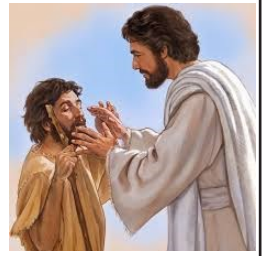

FORMING OUR FAITH

A Different Way of Seeing ~Mark 10:46-52

What a miracle our gift of sight is! Our eyes allow us to see the faces of our friends and family, our pets, trees, flowers, all of creation. They allow us to read books and we use our eyes to create through sewing, art or woodworking projects.



Another way of seeing has to do with what we feel and understand. Do you ever find your self saying, "Oh, I see. Now I understand."

You may experience this when you see and believe that someone loves you. Or when you realize that the world is a beautiful place – God's creation. Or you may use this different way of seeing to realize you have choices about what you do and that certain things make you happy. This is a different way of seeing and knowing.

The Gospel reading today is about Bartimaeus, a blind man who was sitting by the roadside hoping that the many people who were passing by would help him by giving him money. Although he couldn't see with his eyes, he somehow knew that Jesus was coming and he began to shout saying, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" (10:47).

People around Bartimaeus tried to quiet him, but he called out more loudly, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" (10:48). He could not see with his eyes, but he used this different way of seeing and he understood that Jesus had the power of God to be able to heal him.

Jesus stopped and said to Bartimaeus, "**What do you want me to do for you?**" (10:51). He told Jesus that he wanted to be cured of his blindness and see again. Jesus said to him, "**Go your way; your faith has made you well**" (10:52) and immediately he could see. Bartimaeus received the miracle of healing and was able to see with his eyes because he understood and believed in the power of God.

This week take the time to use your eyes to see all you can see of this beautiful world AND to use this different way of seeing to understand just how much God loves you. Believe.

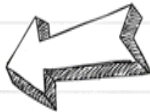

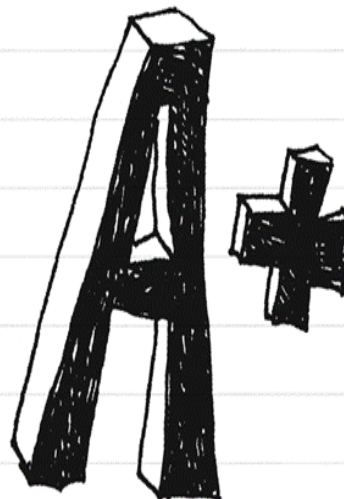

UNLEASH THE GOSPEL

go and make disciples

On October 14th Pope Francis canonized Pope Paul VI.

Paul VI became Pope in 1963 after the death of St. John XXIII. He inherited the difficult task of seeing the council through to its conclusion in 1965. In the following years he implemented the sometimes confusing and controversial changes put forth by the Council.

Pope St. Paul VI accomplished much through difficult times of change and wrote many significant apostolic exhortations including *Humane Vitae* and *Evangelii Nuntiandi*.

Because we often reference or quote Pope Paul VI when writing about evangelization in this column, I think of him as the father of the New Evangelization.

The New Evangelization is widely studied and discussed in the Church today, even if it's not fully understood.

We've written often that the spiritual reality of all Catholics being missionaries is to say that the Church exists to evangelize.

Pope Paul VI in his apostolic exhortation on evangelization, *Evangelii Nuntiandi*, (On Proclaiming the Gospel), emphasizes that the mission of the Church is to bring the Gospel to the world and to bring people to Christ, that is, to evangelize. "We wish to confirm once more that the task of evangelizing all people constitutes the essential mission of the Church."

Evangelii Nuntiandi has been widely praised.

Pope Francis said that it is "the greatest pastoral document written to date" and that it included words that "are as timely as if they had been written yesterday."

In *Evangelii Nuntiandi*, Paul VI wrote that the Church itself "has a constant need of being evangelized," and that people today listen "more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses." (I've used that quote often)

"The New Evangelization calls each of us to deepen our faith, believe in the Gospel message and go forth to proclaim the Gospel. The focus of the New Evangelization calls all Catholics to be evangelized and then go forth to evangelize. In a special way, the New Evangelization invites each Catholic to renew their relationship with Jesus Christ and his Church." "The New Evangelization calls us to re-propose the Gospel to those who have experienced a serious crisis of faith due to secularization." USCCB

How do we do reclaim that missionary zeal? We renew and enhance our relationship with Jesus. How do we do that? We meet Jesus in the Scriptures, in the sacraments and in other people.

How do we grow in that relationship? We pray and experience the sacraments, we do good works. We reach out to others in need.

How do we share this growing faith? It's easier than you think. Not everyone can be a street evangelizer or a fiery speaker. We don't have to be biblical scholars. We are called to just use our unique gifts to share our faith stories, to tell our stories.
