ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



Here we are in the final days of Advent season that I bet has not been "normal" for you. We have found ourselves being restricted in our time of socializing, our way of socializing, and perhaps in our times and ways of sharing the joy of this season with family and friends.

Despite how different and awkward this time during the pandemic, we can not forget the abiding presence

of Jesus. I hope during these months, especially during this Advent season, you have taken the time to pause and ask yourself, "Where is God leading me/us in these troubled times? What is God trying to tell me this Advent? What good will be of our benefit through all this time?" Now more than ever is the time to focus on Jesus and the joy that we should have as the Word of God becomes flesh for us.

There are many little ways in which we can certainly keep the focus of Christ in Christmas. For instance, if you still have some gifts to wrap, say a little prayer for the person who will receive the gift. Think about their good qualities and characteristics. Think of little ways you might continue to help them throughout the year. Maybe a note or phone call every now and then. As you might receive gifts from others and place them under your tree, thank God for the gift of these people in your life. How in some way have they brought you closer to Jesus? How do they challenge you through their lives to be a bit more Christ-like in yours?

Take these last five days of Advent to welcome Christmas. As the Christmas season begins late Thursday afternoon, may we continue to be a blessing to all we encounter and keep Christ as the reason for the season!

** I hope by this time you have become aware that reservations for all our Christmas Masses are required this year. It seems to be the only fair way of preparing for the unknown. Capacity at each of our Masses will be limited to 250 or under, depending how we can keep appropriate distance between households/families. To make reservations please go to our website, www.olsos.org. A few things to remember: the one entry point will be the main canopy church doors (except obviously for the gym Mass) where you will then be seated in an assigned pew. Everyone must wear a face covering, over the nose and mouth, entering, during and leaving church. If you are inviting others to join you, please tell them of this requirement. It is our best way to try and keep everyone safe during this crisis. If you are uncomfortable being a part of a larger crowd, caring for a sick loved one, have a compromised health condition, please stay home and watch one of our own live-streamed Masses, or that from another church. If you really want to fulfill your desire to physically be present for a Christmas Mass, consider coming to Sat. Dec. 26 at 4 pm or Sunday Dec. 27 at the 8 am, 9:30 am or 11:30 am Masses. In the past three months we have had about 125 people at those Masses.

** I ask for your special prayers this week. There will be additional tension due to the pandemic. Let's pray for each other and do our best to cooperate with safety protocols and have Christian charity in keeping everyone safe. Pray for the true joy and peace of Jesus come into the hearts of those who seek him this Christmas.

** The parish office will be closed starting Wednesday, December 23rd at 5:00pm for the Holiday. We will reopen Monday, December 28th at 8am.

May our prayers for each other keep us united in the Lord's love.

Reservations are Required Limited to 250 people per Mass



Here is what you need to know:

- To make reservations for your household or those willing to sit together at Mass, please visit our website, www.olsos.org,
 - If you do not have access to the internet, call the parish office @313-884-5554 and we can assist you with reservations.
- Print your Eventbrite tickets or have them available on your phone or Bring them
 with you when you come to Mass so you may be seated with safe distancing.
- Doors will open 45 minutes prior to Mass. Please arrive no later then 15 minutes prior to Mass so people can be seated safely.
- Face masks, covering both nose and mouth, must be worn at all times entering, during, and leaving Mass. Please inform all guests of this requirement.
- **Deadline to register**: Eventbrite will remain open until 2 hours priors prior to Mass time or at Dec. 23 at noon if calling the parish office.
- Please use Eventbrite to cancel your reservations so others can register. If reservations were made through the parish office, please call the office.
- There are large white boxes in church for your Christmas Offering envelopes. We highly recommend online giving, please see our website at www.olsos.org/give
- Safe alternatives for high risk health individuals: If you are uncomfortable for any reason to be in a larger Christmas crowd, caring for a sick person, or feeling sick yourself, consider watching our livestreamed Masses or another Mass on TV. You may also feel more comfortable at a Mass with fewer people.
- Saturday, Dec. 26 at 4 pm or Sunday at 8, 9:30 or 11:30 am are good alternatives for you.

It means If there is any part of our lives which we have withheld from God, then we change our mind; we trust Him with that part of our lives!


We can trust God with everything we've got. He is totally and completely Good.
