Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Happy Advent! Happy New (Liturgical) Year! There is always much excitement this time of the year. There is the planning, the shopping, the baking, the different activities and gatherings. Hopefully, in the midst of it all, we can still remember the priorities and reason of the season.

Let's try to celebrate the season of Advent this year, even as we naturally combine and blend it with the season of Christmas. (Last year we had four full weeks of Advent. This year we have three full weeks plus one day.) It is easy to celebrate Christmas all before Christmas Day and then think the season is over on Dec. 26. Advent is the time to prepare for Christmas. We see the days get shorter and the darkness of the night start sooner. With Christmas, the days get longer and brighter - just as the presence of Christ sheds light in our life. Even as we might put up the tree and decorations around the house, and as we light up the outside of our homes, let us be mindful how we are preparing the Christmas season that begins Dec. 25. Say little prayers as you decorate that the spirit of peace of Christmas will permeate your heart and enliven your spirit to celebrate the true meaning of Christmas. As you put up the Nativity set in your house, maybe leave the infant out of the manger until Christmas Day. Gather the family around and still sing some Advent songs, waiting to sing the Christmas Carols until Christmas. Let Advent be Advent and rejoice with the arrival of Christmas!



So the bottom line would be this. There is nothing wrong with surrounding ourselves with the Christmas decorations and music. If you love the season, like I do, enjoy it all. Just keep it going in the actual Christmas season instead of taking it all down Dec. 26 or even before New Year's Day or the feast of Mary, Mother of God. The encouragement would be to keep celebrating until the celebration of Epiphany. Enjoy the season!!

BLESSING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

It starts at the evening meal on the Saturday before the first Sunday in Advent with the blessing of the wreath. (The head of the household is the one designated to say the prayers, following which various members of his family light the candles. If the group is not a family, then a leader may be selected to say the prayers and others appointed to light the candles.) The following prayer can be used.



All: Who made heaven and earth.

Leader: O God, by whose Word all things are sanctified, pour forth Your blessing upon this wreath and grant that we who use it may prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ and may receive from You abundant graces. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The wreath would then be sprinkled with water. Then follows the prayer which is said before the evening meal each night of the first week in Advent.

FIRST WEEK The following prayer should be repeated each day during the first week. After the prayer the family's youngest child lights the first purple candle. (Family members can also take turns lighting and blowing out the candles on each night.)

Leader: O Lord, stir up Thy might, we beg Thee, and come, that by Thy protection we may deserve to be rescued from the threatening dangers of our sins and saved by Thy deliverance. Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The candle is allowed to burn during evening meals for the first week.

FORMING OUR FAITH

Thank you to our National Evangelization Team (NET) for two wonderful *Spirit filled* retreats!



Saturday, Nov. 17th, our 8th graders met at St. Lucy's Church to explore the theme of "With Great Power" (Confirmation and the Holy Spirit).

Guided by the NET Team, our students learned that with great power comes great responsibility! That at Confirmation, the grace of Pentecost is unleashed and we receive greater access to the gifts of the Holy Spirit. That God can do incredible things with us if we are open to His action and that their lives will look different when living in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Sunday, Nov. 18th, our 7th graders met here at Star to explore the theme

Why?

That's a favorite question of toddlers. The grass is green. Why? We're having chicken for dinner. Why? Time for your nap. Why? It can drive one to want to scream and say because I said so.

The basic and only reason is that all of these provide us the opportunity to encounter Jesus and build a personal relationship with Him. An opportunity to Encounter, Grow and Witness.

Faith is the process in which Christ becomes the central person in our lives.








News From Eighth Grade Literature and Writing Class
