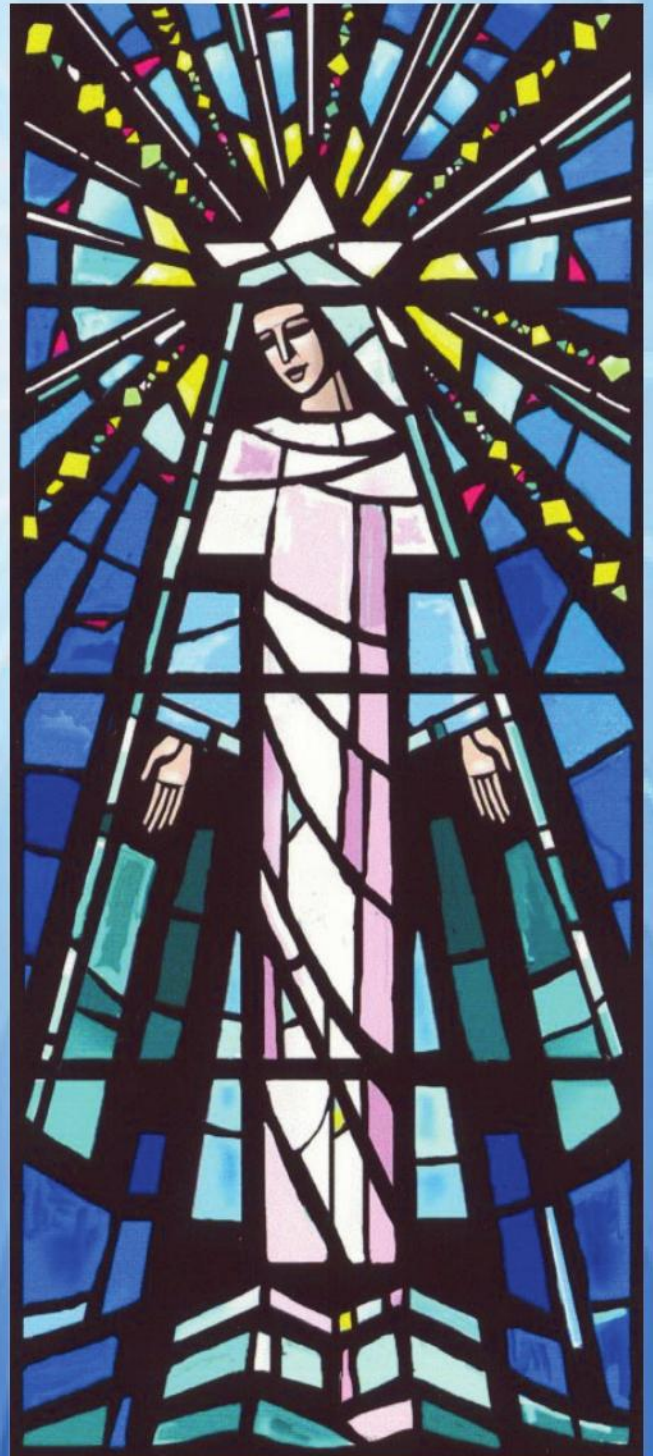

ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. **Adults over 21** need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

**** Next weekend at our Masses, we will be anointing those in need of the Sacrament of the Sick at the Masses. If you, or someone you know, just received a bad diagnosis regarding your health, have advanced to another more serious stage in an illness, is anticipating surgery soon, or just in general poor health, please consider receiving the Sacrament of the Sick. In the “old days” the thought was one would receive the Sacrament only once and hence people would wait as close to the point of death as possible. That is not to be the case anymore! In fact, the Sacrament can be received many times!! Unfortunately, sometimes people wait until a person is so close to death that they then cannot find a priest to immediately come and anoint the person. It is unfortunate because a time could have been scheduled earlier in the day or week when there was more time and less pressure to find a priest and the anointing could have been arranged. However, when there are only minutes or an hour or so before a person passes to find a priest available, a priest most likely may not be free and able to quickly respond to the occasion. So, we encourage people as often as possible to be anointed earlier especially when a priest is available!**

Please call the parish office if you would like to be anointed next weekend. **** Please pray for the priests of the Archdiocese this week as they gather for their Convocation. Bishop Flores, a former auxiliary bishop of the Archdiocese and presently the Bishop of Brownsville, Texas is the main presenter with Bishop Earl Boyea, another former auxiliary of Detroit and presently the Bishop of Lansing, will be the spiritual director. Hence, we will not have morning Mass here at Star of the Sea this Monday through Thursday. Morning Mass will resume on Friday.**

