

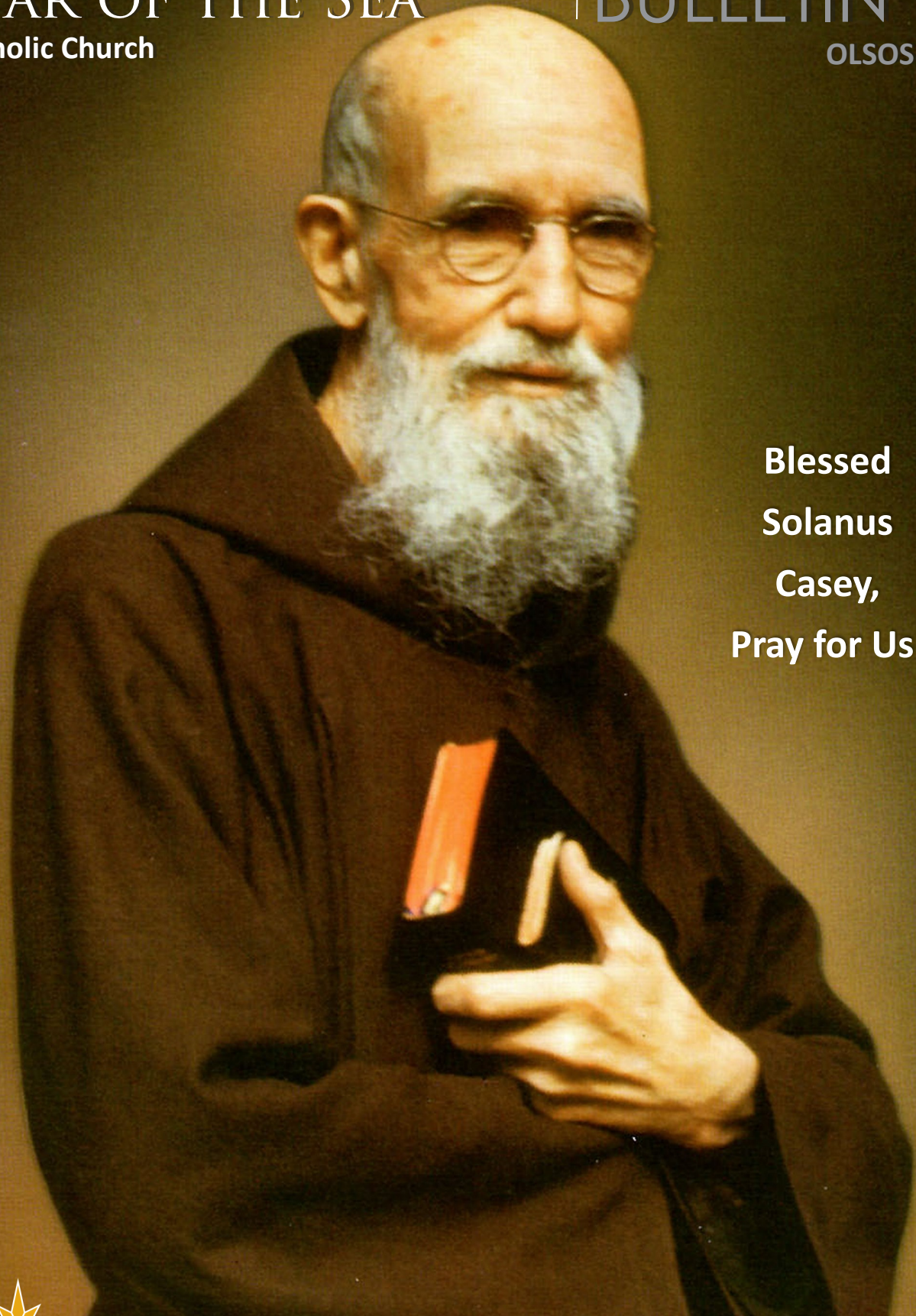

ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

Praise be God in all His designs! What a blessing and a time of Grace being bestowed upon this parish as we have a First Class Relic of Blessed Solanus Casey here until Tuesday morning. [A first class relic is a part of the physical remains of the person, e.g. a fragment of bone, vial of blood, lock of hair or perhaps the whole incorrupt body. A second class relic is something that the blessed or saint had frequently used, e.g., a piece of clothing. A third class relic is anything that has touched a first or second class relic.]

I hope you take the opportunity to spend some special time in these next days to venerate this relic of Blessed Solanus Casey. Catholics venerate relics because we believe graces flow from God through these objects to people of faith or those whom God wants to touch or reveal himself in a powerful way.

So many stories abound from people, especially in our own parish, who have been touched and their lives changed through the intercession of Blessed Solanus Casey. If you were present at the Beatification Mass in 2017 (you can still watch it online), you saw the woman who carried the relic of Solanus Casey in order for it to be blessed and venerated. How humbled she was in this honor. She was chosen because she was the one whose skin disease was cured when she prayed at the tomb of Fr. Solanus Casey (at St. Bonaventure Monastery in Detroit) and hence became the miracle that took him from "Venerable" to "Blessed." Interesting that "favors" were granted to individuals, we believe by Blessed Solanus, on the day of his Beatification Mass at Ford Field in Detroit. Perhaps it was those favors that have already been sent to the Vatican for further investigation to hopefully be declared a miracle which is needed for his canonization to sainthood.

