MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Therefore, with the help of God, I now dedicate myself to the task of being all things that I want my parish to be.


** Our parish will again participate in a special collection to support the archdiocesan Priests' Retirement Fund at all the Masses next weekend. Your generous response to this collection, *With Thanks for Their Service in Christ*, would be a sign of gratitude for those faithful priests who have served the Lord during their "working" years.

The reason for the collection is simple. Having been established only in the early 1970's, the pension fund today is not fully funded. At its inception, the parish Christmas collection used to go to the archdiocesan priests' retirement fund. When the CSA started, it then received its income from the CSA. In the Archdiocese, we are currently blessed to have about 120 senior priests who are no longer assigned to a parish, many of whom continue to minister to parishes as the need arises. This special collection next weekend allows everyone the opportunity to show their support for those priests who have cared for us and ministered to us throughout the years. I know things are tight, but even a \$5 gift makes a big difference. Thank for your generosity in this special collection.





Romans: The Gospel of Salvation provides an authentically Catholic, comprehensive, and simple way to understand the overarching theme of Romans—**salvation**. In this 8-session program, theology professor **Dr. Andrew Swafford** and **Jeff Cavins** examine Paul's letter to the Romans. In video presentations, Dr. Swafford and Cavins provide historical context and highlight the connections to Jesus and Christianity Paul makes with the Old Testament.

Through home reading assignments, study questions and responses, and talk notes designed to accompany the videos, participants will learn that salvation is not merely the removal of a guilty verdict. Salvation is about entering into Christ's life and death and sharing in his eternal sonship.

The cost of the workbook will be \$30.00. Couples may share materials. Both sessions of this Bible Study will meet in The Pointe.

Being a Lector these last few years has heightened my interest in Sacred Scripture. I think that is because the preparation involves not just learning the words but understanding the message prior to proclaiming the Word of God at Mass.

We know from the Catechism of the Catholic Church that "God is the author of Sacred Scripture...God inspired the human authors of the sacred books." We also know that the Holy Spirit is our interpreter: "Sacred Scripture must be read and interpreted in light of the same Spirit by whom it was written."

Through scripture, we learn a lot about God. The more we read, the more we learn about Him – His love for us, His mercy, and His Son who was sent to teach us how to live and who is our salvation.

At Mass, listening attentively to His Word and reflecting upon it help us prepare to receive Christ in the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

More than being simply a source of information, His Word is an avenue of God speaking to us personally. This is only effective if we take the time to think about how it can and
