Smetanka and in a spirit of service with our pastor and along with my fellow co-worker in the vineyard, Fr. Mario Amore, I look forward in getting to know you over the coming weeks and months.

I do have to warn you that I have a family connection to this parish and to the area:) (Just kidding about the warning part;) Though I grew up in Redford with one sister (later a brother-in-law plus four nieces) and blessed with parents named Jim and Louise, my mom Louise (Spinder) Allan, who is one of 10, grew up in Grosse Pointe off of Balfour St. where she attended St. Clare. FORMING OUR FAITH

What Catholics need to know about making their homes a domestic church (excerpt from OSVnews.com)

Here are some domestic church traditions you can implement in your Domestic Church....

The blessing of the home: Invite a priest to come to bless your home, either when you first move in or at any time.

Devotions: Praying the Rosary is a popular devotion for many Catholic families, who, through its mysteries, reflect on significant events in Scripture pertaining to Jesus and Mary. Wearing the brown scapular is a devotion whereby the person places himself or herself under the protection of the Blessed Mother.

Sacred images and sacramentals: A domestic church should be filled with sacred images and sacramentals. Holy pictures and crucifixes can be hung in your home. A holy-water font can be placed by the front door in order to bless oneself with holy water and remind you of your baptism. Holy water should be regularly sprinkled throughout the home.

Parental blessings: Parents can trace the Sign of the Cross with their thumb or forefinger on their child's forehead at any time while asking God to bless him or her.

Celebrate namedays: Celebrate your family's namedays, which are the days dedicated to each person's patron saint. For example, if your child's name is Joseph, you would celebrate his nameday on the Feast of St. Joseph, March 19.

Creating family traditions: Establish your own family traditions. Enjoy regular dinners together, connecting as a family, sharing and praying together. Incorporate a holy pilgrimage into the family vacation by visiting shrines. When traveling, you can find the local Catholic parish at www.masstimes.org

What a great outpouring of prayer occurred on the days when a relic of Blessed Solanus Casey was in our midst. Countless prayers were offered during veneration at Masses, the Holy Hour, Anointing, and at individual veneration.

Prayer consists of Adoration, Contrition, Thanksgiving, and Supplication (ACTS), followed by Listening. Our prayers likely included thanking God for placing Blessed Solanus in Detroit since so many of us know of someone who was helped by him.

As St. Therese Lisieux said "Prayer is an aspiration of the heart. It is a simple glance directed to Heaven. It is a cry of gratitude and love in the midst of trial as well as joy."

Thankfulness is part of our way of life. We have many reasons to give thanks to God. And it is because of our thankfulness that we reach out to others. Whether we share our time, talent or treasure, it is most often appreciated and results in more thanksgiving to God.

St. Paul speaks of this multiplication of thanksgiving when encouraging the people to be generous like God: "You will be enriched in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God." (2 Corinthians 9:11)

Thankfulness appears in the Old Testament as well, for example: "Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; his love endures forever." (1 Chronicles 16:34)

Making thankfulness to God part of our regular daily routine strengthens our relationship with the Lord. It can be an evening review of the events of our day – the good, the challenging, the surprises, the failures, etc. Thankfulness can be expressed as a short prayer any time or any place about any occurrence.

Blessed Solanus is known for suggesting we offer thanks even for future things: "Thank God ahead of time."
