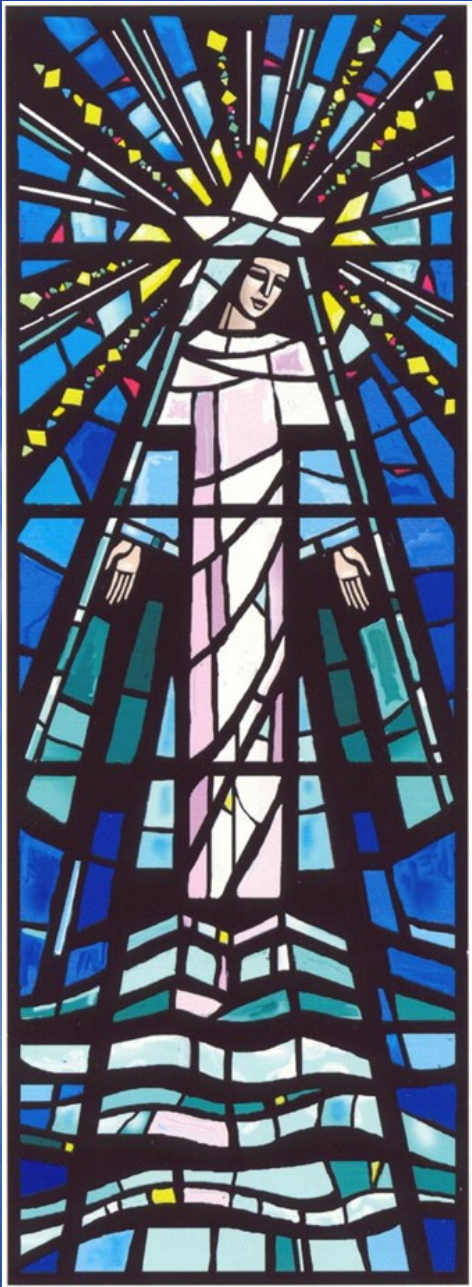

What Catholics need to know about making their homes a domestic church
(excerpt from OSVnews.com)

What actually constitutes a “domestic church”? Let’s take a quick look at the beginning of the Church’s founder’s life. Jesus himself was born into the heart of a family, a little domestic church consisting of his mother, Mary, his foster father, St. Joseph, and himself. Wherever the Holy Family set up their home – in the stable in Bethlehem for a time, in Egypt or in Nazareth – their domestic church moved right along with them simply because their domestic church consisted of the three of them.

Down through the ages, as people were converted and became believers, “they desired that ‘their whole household’ should also be saved. These families who became believers were islands of Christian life in an unbelieving world” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, No. 1655).

Just as the early Christian families were an exemplary example to others around them, Catholic families today can build up their own domestic churches and strive to be “islands of Christian life in an unbelieving world.”...

Within the walls of the domestic church, children learn about their faith through their parents’ and grandparents’ word and example, as well as within the many growing pains and nitty-gritty details of everyday life as a family grows together in holiness. Catholic teachings open our eyes to the remarkable goings on within a growing faithful Catholic family, helping us recognize that there is a heck of a lot more happening in our day-to-day lives than what meets the eye.

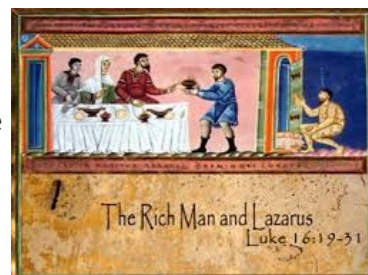
“It is here that the father of the family, the mother, children, and all members of the family exercise the priesthood of the baptized in a privileged way ‘by the reception of the sacraments, prayer and thanksgiving, the witness of a holy life, and self-denial and active charity.’ Thus the home is the first school of Christian life and ‘a school for human enrichment.’

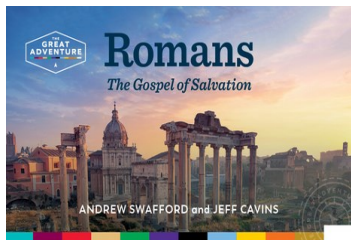

Romans: The Gospel of Salvation
Wednesdays, October 2—November 20
Mornings: 9:30 am—11:00 am
Evenings: 7:30 pm—9:00 pm

Join us as we study Paul's letter to the Romans which has been at the center of reflection, conversion, and controversy from the very beginning. *Romans: The Gospel of Salvation* provides an authentically Catholic, comprehensive, and simple way to understand the overarching theme of Romans—**salvation**.

In this 8-session program, theology professor **Dr. Andrew Swafford** and **Jeff Cavins** examine Paul's letter to the Romans. Through video presentations, Dr. Swafford and Cavins provide historical context and highlight the connections to Jesus and Christianity Paul makes with the Old Testament.

In *Romans: The Gospel of Salvation*, Catholics will learn...

- The Catholic teaching on salvation
- How to explain salvation to non-Christians
- What is required for salvation—faith or works
- What Paul really means by “works” not leading to salvation
- How Christ's death changed our relationship with God
- The meaning of the difficult passages in Romans
- How we can enter more deeply into Christ

Through home reading assignments, study questions and responses, and talk notes designed to accompany the videos, participants will learn that salvation is not merely the removal of a guilty verdict. Salvation is about entering into Christ's life and death and sharing in his eternal sonship.

Participants in the *Romans: The Gospel of Salvation* study program should have a Catholic Bible.

*The cost of the workbook will be \$30.00. Couples may share materials.
Both sessions of this Bible Study will meet in The Pointe.*

On October 14th, 2018 Pope Francis canonized Pope Paul VI. Paul VI became Pope in 1963 after the death of St. John XXIII. He inherited the difficult task of seeing the council through to its conclusion in 1965. In the following years he implemented the sometimes confusing and controversial changes put forth by the Council.

Pope St. Paul VI accomplished much through difficult times of change and wrote many significant apostolic exhortations including *Humane Vitae* and *Evangelii Nuntiandi*.

Because we often reference or quote Pope Paul VI when writing about evangelization in this column, I think of him as the father of the New Evangelization.

The New Evangelization is widely studied and discussed in the Church today, even if it's not fully understood.

We've written often that the spiritual reality of all Catholics being missionaries is to say that the Church exists to evangelize.

Pope Paul VI in his apostolic exhortation on evangelization, *Evangelii Nuntiandi*, (On Proclaiming the Gospel), emphasizes that the mission of the Church is to bring the Gospel to the world and to bring people to Christ, that is, to evangelize. "We wish to confirm once more that the task of

evangelizing all people constitutes the essential mission of the Church."

"The New Evangelization calls each of us to deepen our faith, believe in the Gospel message and go forth to proclaim the Gospel. The focus of the New Evangelization calls all Catholics to be evangelized and then go forth to evangelize. In a special way, the New Evangelization invites each Catholic to renew their relationship with Jesus Christ and his Church." "The New Evangelization calls us to re-propose the Gospel to those who have experienced a serious crisis of faith due to secularization." USCCB

How do we reclaim that missionary zeal? We renew and enhance our relationship with Jesus. How do we do that? We meet Jesus in the Scriptures, in the sacraments and in other people.

How do we grow in that relationship? We pray and experience the sacraments, we do good works. We reach out to others in need.

How do we share this growing faith? It's easier than you think. Not everyone can be a street evangelizer or a fiery speaker. We don't have to be biblical scholars. We are called to just use our unique gifts to share our faith stories, to tell our stories. Pope St. Paul VI pray for us.
