



The shared topic in today's Scripture readings is one of prophets and prophecy. From his consecration in the womb, the prophet Jeremiah is summoned to prophecy to the nations. In St. Luke's Gospel, Jesus professes that the messianic prophecy from Isaiah is completed in Him; enraged, His hometown community rejects His message. St. Paul confirms to the Corinthian community (see: long version) that prophecy given as a gift is ineffective unless done with love. Are we, as Christian stewards, listening to Jesus as prophet through His teachings of Truth? Through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, do we have the courage to defend, with love, the Church's stance against abortion, euthanasia, same-sex unions, and other moral challenges presented by today's secular culture? Some thoughts about hymn singing

Recently an article about hymn singing came across my desk containing plenty of practical tips for everyone – both singers and those who would classify themselves

as being non-singers.

The psalmist reminds and commends us to "sing unto the Lord," and St Paul likewise extols us to "sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, singing and making melody to the Lord in our hearts, giving thanks to God the Father at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." References to singing around the heavenly throne in the book of Revelation abound; our singing in worship at Mass unites us with the saints and angels worshipping the Lord in heaven and with the faithful across thousands of years, so regardless of one's individual skills and abilities, joining in the singing of the hymns and liturgy gives glory and honor to the Lord and unites us all in community.

There was certainly a time when group singing was very much a part of life, back in the days when it was simply something one did in the home for entertainment with their families, with all gathered around the piano, long before the days of television and social media. Those days are long past, so when it comes to singing in church there is naturally a sense of discomfort and self-consciousness that is keenly felt..

These helpful hints were written by Helen Kemp, who was regarded as the foremost leader in the children's choir movement of the twentieth century in the United States. She and her husband John served for many years on the church music faculty at Westminster Choir College, in addition to their work as ministers of music in leading churches. They also served as directors of Choristers' Guild, a national organization dedicated to the training of church musicians and the fostering of church music programs on a practical level.

Hints for hearty hymn singing - How to beat the hymn singing blahs

While you are preparing yourself for worship, look at the hymn number boards and bulletin with expectation. Anticipate being a participant in the drama. Be ready for the opening hymn. Be involved! Pay attention! Be engaged!

When you are preparing for worship, read and pray the hymn texts and ask yourself why it was chosen – praise? season of the Christian year? Scripture connection? homily? Every hymn that is chosen has been chosen for a reason.

If you don't read music, take a guess at the tune by the ups and downs of the notes. Imagine the sounds.

While the hymn is being introduced by the organist, get into a "readiness" attitude for standing and singing. Lead the crowd with your attention and eagerness! Not to worry if your pew partners don't make it until the fourth or fifth word.

Hold the hymnal so that the top of the book is about shoulder height, and at least twelve inches in front of your face. This way the sound of your voice can sail over the book instead of falling limply to the floor. (The distance from your face is adjustable according to your latest eyeglass prescription.)

If you have to "fall out" to recover after a real vocal challenge, don't just stand there feeling guilty – read the text silently as the assembly is singing. Many of our hymns (not all) are truly great poetry and statements of faith that can be appreciated without a tune.

Be aware of the various sounds the organist is using to accompany the singing. If the text is one of praise, the organist will use the more jubilant and vibrant sounds of the organ; if the text is more prayerful and meditative, the sounds will reflect this. The organ is actually an orchestra played by one person, and its job is to encourage and support the congregation in singing, not to overwhelm.

Make sure you take in good, deep breath before you sing, as your breath is the fuel that makes your voice work. The high the notes, the deeper your breath needs to be.

Don't be afraid – put your whole heart into your singing, put on an inside smile, and go for it with divine courage! Everyone has a voice!

The hymns are for you, the congregation. To make a joyful noise is your special assignment, your important part in the drama of worship. You might be surprised at how beautiful that can be. Use the talents you possess, for the world would be very silent if no bird sang except the best. Let all that hath life and breath sing praise to the Lord!


