Happy Advent! Happy New (Liturgical) Year! There is always much excitement this time of the year. There is the planning, the shopping, the baking, the different activities and gatherings. Hopefully, amid it all, we can still remember the priorities and reason of the season.

Let's try to celebrate the season of Advent this year, even as we naturally combine and blend it with the season of Christmas. (It is easy to celebrate Christmas before Christmas Day and then think the season is over on Dec. 26.) Advent is the time to prepare for Christmas. We see the days get shorter and the darkness of the night start sooner. With Christmas, the days get longer and brighter - just as the presence of Christ sheds light in our life. Even as we might put up the tree and decorations around the house, and as we light up the outside of our homes, let us be mindful how we are preparing the Christmas season that begins Dec. 25. Sav little prayers as you decorate that the spirit of peace of Christmas will permeate your heart and enliven your spirit to celebrate the true meaning of Christmas. As you put up the Nativity set in your house, maybe leave the infant out of the manger until Christmas Day. Gather the family around and still sing some Advent songs, waiting to sing the



Christmas Carols until Christmas. Let Advent be Advent and rejoice with the arrival of Christmas!

FORMING OUR FAITH



Today starts a new Liturgical vear in the Church with the season of Advent.

Yes ADVENT not Christmas! While we may be wishing we had done our outdoor decorating before the big snowfall in No-

vember, Christians have celebrated Advent as a way to prepare our hearts for the coming (advent) of Jesus Christ as a baby! It is a time of reflection on His first arrival in a manger and also a time to anticipate His second coming!

So how can we take a step back and make our Advent more intentional with our families? Here are 5 ideas that you could try...

1. Read a daily devotional with the readings for the day and a reflection on those readings. We are offering both the Little Blue Book and the Word Among Us for adults as well as *Advent A-Z* for children. You can find them in the Gathering Space of church.

2. Read a book about Advent to your children. A few suggestions: Advent Storybook by A. Schneider Who is Coming to Our House? by J. Slate The Children's Little Advent Book by Tj. Burdick

Tabitha's Travels by A.Ytreeide (for 8+)

- 3. Talk about the history of Advent and make an Advent wreath. Don't forget to say a prayer and light the candles every night!
- 4. Listen to Advent/ Christmas music . Turn off the TV and video games and sit in front of your Christmas tree and listen to these special songs of the season.

Here we are at the beginning of Advent -- a time to plan, reflect, and give of ourselves as we await celebration of the Nativity of the Lord. The Readings at Mass look toward the future with hope and so do we. We know what the Lord's coming has meant for us.

Even now, He is with us. He is present in our lives every day. Yet our busy lives often get in the way of recognizing His presence. This is especially true during this time of year.




