MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

This weekend we continue to take steps forward in knowing more about unleashing the Gospel, i.e., not only the Archbishop's pastoral letter of last year but actually spreading the Gospel in our lives. It is good that we take another look in order to gain greater understanding on both accounts. For your information, this is not just happening here at Star. More than 550 volunteers have been trained and sent out as "missionaries" to every parish in the Archdiocese of Detroit to spread the news and engage the faithful. Certainly "Unleash the Gospel Weekend" will have a positive effect in southeast Michigan!

Thank you for bringing your phones into church and following the directions so you can engage in the "6 Day Challenge." I trust the 5 minutes given to this challenge is not over-bearing on your daily schedule! In case you missed it, the directions are simple. Text the word **Gospel** (or the word **Evangelio** for the Spanish edition) to number **484848** (lower case or caps work the same). [For those who do not have such capabilities but still have computer access, go the Unleash the Gospel Challenge website **utgchallenge.com** (**utgreto.com** for the Spanish version) and follow the directions. For those with no computer access and still want to take the challenge, we have a booklet for you to use!]

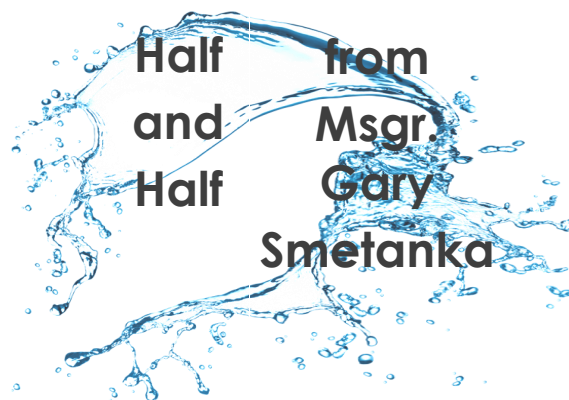
What is the challenge? To watch a very short video and do a short reflection, taking only 5 minutes! The themes of the six short videos cover: our mission, "why here and why now," our new identity, your individual role, the role of families and "for generations to come." Simple. Easy. Informative. Thought provoking. Beneficial!

The AoD has also launched a wonderful new digital news service. It is called **Detroit Catholic**. Detroit Catholic is a perfect vehicle in today's society to share the stories of the people and communities in this area who are answering the call to unleash the Gospel. It is a channel to provide you daily coverage of news and issues affecting Catholics in the AoD, the US and around the world. Go to **detroitcatholic.com**, and then to the blue box on the right side to sign up for your daily, weekly or monthly news service! I think you will enjoy it.

** Beginning Monday, Nov. 5, Archbishop Vigneron, and all US bishops, are dedicating themselves to 7 days of intensified prayer and fasting. The intentions for this period of prayer and fasting are three-fold:

1) For the healing and support of all victims of clergy sexual abuse; 2) For the conversion and just punishment of perpetrators and concealers of sexual abuse; 3) For the strength of the bishops to be holy shepherds in protection and leading their sheep from all harm. While this is specifically an effort of prayer and reparation by the bishops, Archbishop Vigneron welcomes most gratefully others to join in praying for these intentions.

** While Veteran's Day is next Sunday, our "**Salute to American Heroes**" concert, honoring our veterans, is this Friday night at 7 pm in church.

** Thanks for your generous response to our Fall Food Drive. Many people will benefit from your special sacrifice.

** Last weekend I mentioned at the last two Masses some concerns regarding The Taste. First, I shared frustration that the invites were mailed Oct. 11 but they were still stuck someplace in the system. Second, I said unfortunately two restaurants cancelled their participation in The Taste, which is coming up in two weeks. I said that Gaudino's was one of those restaurants. Unfortunately some people spread the word that I was saying bad and negative things about Gaudino's. The only thing I said is that they cancelled and for all those who frequently visit this wonderful restaurant/market to mention we miss them at The Taste. I did not say anything negative about their delicious food or wonderful service or their offerings. I believe that people shared other parts of my talk but words that were taken out of context or embellished on their own. As such, the reports that I said negative things specifically about Gaudino's is false. I know from personal experience they have delicious food, great service and atmosphere. Third, we now need the help of the parishioners to secure two more restaurants or caterers to share their delicious food with The Taste crowd on Nov. 17.

FORMING OUR FAITH

Preparing for the Sacraments!

