### MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

## UNLEASH THE GOSPEL

### go and make disciples

Reading the Acts of the Apostles is a great way to learn about evangelization at work in the first century after the Ascension of Jesus.

His disciples preached about how Jesus fulfilled the words of the prophets. They called for conversion of hearts. They performed miracles in His name and forgave sins.

Those who were followers of Jesus initially called themselves The Way. They were also known by other names, such as Christians or Nazoreans. They followed the mandate Jesus made to His disciples to "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15).

Just think about the conditions for evangelizing at that time. Travel was long and difficult. Communication was slow. And there were different groups to be evangelized based on their beliefs, geography, and ethnicity.

The work was hard, but there was great success. Today, we have the new evangelization. The purpose is the same: to spread the Good News of the Gospel and bring people to Jesus.

The conditions are very different. Technology has provided many new avenues for communication. Society has new and powerful distractions tempting people away from religion or even God.

There are still different groups to be evangelized, but there is one big difference. It is the group of people who were once practicing Catholics, but are no longer practicing.

Their reasons for leaving are varied. Some stopped practicing abruptly; for others, it was gradual. Their church affiliations, if any, afterwards also vary. Many still consider themselves Catholic; they are just not participating.

One thing they have in common. They are our family members, our friends, our neighbors.

How should we approach them?

With love, not arguments

With prayer, not preaching

With regular contacts, not avoidance

By letting the joy in our faith show

With invitations to join us at religious services or church activities

By saying we'll pray for them when there's an illness or loss

By being there for them in time of need
