



Stewardship Thoughts

Today's Scripture readings profess a common theme: God, through His commandments, shepherds us to live fruitful and holy lives. Moses, in the Book of Deuteronomy, clearly expresses how fortunate and blessed the ancient Israelites are to be favored by God as His people. In St. Mark's Gospel, Jesus admonishes the Pharisees and scribes that following strict rituals may actually lead to disregarding the spirit of the commandments themselves. St. James proclaims two important stewardship norms: First, all good giving and every perfect gift is from above. Second, Christian stewards accept and are doers of the Word and not hearers only. They acknowledge God's many blessings and strive to embrace evangelization through Christian stewardship as a way of life. We recognize this by gratefully returning back to God our "first fruits" through prayer, service, and generosity to feed and clothe those in need, shelter the homeless, and visit the sick, elderly, and imprisoned. Christ uses us as His instruments through these Corporal Works of Mercy to spread His hope and peace to everyone we serve. To put Word into action, consider giving generously to your parish St. Vincent de Paul Society or serving at a local soup kitchen.


My Jesus,

"He who sings prays twice"

These words, which are attributed to St Augustine of Hippo, came to my mind this past week as on the calendar we had the memorial of his mother St Monica on Friday, August 27, and his memorial the following

day. I decided to do some digging into the writings of this saint, a Doctor of the Church, who was the most prolific and influential of the Latin Fathers.

St Augustine was born on November 13, 354, in Tagaste, North Africa. He distinguished himself in his youth as a brilliant student, but also led a life of moral degeneracy, pride, stubbornness, and unruliness. This greatly grieved his mother, who unceasingly prayed that he amend his ways and be converted to the faith. In time her prayers were answered; he converted, amended his ways, blossomed into being one of the great saints of the Church, particularly through his writings, and in 1298 was recognized as a Doctor of the Church by Pope Boniface VIII.

About his conversion, St. Augustine wrote:

Belatedly I loved thee, O Beauty so ancient and so new, belatedly I loved thee. For see, thou wast within and I was without, and I sought thee out there. Unlovely, I rushed heedlessly among the lovely things thou hast made. Thou wast with me, but I was not with thee. These things kept me far from thee; even though they were not at all unless they were in thee. Thou didst call and cry aloud, and didst force open my deafness. Thou didst gleam and shine, and didst chase away my blindness. Thou didst breathe fragrant odors and I drew in my breath; and now I pant for thee. I tasted, and now I hunger and thirst. Thou didst touch me, and I burned for thy peace.

He is often quoted as having said "He who sings, prays twice." The Latin cited for this is "Qui bene cantat bis orat" or "He who sings well prays twice". Actually, this does not appear in anything of St. Augustine that has come down to us. What he actually said was:

For he who sings praise, does not only praise, but also praises joyfully; he who sings praise, not only sings, but also loves Him whom he is singing about/to/for. There is a praise-filled public proclamation in the praise of someone who is confessing/acknowledging God; in the song of the lover there is love.

St. Augustine explained hymns in his sermon on Psalm 72 this way:

Hymns are praises offered to God with singing; hymns are songs, with God's praise as their theme ... For there to be a hymn, three elements are required: there must be praise, it must be for God, and it must be sung ... The singer of praise is not only performing musically but showing love for the one who is sung about. To confess God by praise is a way of preaching him; to pour out passion in song is the way of a lover.

Some other words by St. Augustine about music:

Music, that is the science or the sense of proper modulation, is likewise given by God's generosity to mortals having rational souls in order to lead them to higher things.

I feel that our souls are moved to the ardor of piety by the sacred words more piously and powerfully when these words are sung than when they are not sung, and that all the affections of our soul in their variety have modes of their own in song and chant by which they are stirred up by an indescribable and secret sympathy.

Don't let your life give evidence against your tongue. Sing with your voices... sing also with your conduct.

Such riches from this great Doctor of the Church! May our songs be infused with true love and devotion, as St Augustine teaches us, as we enter the fall season.

Regarding the fall season, the goal is to have the Adult Choir begin the evening of Wednesday, September 15, and then after that we'll be getting Caritas up and running as well. (The preceding week will allow me to have a chance to adjust into the routines of having the school in session). We're carefully monitoring the directives regarding singing, choirs, and Covid (and its ever changing landscape and spikes), and how they will guide our moving forward. Thank you for your patience! As because of the pandemic it has been quite some time since the ensembles of the music program have been active, I will be reaching out directly to those who had been involved pre-pandemic, gleaning from the lists and files I have found in the music office and choir room. If you don't hear from me directly then chances are I haven't come across you contact information. 