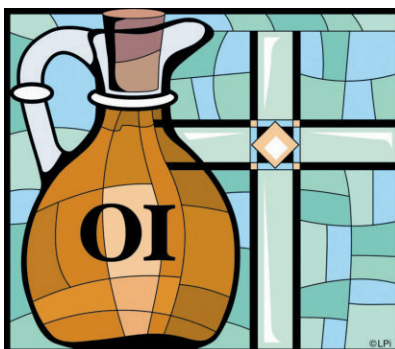

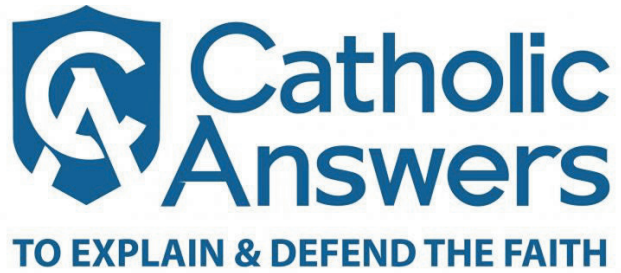

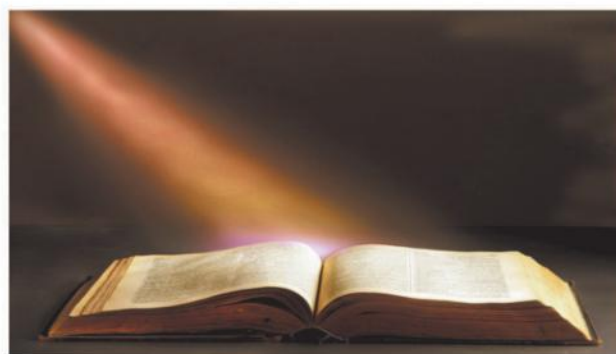

Music Notes from Glenn Miller

Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant... the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve...

Our Gospel reading today concludes with these words, directing us in our thoughts and in our lives to be servants, and how the Son of Man came to serve and give his life. The words “servant” and “serve” are the common thread which bind together our hymns for today.

One has to look deep into our opening hymn, no. 844 in *Ritual Song*, “God Is Here,” to find these words. They are in the second half of the third stanza, after a rather extensive canvas is laid out in the first two stanzas which actually set the stage for how in the third stanza we are “servants of the Servant,” and how what we do in worship is the basis for how we live our daily lives. Fred Pratt Green, the author of this hymn, was an English pastor during latter half of the twentieth century, and it wasn’t until he retired that he began to write hymns prolifically. He wrote this text for a church in Austin, Texas, in 1979 for the closing liturgy of an eight-month festival centering on the themes of worship, music and the arts, so it comes as no surprise that the net he casts with this text is so comprehensive and packed with references to scripture, including I Corinthians 12: 27-31, John 10: 11 and 14, Philippians 2: 7, John 13; 13-17, II Corinthians 4: 5, and Acts 10: 36.

Our presentation hymn, no. 788 in *Ritual Song*, “The Servant Song,” builds directly and immediately on this overriding theme of servanthood. Written in 1977 by English born New Zealander Richard Gillard, it is his most well-known hymn. Our communion hymn, no. 804 in *Ritual Song*, “Unless a Grain of Wheat” takes us even further down the path of servanthood and how ultimately the peace which the world cannot give is given. It was written by another prolific 20th century hymn writer, Bernadette Farrell, an active Catholic layperson who incidentally is connected with the author of our opening hymn, Fred Pratt Green through the foundation that was established in his memory to promote hymnody. With no. 139 in *Ritual Song*, “We Are Called to Serve,” our liturgy is brought to a close, calling us “to be a light amid darkness.” It is written and composed by Julie and Tim Smith, who are music ministers in Phoenix, Arizona.

Looking ahead:

Today (Sunday, October 17) at 7:30 p.m. the Grosse Pointe Symphony opens its season with a concert here at Star. A highlight of the program will be Copland’s *A Lincoln Portrait*, narrated by Msgr Gary Smetanka. Tickets will be available at the door.

The Veterans’ Day musical program has had a change in date. It is now on Friday, November 12, at 7:30 p.m. Watch for more details.

The 20th Anniversary Celebration of the Organ is the following Friday (November 19), also at 7:30 p.m. Performing will be Dr Ronald Prowse, former Director of Music of Sacred Heart Major Seminary; Matt Jakubisin, former Star Music Minister and presently Director of Music at St Andrew’s Cathedral, Grand Rapids, and Glenn Miller, Star Music Minister.

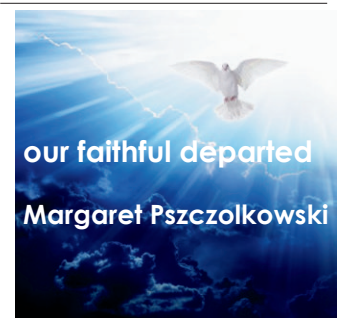
