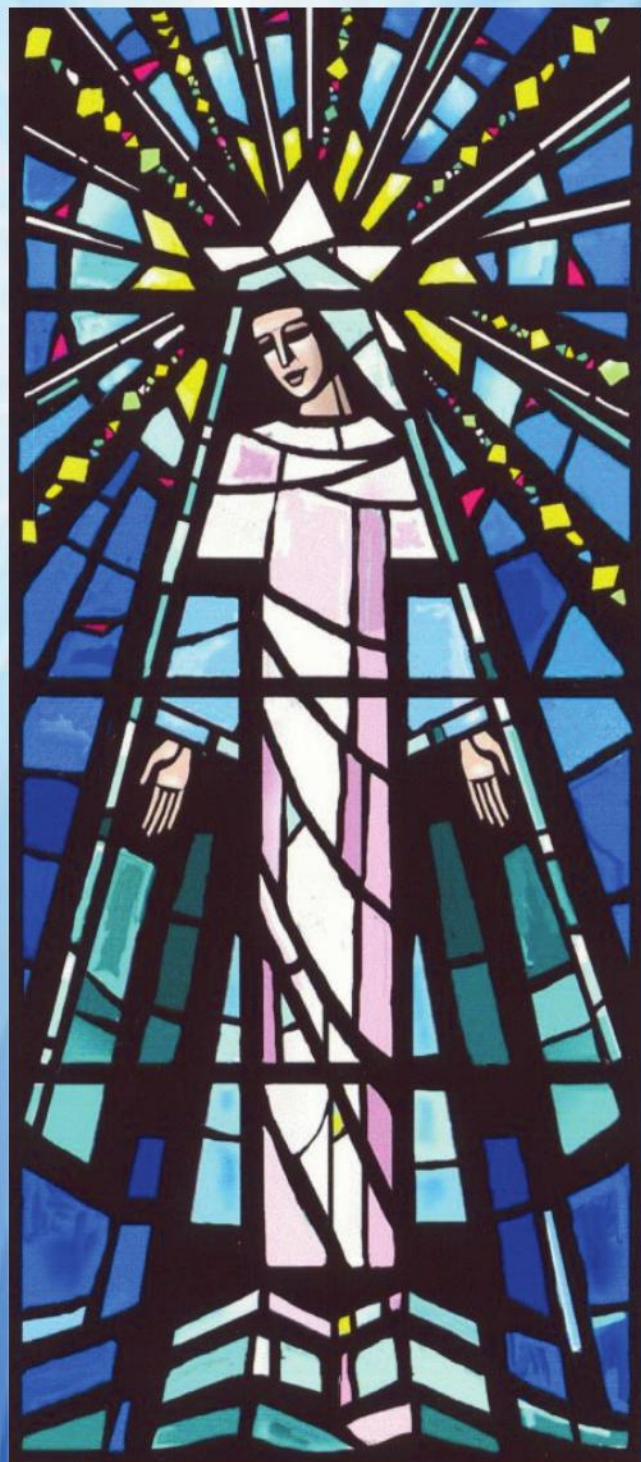

ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes.

Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

Today at our Masses we are taking the opportunity to administer the Sacrament of the Sick (Anointing of the Sick) to those who present themselves to receive this important Sacrament of the Church.

This is a beautiful Sacrament of the Church that can bring so much comfort to those who are in need when they are experiencing a serious illness or a pending surgery.

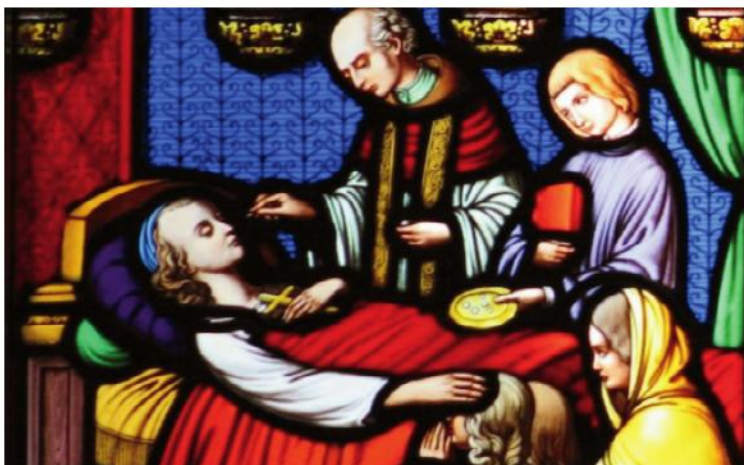
We all know sickness and disease can be frightening to us, separating us from our family or the larger community. We have especially seen this during the past 18 months as covid has not only brought about extreme sickness but also isolation. The purpose of the sacrament, as with all sacraments, is to bring us closer into the life of Christ, into his passion and death but also his resurrection. We no longer wait to anoint someone as close as possible to their death. So in that sense it is not longer referred to as "last rites." It is encouraged to receive the anointing of the sick as soon as one gets a serious illness. In addition, it can be repeated many times in a person's life.

