MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Well, as they say, it is after Labor Day and now it is back to the normal grind. I don't know if there is a "normal" here at Star of the Sea so I tend to think of it as getting back to the "routine" of the parish year. It is much like a "new year" in a parish and certainly in the school. During these "summer months" a number of little projects and two major ones were put into action. The men's rest room by the gym was enlarged and renovated in order for us to have rest room suitable for those with disabilities. I am happy to finally have this completed as this should have been done a long time ago. The other major project is more visible and that is new windows for the library and a new school entrance. The old library windows were original, and the old canopy was showing signs of wear and rust. The new entry clearly denotes the school entrance, which was often problematic in the past. Besides those two items, you hopefully saw the new carpet, and refreshed woodwork, in the gathering space of church. Thanks for your compliments! In addition, there have been other improvements on campus in terms of technology, new flooring in a few classrooms, and a mix of smaller projects. Thanks for all that you do to support the parish and school through your prayers, sharing of resources, and inviting others to join us.

So the "routine" is back as we continue our journey. Now we invite you to be a stronger part of the journey. Be willing to share your talents and gifts, practicing good stewardship, with your fellow parishioners. So many of you have done so and continue to do so already, whether it is through being on various committees, volunteering their love of gardening, etc. Our God given talents and gifts are precious for the sake of everyone!!

I found this adaption of a stewardship prayer that is excellent:

If I will bring others into worship, if I invite and bring them.

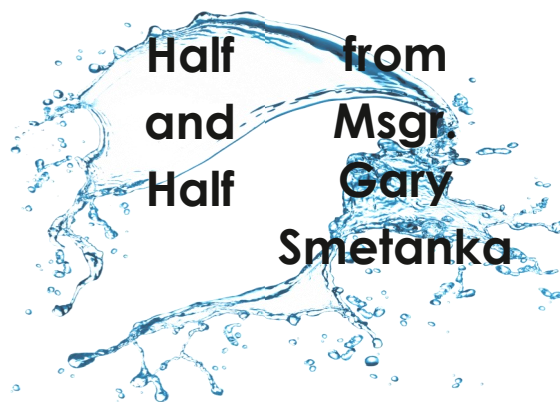
It will be a parish of loyalty and love,

Therefore, with the help of God, I now dedicate myself to the task of being all things that I want my parish to be.

** Our parish will again participate in a special collection to support the archdiocesan Priests' Retirement Fund at all the Masses next weekend. Your generous response to this collection, *With Thanks for Their Service in Christ*, would be a sign of gratitude for those faithful priests who have served the Lord during their "working" years.

The reason for the collection is simple. Having been established only in the early 1970's, the pension fund today is not fully funded. At its inception, the parish Christmas collection used to go to the archdiocesan priests' retirement fund. When the CSA started, it then received its income from the CSA. In the Archdiocese, we are currently blessed to have about 120 senior priests who are no longer assigned to a parish, many of whom continue to minister to parishes as the need arises.

In the next 10 years, about 90 more priests are expected to retire. As you know, health care costs are skyrocketing and the Archdiocese must provide the resources to meet the costs of medical services, prescriptions, Medicare coverage gaps and long-term care. Thank for your generosity in this special collection.

** Keep in mind some upcoming events: our Parish Feast Day weekend with Fall Fest on Sept. 28, a special K of C Breakfast on Sunday Sept. 30, and the Parish Golf Outing on Oct. 1.

Blessings upon your week. Let us make a renewed effort to pray for one another and the whole Church.

go and make disciples

As I've written before, one of the things that stands out for me during the 50 days of the Easter season is that there is no reading from the Old Testament at Mass other than the responsorial Psalm. I don't know about you, but I really like reading about the early days of the church when the ideas and beliefs we hold true were being formulated and how the organization of the Church as a worldwide movement was being developed.

As we hear the words of The Book of Acts or Acts of the Apostles, it probably should be called "Some" Acts of "certain" Apostles because it focuses on some of the missions of Peter and Paul only. Acts is the story of how the first disciples carried out the mission entrusted to them by Jesus.

It's uplifting and encouraging to read about the first evangelists. The apostles and St. Paul were excited about the person and message of Jesus. They had encountered Jesus as a Savior, who by His cross and resurrection, triumphed over sin and death and who sent His Holy Spirit to accompany His followers in all things.

As you've read often in this column, each one of us is called to bring Christ to others. It is our primary and essential mission!

If bringing Jesus Christ to all is good news why do we need to be reminded that our mission is to joyfully share this? Why do we need to convene a Synod to find ways, to "change the very DNA" of the Archdiocese of Detroit and discuss what the archdiocese needs to

do in order to become a "band of joyful missionary disciples"?

There are volumes written about how we, as a church, moved away from our mission to evangelize.

We need to know that the Good News of Jesus Christ we are sharing reaches all people in their very basic needs. Simply, God loves and forgives us unconditionally, we belong to the family of God, we are worthwhile and there is a purpose for living.

There are enough words, enough documents and enough teaching. It's time to put those words and teachings into action.

Let's do as the early disciples did. Encounter Jesus, Grow and share His message, "go teach all nations".

"I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!" Luke 12:49

When St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits, would meet to form young Jesuits for their work to evangelize the world he would end every meeting with one phrase: "Go, set the world on fire."

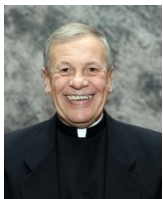
