ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Bulletin articles are due by 10:00 a.m. on Friday. Submitted bulletin content is subject for approval. This Thursday, the relic of Blessed Solanus Casey will be here for our veneration and renewal of faith.

I think the majority of people know the story of our beloved Solanus Casey, Capuchin. After ministry in New York, he was the porter (the doorkeeper) at the Capuchin Monastery in Detroit for 20 years. He listened to thousands of He offered consolation and people. perhaps a few words of comfort when needed. He healed many people in so many ways, often telling people to return home and their illness would be gone or the life difficulties will change for the better. Even while he was living, people considered him a living saint. More than 20,000 people passed his body prior to his funeral in 1957 where 8,000 people were in attendance.

Fr. Solanus Casey was Beatified on Nov. 18, 2017 at Ford Field in Detroit before 67,000 people. (Many of you were there!) Favors "granted" to people, through the intercession of Blessed Solanus, have already been presented to the Vatican in the hope of an approved miracle that would ultimately name him a saint. (For plenty more information on Blessed Solanus, go to www.solanuscasey.org or its easy to find many resources about him on the internet.)

It is a privilege to host the relic of Blessed Solanus here at Star of the Sea. I am confident that many blessings will come upon the parish and individuals during this time, especially the sick and those who are in need of healing. Saturday we will have a special Mass at 11am that will include the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick and a blessing with the relic of Blessed Solanus Casey. If you, or someone you know, is experiencing a serious illness, just diagnosed with a serious illness, or soon to be undergoing a serious operation,



please consider coming to be anointed during this Mass. It is a wonderful sacrament that many people forget to receive!

Please see the schedule in this paper of the veneration times that will begin this Thursday. I will also be offering opportunities for people to experience the Sacrament of Reconciliation on some of those days. This is a holy time for us as we have the relic of this holy man. I hope you can spend some special time between this Thursday and next Tuesday morning.

** Our parish Feast Day weekend is coming up at the end of the month. Friday, Sept. 27 is Fall Fest, a good time for the family. There will be delicious food, games, raffles and opportunities for fellowship. Sunday will be an all you can eat Pancake Breakfast, cooked by our Knights of Columbus. 


them. Maybe you know someone who knows someone!! It is not only a chance for these vendors to





Romans: The Gospel of Salvation
Wednesdays, October 2—November 20

Join us as we study Paul's letter to the Romans which has been at the center of reflection, conversion, and

controversy from the very beginning. *Romans: The Gospel of Salvation* provides an authentically Catholic,

comprehensive, and simple way to understand the overarching theme of Romans—salvation.

In this 8-session program, theology professor **Dr. Andrew Swafford** and **Jeff Cavins** examine Paul's letter to the

Romans. Through video presentations, Dr. Swafford and Cavins provide historical context and highlight the

connections to Jesus and Christianity Paul makes with the Old Testament.

In Romans: The Gospel of Salvation, Catholics will learn...

- The Catholic teaching on salvation
- How to explain salvation to non-Christians
- What is required for salvation—faith or works
- What Paul really means by "works" not leading to salvation
- How Christ's death changed our relationship with God
- The meaning of the difficult passages in Romans
- How we can enter more deeply into Christ

Through home reading assignments, study questions and responses, and talk notes designed to accompany the videos, participants will learn that salvation is not merely the removal of a guilty verdict. Salvation is about entering into Christ's life and death and sharing in his eternal sonship.

Participants in the *Romans: The Gospel of Salvation* study program should have a Catholic Bible.

The cost of the workbook will be \$30.00. Couples may share materials.

Both sessions of this Bible Study will meet in The Pointe.

"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded of you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." Mt. 28:19-20

Before He ascended to heaven, Jesus commissioned His apostles to go and make disciples. The Holy Spirit gave the apostles gifts of grace through which they would undertake that evangelical mission.

These last words of Jesus are a pretty good mission statement for us. This command is the fundamental basis of our faith—to bring the Good News of Christ's salvation to all the world. This means that we can't keep our faith a secret. Our faith can't be invisible or confined to the Catholic community or the property boundaries of our parish.

The disciples didn't have it easy when they went into the world to profess the Good News. But we don't either.

It's easier to just follow rules than to use Jesus' approach of examining our own hearts to determine our motives and attitudes behind our actions. Jesus taught that the Kingdom

of God was about relationships and love.
