Tomorrow, October 7, is the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. As you know the Rosary is an excellent prayer for an individual, a family, or a group of people. There is a great sense of unity for those who pray the Rosary. St. John Paul II said in his 2002 apostolic letter on the Rosary:

As a prayer for peace, the Rosary is also, and always has been, a prayer of and for the family. At one time this prayer was particularly dear to Christian families, and it certainly brought them closer together. It is important not to lose this precious inheritance. We need to return to the practice of family prayer and prayer for families, continuing to use the Rosary....The family that prays together stays together. The Holy Rosary, by age-old tradition, has shown itself particularly effective as a prayer which brings the family together. Individual family members, in turning their eyes towards Jesus, also regain the ability to look one another in the eye, to communicate, to show solidarity, to forgive one another and to see their covenant of love renewed in the Spirit of God. (ROSARIUM VIRGINIS MARIAE)



Tomorrow, at 7:30 pm, we have our monthly "Holy Hour." Every first Monday of the month we take the time to simply spend time with the Lord in church with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament that concludes with Benediction and a blessing with the Blessed Sacrament. What Catholics need to know about making their homes a domestic church (excerpt from OSVnews.com)

Eyes toward heaven

To help pave the way to heaven for the children, it's essential for parents to establish an atmosphere of prayer in the home. They'll first want to ground themselves in prayer, making it an integral part of their daily lives.



If children are raised in a household of prayer, prayer will become as natural as breathing to them and will indeed provide a secure foundation. Kids take cues from their best role models, their parents and grandparents. The example of prayers said in the morning and evening, for special intentions at various times, and at the dinner table speaks volumes since children look to adults and learn their behaviors.

Nourishing bodies, souls

Dinnertime is a lot more than just about filling our bellies. It's a time to grow together as a family, creating memories and establishing traditions.

Our dinner conversations may not always be so profound and our children's behavior may not always be Hallmark picture perfect. Things happen, kids can get messy and loud, and we may lose our patience at times. We are human, after all. A growing family is a work in progress, and parents are wise to lower their expectations with regard to their children's behavior while still teaching them to show respect and practice their manners as best they can. Mealtimes are certainly those occasions when "tenderness, forgiveness, respect, fidelity, and disinterested service are the rule."

Introducing prayer at the dinner table is not only beneficial, it's essential. Why not use the time wisely? You will have a captive audience, after all. After Grace Before Meals is said, you can have each person tell about something they are thankful that day. In just a few minutes time, you will have united your family in prayer and help them to develop an "attitude of gratitude."

Family Connection

There is much in today's Gospel that resonates in family life. In our daily attempts as parents to live up to the confidence and trust that our children place in us, we come to know the wonders that God can do with just a little faith. In family life we also learn about obligations that are their own rewards. The daily tasks that family members do for one another and for the household are simply the manifestations of our responsibilities to one another.

Take a turn with each member of the family and identify some of the little things that each family member does that make a big difference in your family life.

Read today's Gospel, Luke 17:5-10. Talk about how each person is called upon by God to believe that God can work miracles in our lives, that God can use us to make a difference in our world.

Together as a family, pray **Saint Ignatius of Loyola's Prayer of Generosity**. Ask that God will work through your family to make a difference in the lives of those around you.

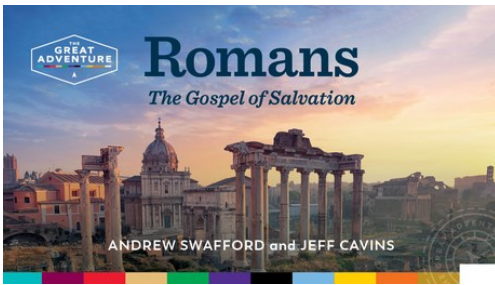

Romans: The Gospel of Salvation
Wednesdays, October 2–November 20
Mornings: 9:30 am–11:00 am
Evenings: 7:30 pm–9:00 pm

Join us as we study Paul's letter to the Romans which has been at the center of reflection, conversion, and controversy from the very beginning. *Romans: The Gospel of Salvation* provides an authentically Catholic, comprehensive, and simple way to understand the overarching theme of Romans—salvation.

In this 8-session program, theology professor **Dr. Andrew Swafford** and **Jeff Cavins** examine Paul's letter to the Romans. Through video presentations, Dr. Swafford and Cavins provide historical context and highlight the connections to Jesus and Christianity Paul makes with the Old Testament.

In Romans: The Gospel of Salvation, Catholics will learn...

- The Catholic teaching on salvation
- How to explain salvation to non-Christians
- What is required for salvation—faith or works
- What Paul really means by “works” not leading to salvation
- How Christ's death changed our relationship with God
- The meaning of the difficult passages in Romans
- How we can enter more deeply into Christ

Through home reading assignments, study questions and responses, and talk notes designed to accompany the videos, participants will learn that salvation is not merely the removal of a guilty verdict. Salvation is about entering into Christ's life and death and sharing in his eternal sonship.

Participants in the *Romans: The Gospel of Salvation* study program should have a Catholic Bible.

The cost of the workbook will be \$30.00. Couples may share materials.
Both sessions of this Bible Study will meet in The Pointe.

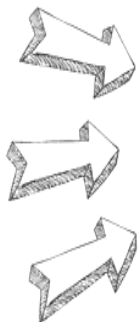
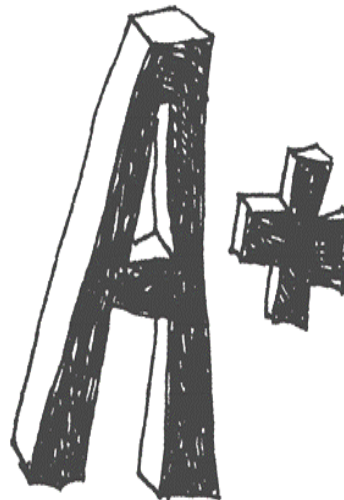

UNLEASH THE GOSPEL

On this past August 15, the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Pope Francis announced that he was blessing 6,000 rosaries that will be sent to Christians in Syria. It was part of an initiative by an aid group and the rosaries were made by some nuns in Bethlehem

He told the people assembled in St. Peter's Square for his Angelus Message that he was doing it because of his closeness to those who have been suffering there, particularly those who had lost loved ones. He said "Prayer, recited with faith, is powerful! Let us continue to pray the Rosary for peace in the Middle East and throughout the world."

The month of October is dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary. Many popes, including Pope Francis, have urged the faithful to pray the Rosary with various intentions, including the ending of war and protection of the Church and society from evil attributed to the devil.

St. John Paul II called the Rosary his favorite prayer, saying "it has all the *depth of the Gospel message in its entirety*".

He added the Luminous Mysteries (mysteries of Light) to more fully reflect its "Christological depth". These mysteries focus on Christ's public ministry, beginning with the Baptism of Jesus and ending with the Institution of the Eucharist. So, chronologically, they occur after the Joyful Mysteries and before the Sorrowful Mysteries.

The Rosary is a beautiful prayer. The Hail Mary is largely taken from Bible verses. Saying the Our Father is the way Jesus taught us to pray. The Apostles Creed recounts what we believe—the foundation of our faith. The Glory Be gives praise and honor to the three persons of the Blessed Trinity.

The added layer of the Mysteries for meditation makes the Rosary a very powerful prayer for all of our intentions.
