The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

Half and Half from Msgr. Gary Smetanka

Very often throughout the year, people have questions about Mass intentions. This is understandable since there is a variety of ways parishes handle them both in terms of scheduling and announcing. Sometimes there is even confusion on the purpose of the intention or who are they really for.

Mass intentions are solely for the purpose of the priest celebrant. While any person who participates in a Mass can "offer up" that Mass for any good intention, asking a priest to offer the Mass for a specific intention is a long-standing tradition and practice in the Church. The Mass is the greatest possible prayer/intercession because we offer Christ back to God, in the Mass, as we make present the death and resurrection of Jesus during the Mass.

When a priest offers Mass, he has three intentions. First, to offer Mass reverently and according to the norms of the Church. Second, he offers it in union with the whole Church for the whole Church. Finally, he offers it for a particular intention, e.g., a living or deceased person.

There is nothing in law that says any of the intentions need to be publicized or announced. In many situations, the Mass intentions are published or posted in some way. However, they do not need to be announced at Mass since the intention is strictly for the priest. Unfortunately, if Mass intentions are normally announced in some way, every now and then a person mispronounces a name, or it is inadvertently missed, because of human error. Even if that is the case, the fruits of the intention are still applied because of the priest's intention. The bottom line is that the intention is always fulfilled because of the action of the priest, not because of any announcement, or how many people know of the intention, or whether or not anybody else in church prays for that intention.

Most of the Mass intentions received in a parish are for deceased loved ones. It is right and good that we offer such Masses for the deceased and their happy repose in the heavenly kingdom. Each Sunday, a pastor of the parish is also required to offer one Mass for the living and deceased members of the parish.

Mass intentions may be offered for the living, maybe because they are sick or for another reason. In recent time, I have become aware that some people don't want a Mass intention, especially if it is announced or published in some way, because people generally think they must be terribly sick and hence don't want people calling them! So, please, if you hear a Mass intention for a living person, don't immediately assume it is something bad but simply join in the prayer for the person, whatever the reason! We all need the prayers and thanks be to God those who gift us with the spiritual benefits of a Mass being offered in our name!

Some people wonder if they need to be present for the Mass that is being offered for their loved one. No, you don't. That is the wonderful aspect of Masses being offered even in distant lands! The benefits are priceless and all we have to do is thank the Lord!

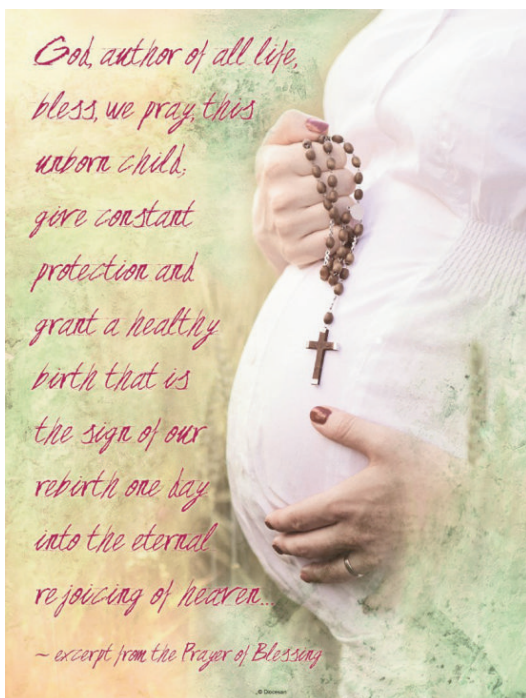

Music Notes from Glenn Miller

Recently a couple of inspiring messages came my way on social media about singing and choral and congregational singing. The first is by an anonymous author, and the second is by St. Ignatius of Antioch. I hope they inspire and encourage you as we together gather and lift our voices in worship.

I Go and Sing

*I might be exhausted and the children might be cranky,
but I will be going to church on Sunday.*

*I get up, get clean, get dressed, possibly get mad
(at not-ready kids, at the empty coffee pot, at the traffic).*

I get going, get there, get seated, get comfortable, get focused.

When I enter the church I kneel and pray.

The music starts, I feel God's presence.

The time comes to sing.

*I don't have much of a voice at all, but do the best I can
to unite myself with all gathered in this assembly.*

*It's the willingness to stand if you are able,
the common agreement on page number,
the voluntary sharing of hymnbooks with people on your row,
even ones you rode there with.*

*But most of all, it's the collective in-breath before the first sound is made,
the collective drawing upon the grace of God,
the collective, if inadvertent, admission that we are all human, all fragile,
all in need of the sustaining air, freely dispensed,
all in need of each other to get the key right and not sound discordant —
it's the hidden life-celebration in the act of making a joyful noise, all together.*

We don't even have to sound that good.

*Singing together still brings home the we-ness of worship,
the not-alone-ness of life in God, the best of all we have to offer each other.*

*When we are singing, I think that I might actually be able to forgive you
for being so terribly human, and you might be able to forgive me
for being so terribly not there yet, and we might be able to find peace now,
not postpone it for some heavenly hereafter*

*but live and breathe it today, drawing in the grace of God,
voicing out our need and hope and gratitude and longing.*

*When we are singing, I can feel the better world coming,
and if I get to be a part of it, you do too . . . so sing with me,
and we'll make our way down that blessed road together,
collectively better than we ever thought possible. (anonymous)*

Everyone of you should form a choir, so that in harmony of sound through harmony of hearts, and in unity taking the note from God, you may sing with one voice through Jesus Christ to the Father. If you do this, he will listen to you and see from your good works that you are members of His Son. It is then an advantage to you to live in perfect unity, so that at all times you may share in God. 