Monday is the prime day to come and spend some time with Blessed Solanus. You see on the schedule the times for some liturgical prayer and the sacrament of reconciliation (confession). I draw your special attention to the **Holy Hour** at 7 pm



when we include adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

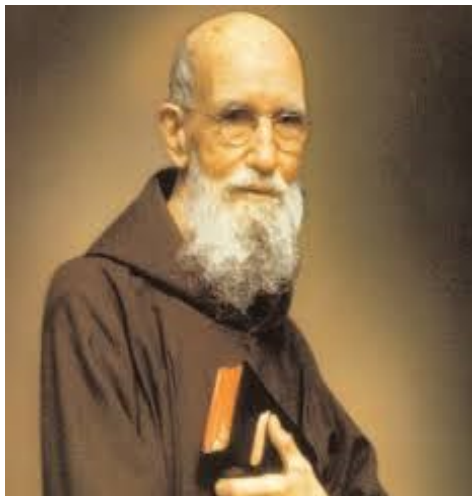

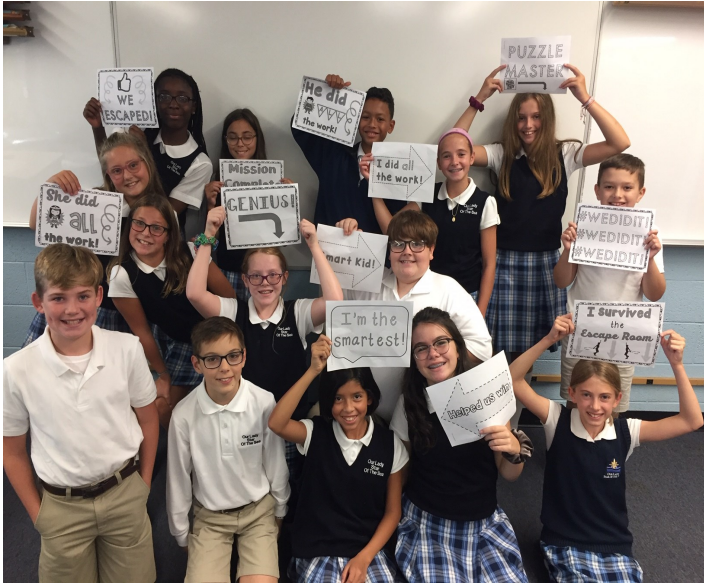

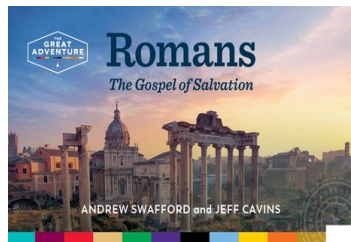

Romans: The Gospel of Salvation
Wednesdays, October 2–November 20
Mornings: 9:30 am–11:00 am
Evenings: 7:30 pm–9:00 pm

Join us as we study Paul's letter to the Romans which has been at the center of reflection, conversion, and controversy from the very beginning. *Romans: The Gospel of Salvation* provides an authentically Catholic, comprehensive, and simple way to understand the overarching theme of Romans—**salvation**.

In this 8-session program, theology professor **Dr. Andrew Swafford** and **Jeff Cavins** examine Paul's letter to the Romans. Through video presentations, Dr. Swafford and Cavins provide historical context and highlight the connections to Jesus and Christianity Paul makes with the Old Testament.

In *Romans: The Gospel of Salvation*, Catholics will learn...

- The Catholic teaching on salvation
- How to explain salvation to non-Christians
- What is required for salvation—faith or works
- What Paul really means by “works” not leading to salvation
- How Christ's death changed our relationship with God
- The meaning of the difficult passages in Romans
- How we can enter more deeply into Christ

Through home reading assignments, study questions and responses, and talk notes designed to accompany the videos, participants will learn that salvation is not merely the removal of a guilty verdict. Salvation is about entering into Christ's life and death and sharing in his eternal sonship.

Participants in the *Romans: The Gospel of Salvation* study program should have a Catholic Bible.

The cost of the workbook will be \$30.00. Couples may share materials.
Both sessions of this Bible Study will meet in The Pointe.

Everyone is blessed to have received a number of gifts from God. From time to time, we are asked to share those gifts by volunteering to serve in one of our parish ministries. Often the response is “Oh no, can’t, not with my busy schedule and all the demands coming at me from a million directions.” St. Paul provides some relevant thoughts and encouragement on this to the Corinthians and to us.

He says that giving of our time and talents must be done “without sadness or compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. Moreover, God is able to make every grace abundant for you, so that in all things, always having all you need, you may have abundance for every good work. (2 Cor 9:7-8) This message reminds us of God’s generosity and that He will provide what we need so that we can do His work in whatever ministry we choose.

It also reminds us to become more Christ-like in the giving of our gifts as we move along in our life’s journey. So, why do people volunteer? They do it because their love for God is overflowing and they want to share their gifts as a gift for Him. That love flows out to everyone. Volunteers do not necessarily have the time; they just have the heart.

If we want to feel more fully a part of the parish and have fun too, let’s think about where we can share our unique talents.

Not every job or ministry fits our gifts but there must be something in a parish community that interests us so that we can contribute. It doesn’t have to be in a leadership role or in a long-term commitment.

No need to wonder if what we do makes a difference. It does! Think of volunteering in the parish as a blessing. Nobody can do everything but everyone can do something.

Ask yourself what you can do and where you will be needed in the parish ministries. Pray and ask for guidance and then enthusiastically offer your services.

Let your love for God flow outward in service to your parish community.
