncio again called him and repeated the message of his episcopal appointment. This time he knew it was for real, especially after some much needed rest.

His flying experience comes in handy. His diocese of 41 parishes covers about 410,000 square miles, the northern most part of Alaska! You can only get to some places except to fly or take a boat! He said 36 out of his 41 parishes are "off the grid" or with no reliance on a utility company. Only a few of the

parishes are self sustaining. I was looking at his schedule posted on the diocesan website and in late July he had an installation at St. Nicholas parish "North Pole." Certainly his diocese is not even close to the "normal" diocese!

Please pray for Bishop Zielinski and other bishops who are placed in some very challenging places and world situations. Former Detroit Auxiliary Michael Byrnes, now Archbishop in Guam, also needs our prayers. The blessing is they love their flock and that makes all the difference.

## go and make disciples

Scripture tells us that love brings joy.

*I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete.*

*This is my commandment: love one another as I love you.*

Love is the subject of sermons, articles, books, songs, seminars, workshops and conversations. Love is a feeling and an action. Love in its purest divine form is far beyond our comprehension.

When we talk about evangelization we use the words, encounter, love, grow, share, and joy.

We are asked to Unleash the Gospel, evangelize, “go and make disciples.” We are told to tell our faith stories with love and joy. This can seem daunting. But the good news about being able to spread The Good News is that our Lord can inspire and enable us to do things far beyond what we could ever think to do on our own, things we think impossible.

Pope Francis in “Evangelii Gaudium” (“The Joy of the Gospel”) states this: “The joy of the Gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus.” “With Christ joy is constantly born anew...I wish to encourage the Christian faithful to embark upon a new chapter of evangelization marked by this joy....”

How do we get that joy to fill our hearts? How do we feel the fire of

love and desire to share God’s love for us? How do we encounter Jesus to fill our hearts? We need Christ.

We know that we encounter Jesus in many ways. We encounter Him in the Scriptures, the sacraments, and in other people. We encounter Him in all creation. We encounter Him when we help others, when we pray for others, when we give our time and talent for a good cause.

Are you full of joy? Do you need a refilling encounter with Jesus? To start, ask Jesus in prayer for help. Let me share this prayer that I came across a couple of years ago.

“Jesus, I need a fresh encounter with you! Please fill me with your Holy Spirit and with this bring me your joy. By your grace, I throw open the doors of my heart to you now. Please take my burdens and worries and give to me yourself! Please, dear Lord, come and fill me to overflowing so that I may spread Your joy to all I meet! Thank You, Lord! Amen.”

# FORMING OUR FAITH

## *Why Should I enroll my child in Faith Formation Class??*

For children and young people, religious education is where the parish accompanies their parents on the journey of sharing the Gospel with their children and forming them as they grow into mature young Catholic Christians. It cannot be emphasized enough that the parents are the first, and best, teachers of their children. What you do in your home will echo down the years of the lives of your children. YOU are the Domestic Church! And the Our Lady Star of the Sea religious education program is here to help in this process.

The first task of religious education, at home and at the parish, is evangelization. That means developing a personal relationship with Jesus. Pope Francis put it this way in his letter "The Joy of the Gospel" --  
*"Jesus Christ loves you! He gave his life to save you; and now he is living at your side, every day, to enlighten, strengthen, and free you."*

When you were baptized, and when a child is baptized, by the Grace of God we receive the capacity to believe, what is known in Latin as "virtus fidei" -- the virtue of faith. But the Sacrament of Baptism is not magic. To grow in the Christian life, to become a true disciple of the Lord, requires explicit personal faith -- the "actus fidei" or "Act of Faith." Parents promise this on behalf of their children at baptism and it is their responsibility to help their children to "act on their faith" in accordance with age and maturity.

*The parents are the first and best evangelizers of their children. The major sacramental moments that children experience -- First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation -- are important way stations on the journey of faith, but the journey doesn't end with them, it only begins.
