



In the Gospel reading from Luke 18:9-14 today, Jesus tells the parable of the proud Pharisee who prayed from his self-importance and the tax collector who prayed humbly.

Family Connection

*In the family, one sometimes observes a level of competition between children for parent attention, for acknowledgement of their abilities. Somehow, children seem to internalize that the attention given to one member of the family diminishes the attention given to another. In this way, children can often sound like the Pharisee in Jesus' parable. **Parents who provide continual reminders to their children that they are loved for who they are, not for what they do,***

help children develop a healthy spirituality.

As a family, talk about what it means to compare oneself to another. Discuss whether it is helpful to compare oneself to another. In what ways might this be positive? (when it motivates one to use one's talents) In what circumstances might this be unhelpful? (when it proves discouraging, when it prevents one from valuing the abilities of another)

As a family, read today's Gospel, Luke 18:9-14. Discuss: What was wrong about the prayer of the Pharisee? How can we emulate the prayer of the tax collector?

Pray together as a family in thanksgiving for the blessing that is each member of your family. Pray that your family will be free from unhealthy competition. Pray in thanksgiving that God's love for us is unconditional. From Loyola Press, Sunday Connection

A frequent, much used phrase in our culture lately is “Think outside the box”. There is even a meme that reads “I don’t think inside the box, I don’t think outside the box, I don’t even know where the box is.”

Corporations, organizations and motivational groups all use it. And it is a tag line for the Unleash the Gospel initiative.

What does it really mean? For some in our archdiocese it means a parish must come up with a huge, ground-breaking idea that will transform us. But is that what it means? Not necessarily.

Thinking outside the box requires that we know what is inside the box first. And that box is different for each one of us and for each parish.

Sometimes we don’t get to know God and our mission on earth personally or collectively because we get in the way. We neatly box up our understanding of God, our world, our faith, our perception of others and even ourselves. We’re comfortable with the familiarity of that understanding and we don’t want to explore beyond it.

Thinking outside the box means removing those parame-

ters that bind us, that keep us doing the same things over and over without ever looking beyond those boundaries. It means uncovering the things that get in the way of experiencing a transforming, fired-up faith.

When we’re used to staying inside our little boxes, we can sometimes view God as a God who’s as limited as we are.

What are the limitations that trap you inside your box? Let’s identify our limitations, so we can grow beyond them. Push out those parameters and think outside the box. Pray for the courage to follow Jesus outside those boundaries.

In what ways are you trapping God inside your box? If each one of us pushes our boundaries and moves outside of our little boxes our quest to share our faith stories and bring others to Christ will blossom and we will become true disciples. Our parishes and Church will thrive.

All of us have been called. Fire up! Let God exceed your limits!

Middle School Field Trip - Ford Pickett Plant



Middle school students in the Model Making/Airbrushing Art class will be going on a field trip this Tuesday, October 29th to the Ford Pickett Plant in Detroit.

The field trip will provide the class with a deeper understanding of the early auto motive past of Detroit, in particular, Ford's history and the Model T. Students will be provided with information about the building, Henry Ford, and the history of the vehicles that were built within the walls and in the Milwaukee Junction neighborhood.

The school programs follow Michigan Educational Standards for Social Sciences and incorporated STEM/STEAM-based learning. For my group, the students will take a tour which will discuss the above-mentioned history, and we will have them look at the design aspects of early automobiles. Afterward, students will have the ability to sketch a vehicle or auto-related drawing within the building.