What an exciting year as our younger students prepare to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist!



In the first part of the year, the children learn about God's great love for them and the gift of free will. He gives us so that we can decide for ourselves to love Him. They will learn that our friendship with God is hurt by sin but that He will ALWAYS forgive our sin if we truly repent and ask for His forgiveness.

In November, they will receive the gift of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Starting in January, the children will learn about the great gift of the Eucharist—being prepared to receive the Body & Blood, Soul & Divinity of Jesus Christ into their own bodies—this great miracle that happens at every Mass! They also learn about the importance of gathering together with their Church family every week to praise God, giving thanks, and be fed by both the Word of God and the Body & Blood of Christ!



Please pray for our children as they prepare for the sacraments!



Our 8th graders are in their second year of preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in May of 2019. As part of their preparation, they perform Mercy Experiences—opportunities to serve others through parish/community outreach, prayer and family service, participate in several retreats, and learn more about the Gifts and Fruits of the Holy Spirit.

Last Sunday, our Confirmand and their sponsors participated in a retreat where we focused on the role of the Holy Spirit in their lives as their advocate and helper. An analogy was made to sailors knowing how to change their course. To do so they need to nudge the boat forward in a series of small, gentle turns, allowing the wind to fill their sails and do the bulk of the work. Just so, the "wind" of the Holy Spirit helps us to correct our course every now & then. BUT, we need to listen to that small voice in our head/heart and respond by saying yes to that prompt.

We concluded by emphasizing that Confirmation is an action, such as ACT ON. **Act on being bold, being holy, being Catholic!**

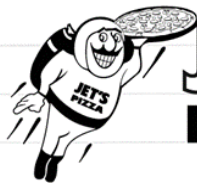
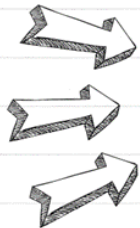
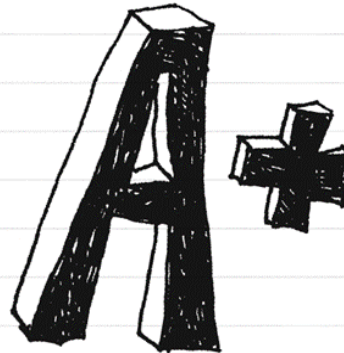

UNLEASH THE GOSPEL

go and make disciples

What does the term "missionary disciple" mean?

Looking at each word individually, a missionary is one who carries out a mission or has a purpose and pursues it. A disciple is defined as someone who follows another and learns and promotes what that individual espouses.

Pope Francis put the two together and introduced "missionary disciple" in his apostolic exhortation, "The Joy of the Gospel".

A few years later in the road map for the future of our Archdiocese, "Unleash the Gospel", Archbishop Vigneron also used the term "missionary disciple" a number of times.

Many of us never expected to be a missionary or a disciple. Yet, we are missionary disciples since in "The Joy of the Gospel", Pope Francis says "In virtue of their baptism, all the members of the People of God have become missionary disciples (cf. Mt 28:19)".

He explains that those who have experienced God's goodness and saving love for us are driven to share their joy with others. This was true in the many Gospel accounts of those encountering Jesus and it is true of us today.

But, how can parishioners of Our Lady Star of the Sea like you and me be missionary disciples? This is one of the ways included in "The Joy of the Gospel".

"Being a disciple means being constantly ready to bring the love of Jesus to others..."

In informal "preaching...which is always respectful and gentle, the first step is personal dialogue, when the other person speaks and shares his or her joys, hopes and concerns for loved ones, or so many other heartfelt needs.

"Only afterwards is it possible to bring up God's word, perhaps by reading a Bible verse or relating a story, but always keeping in mind the fundamental message: the personal love of God who became man, who gave himself up for us, who is living and who offers us his salvation and his friendship."

The encounter may conclude with a prayer if appropriate, or a promise to pray for them.

What is our missionary territory?

Our mission territory consists of "our neighborhoods, workplaces, schools, and even our own homes" (Unleash the Gospel). This extends also to our parish, friends, organizations, groups, and the larger community.

What preparation is needed?

We need to be fed by God's Word in Scripture and the Eucharist. We need Grace which God has given us and will continue to give us. Finally, we must anticipate that there will be opportunities to share His love with others.

Then, "Let us not hesitate when the Spirit calls." (Pope Francis)