For all those who are sick we pray:

*O God, who willed that our infirmities
be borne by your Only Begotten Son
to show the value of human suffering,
listen in kindness to our prayers
for our brothers and sisters who are sick:
grant that all two are oppressed by pain
distress or other afflictions
may know that they are chosen
among those proclaimed blessed
and are united to Christ
in his suffering for the salvation of the world.
Through our Lord, Jesus Christ, your Son,
who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
God, for ever and ever. Amen.*

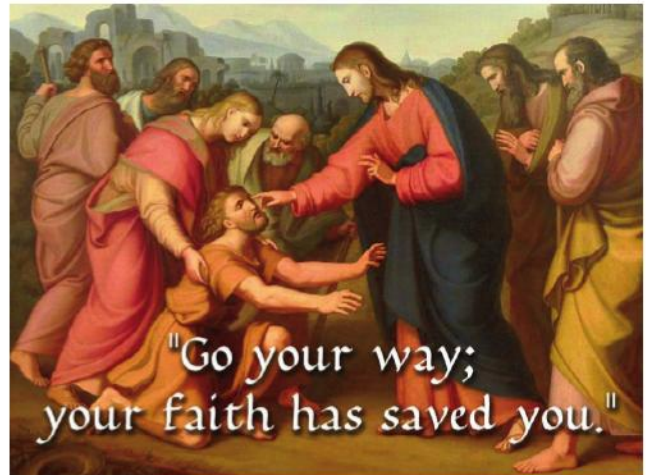

Stewardship Thoughts

In today's Gospel, the evangelist St. Mark tells of Jesus' healing of Bartimaeus when witnessing this blind beggar's faith. He is then moved to discipleship in Christ and follows our Lord on the road. The prophet Jeremiah also narrates the journey and joy of God's deliverance of the ancient Israelites from Babylonian captivity. In the Letter to the Hebrews, the inspired author instructs how God calls men to the priesthood. In our quest for discipleship that begins at our Baptism, do we have the faith and courage to answer God's invitation to our life's vocation? Are we praying for solid families — the "Domestic Church" — that will be the seedbeds for vocations to the priesthood, religious life, permanent diaconate, and lay ministries? Music Notes from Glenn Miller

I once was lost, but now am found, was blind, but now I see...

Without question one of the most well-known hymns across all Christian denominations is our closing hymn this weekend, “Amazing Grace.” It is a perennial favorite at funerals, and most everyone, whether they are Christian or not, knows by heart at the least its first stanza.

Its author, John Newton, was born to a Christian home, but his godly mother died when he was seven, and he joined his father at sea when he was eleven. His licentious and tumultuous sailing life included a flogging for attempted desertion from the Royal Navy and captivity by a slave trader in West Africa. After his escape he himself became captain of a slave ship.

Several factors contributed to Newton’s conversion: a near drowning in 1748, the piety of his friend Mary Catlett (whom he married in 1750), and his reading of Thomas á Kempis’ *Imitation of Christ*. In 1754 he gave up the slave trade and eventually became an ardent abolitionist. After becoming a tide-surveyor in Liverpool, England, he came under the influence of leading clergymen and began to study for the ministry in the Church of England despite his lack of formal education. After his ordination he served one parish for the rest of his life. While “Amazing Grace” is his most well-known hymn, he penned over 280 hymns. In addition to the stanzas in our hymnbook, Newton wrote two additional stanzas:

Yes, when this flesh and heart shall fail,

And mortal life shall cease:

I shall possess, within the veil,

A life of joy and peace.

The earth shall soon dissolve like snow,

The sun forbear to shine;

But God, who called me here below,

Will be forever mine.

Newton wrote his own epitaph, which reads, *John Newton / clerk / once an infidel and libertine / a servant of slaves in Africa / was / by the rich mercy of our Lord and Savior / Jesus Christ / preserved, restored, pardoned / and appointed to preach the faith / he had long labored to destroy.*

The tune actually was not the original tune wedded to this text, but made its first appearance in 1829 and is actually American in origin from the Appalachian hymn tradition, and it is interesting to note that it, like many hymn tunes from Appalachia, is pentatonic, meaning that it only uses five notes of musical scale.

Other notes...

This past Sunday evening the Grosse Pointe Symphony presented a superb concert in the church, their first concert since before the pandemic began. A very large crowd attended, and the joy felt by all to hear live orchestral music again was unquestionably palpable! Msgr inspired all with his narration of Copland’s *A Lincoln Portrait*, words which were gleaned by the composer from speeches and writings by this great American president.

Looking ahead – Friday, November 19, 7:30: A Celebration of the Twentieth Anniversary of the Star Pipe Organ, featuring organists Dr Ronald Prowse, Matt Jakubisan, Glenn Miller, and soprano Angela Theis Kelly. All are welcome, a free-will offering will be received.
