Happy Advent! Happy New (Liturgical) Year! There is always much excitement this time of the year. There is the planning, the shopping, the baking, the different activities and gatherings. Hopefully, in the midst of it all, we can still remember the priorities and reason of the season. Our Advent theme this year is, "Prepare Him room."

It was pointed out on a Catholic radio show recently that Advent is now more "secular." Before it belonged more to Catholics or Christians. Now, you can find "Advent" calendars for dog treats, chocolate, perfume, food, almost anything. (I say "advent" because those are more "counting down the days to Christmas in December" than Advent because those calendars start with Dec. 1 and thereby missing a few days of Advent.) The good news is that more people will realize Christmas begins on Dec. 25 and does not end on Dec. 25!) So the highlighting this time of Advent as a preparation is a good thing in secular society.

Let's try to celebrate the season of Advent this year, even as we naturally combine and blend it with the season of Christmas. Advent is the time to prepare for Christmas. We see the days get shorter and the darkness of the night start sooner. With Christmas, the days get longer and brighter – just as the presence of Christ sheds light in our life. Even as we might put up the tree and decorations around the house, and as we light up the outside of our homes, let us be mindful how we are preparing the Christmas season that begins Dec. 25. Say little prayers as you decorate so that the spirit of peace of Christmas will permeate your heart and enliven your spirit to celebrate the true meaning of Christmas. As you put up the Nativity set in your house, maybe leave the infant out of the manger until Christmas Day. Gather the family around and sing some Advent songs, waiting to sing the Christmas Carols until Christmas. Let Advent be Advent and rejoice with the arrival of Christmas!

A great way to start Advent right is to come **Tuesday night at 7:00 pm** for **Unwrapping Advent.** It will be a time to come to a greater understanding of the season through some music, explanations regarding Advent customs and traditions, and more! We would like to help you understand more about advent and to help you celebrate it well by even providing a little goodie bag! It is a time for the whole family to enjoy!

** I hope you had a good Thanksgiving break with family and friends. Have a grateful heart and see all the good and wonderful things our awesome God has done for us. St. Augustine stressed gratitude as a first step in our faith of God. If we are not filled with gratitude we do not acknowledge God. If we think everyone owes us, that others exist to satisfy me and serve me and we have an entitlement attitude, then we are not acknowledging God and have no need of a Savior! (Something to think about: if we don't believe in the need of a Savior, then there is no need for us to celebrate Christmas, the birth of Christ!)



Music Notes from Glenn Miller

O Come, O Come Emmanuel

With the season of Advent we are gifted with some of the richest and deepest hymns in the repertoire, hymns that give voice to the

deepest yearnings in our lives - the desire by our spirits for the coming of Christ into our world and our souls, all in anticipation of Christmas.

One of the most well-known Advent hymns is "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" (*Ritual Song,* no. 493). It is a very ancient hymn, and dates from the ninth century.

The text actually is based on a series of Advent antiphons (refrains) that were sung at Vespers (the evening worship of the Church) the week prior to Christmas before and after the Magnificat (The Song of Mary, Luke 1: 46-55, *My soul doth magnify the Lord.*) In Vespers the Magnificat is sung after the reading of the Gospel lesson, and symbolically represents the coming of Christ into the world through the Blessed Virgin Mary.

These antiphons are known as the "O" antiphons, simply because they each begin with the word "O," followed by a Biblical title for the Messiah:

- 1. "O Sapientia" O Wisdom (Proverbs 8: 23-31, Sirach 24: 3, Wisdom 8: 1, I Corinthians 1: 24, 30) stanza 2;
- 2. "O Adonai" O Lord (Exodus 3: 2-6, 19: 18-20, Psalm 24: 8), stanza 3;
- 3. "O Radix Jesse" O Root of Jesse (Isaiah 11:10, 52: 15, Romans 15: 12), stanza 4;
- 4. "O Clavis David" O Key of David (Isaiah 22: 22, Revelation 3: 7), stanza 5;
- 5. "O Oriens" O Dayspring (Malachi 4: 2, Isaiah 9: 2, Luke 1: 78-79), stanza 6;
- 6. "O Rex gentium" O King of the nations (Isaiah 28: 16, Jeremiah 10: 7, 10, Haggai
 - 2: 7, Ephesians 2: 14, 20) stanza 7;
- 7. "O Emmanuel" God with us (Isaiah 7: 14, 32: 22, Matthew 1: 23), stanza 1.

What a wealth of scriptural allusions is contained in this hymn!

Interestingly, when the initial letters of each title are read from last to first, they form an acrostic yielding two Latin words: *ero cras*, meaning "I will be tomorrow." In other words, looking back at these Vesper antiphons (refrains) from the perspective of December 23 reveals the promise of the birth to be celebrated the evening of December 24.

The refrain, "Rejoice, rejoice, Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel," was not a part of the O Antiphons but only emerged centuries later. It may be based on Zechariah 2: 10.

The tune sung today to this text, while sounding very ancient, was only first published in the nineteenth century in a French Missal.

Don't worry, we won't be singing this hymn in its entirety in one sitting this weekend, but will nonetheless sing all of the stanzas during the course of the entire Advent season.
