
Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, commented that Christmas is a time to encounter Jesus. "Christmas is an encounter between God and His people." It is also a



Eight New Year's Resolutions for Catholics

It's January again—time to make those New Year's Resolutions! Why not make a few resolutions to become a better Catholic in 2018? You certainly don't have to tackle all eight, but choose two or three goals to improve your spiritual life this year.

A Catholic smartphone?



Surprisingly, you'll find plenty of smartphone apps to help you become a better Catholic. Simply type "Catholic" in your phone's app store search index, and you'll find a long list of apps including prayers, Catholic radio stations, Confession guides, Bibles, etc. Instead of texting or checking email during idle time, make use of those apps to learn more about

your faith.

Attend daily Mass

Most parishes offer daily mass during the week in the morning, evening or during lunch. Since the group attending is usually small and there is often no singing, most daily masses will only take about 30 minutes of your day. In return, you'll receive extra graces and blessings for the small sacrifice. We offer 7:30 am Mass Monday – Thursday, 8:30 am Mass on Fridays.

Go to Confession every month



Yes, it's difficult to face your sins and say them out loud, but frequent reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation gives you the grace to fight those sins and perhaps finally defeat them. If your parish's allotted time for the sacrament conflicts with your schedule, call the parish office to make an appointment. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered here at Star on Saturdays at 3:00 pm.

Read the Bible

If you don't own a Catholic Bible, invest in one and keep it out where you will see it every day. Attend a Bible study if your parish offers one or ask your priest to start one if it's not available. You'll also find helpful guides online or in a Catholic bookstore. Our latest Bible Study offering is on Wisdom starting on January 10th. See the Forming Our Faith page for more information.

Get involved with your parish



Volunteering as a lector, Eucharistic Minister, choir member or usher requires a very small time commitment but will pay off by helping you to feel like an important part of your parish. Pray the Rosary

The Rosary has been hailed by saints and popes alike as a powerful weapon to defeat evil and a beautiful way to meditate on the gospels. There are many powerful blessings and promises granted to those devoted to the Rosary.

If all you do is go to mass every Sunday, you're missing out on many wonderful resources for your faith. This year, resolve to read at least five books on Catholic topics. Pray to the Holy Spirit for guidance.

Spend some time in front of the Blessed Sacrament



Many parishes offer Eucharistic Adoration, but you can stop by a Catholic church any time the doors are open and spend a little quality time with Christ. Even just 10-15 minutes on a regular basis will deeply improve your spiritual life. Adoration is held every Wednesdays from 11:00 am - 2:00 pm in the Parish Office Chapel. In addition, evening Adoration is the first Monday of the month in the church, 7:30-8:30 pm. For the month of January, Adoration will be on January 8th.



The Holy Family



In the midst of the Christmas season, we pause to consider the Holy Family. In today's Gospel, we hear about how Joseph protected Jesus from danger by relocating the family to Egypt in obedience to God. Following the model of the Holy Family, we might use this feast to recall the responsibility that each family member has to contribute to the good of the family and recommit ourselves to one another.

You might prepare a meal together, prepare a special dessert, or perhaps do a craft together. When you finish, talk about how each family member contributed to the common project. Remind one another that each member of the family contributes to the good of the whole family. Recall that Jesus was also part of a family and that this Sunday we celebrate the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Read together today's Gospel, Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23. Pray together that your family will continue to protect and care for one another as Mary and Joseph protected and cared for Jesus.

"Every family is always a light, however faint, amid the darkness of this world." (Pope Francis)

Isn't that the truth! "Family" is usually among the responses people give to questions about what's important to them. Often, it's at the top of the list and that happens in good times or bad.

Beyond that, the family is viewed as an important component of communities and society, in general.

Pope Francis has said that family life must be rooted in the love of God: "I wish to underline how important it is for families to ask themselves often if they live based on love, for love and in love."

"Only starting from love can the family manifest, spread and regenerate God's love in the world. Without love, we cannot live as children of God, as couples, parents and brothers." He said it means "giving oneself, forgiving, not losing patience, anticipating the other, respecting."

Families also have a major role in building up the Church, the Body of Christ. This is recognized in our archdiocesan plan, "Unleash the Gospel".

A major section in the plan that deals with families says they are "at the very heart of our efforts to unleash the Gospel because they are the first and most important setting in which evangelization takes place."

It continues with: "The family is the 'domestic church'—the primary social unit in which life in Christ, the life of the Church, is experienced and lived."

On this celebration of the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, I would like to share this excerpt from a prayer issued by Pope Francis:

Jesus, Mary and Joseph, in you we contemplate the splendor of true love, to you we turn with trust.


