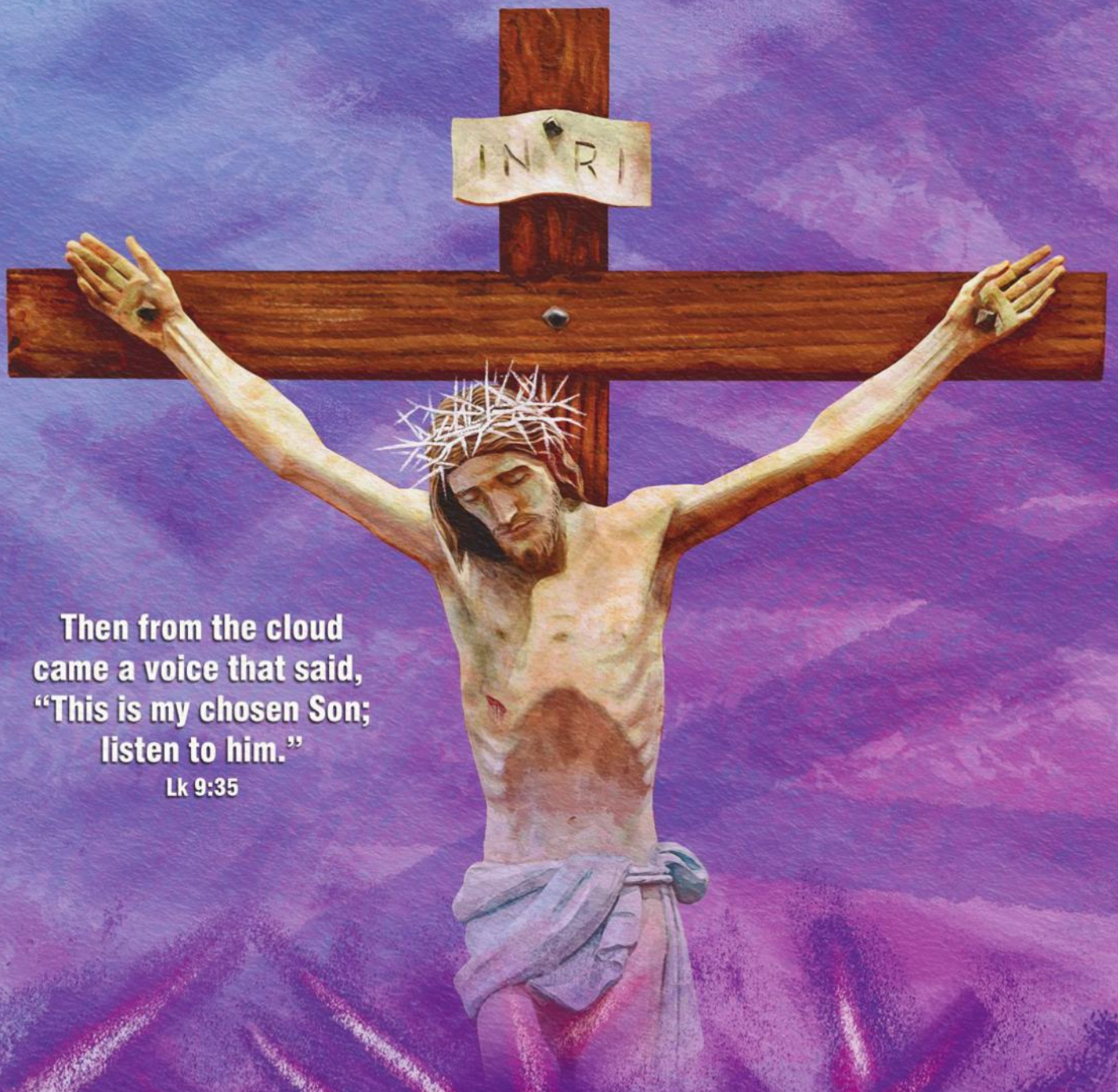

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Half and Half from Msgr. Gary Smetanka

Please mark your calendar for our **Parish Retreat Night**, Tuesday, March 22 (that is a week from this Tuesday) at 6:30 pm, a time that even the children in the family can come with the parents. I know I am looking forward to it because of the two presenters, Michael King and Tom Clark. Many of you might remember Michael when he was our Director of Religious Education a few years back. He has a well grounded experience in theology and family life and ministry, drawing many into a deeper understanding of God's amazing love in our life. Tom would often be invited by Michael over the years to enrich his talks to the children and youth, One of Tom's many gifts is his musical ability (guitar) especially in terms of drawing people deeper in prayer and encountering the Lord through music and song. The two of them are a real dynamic duo!

The focus of the 75 minute retreat (just so you know it will not last *all evening*) is: He walks with me. This coincidentally enough, is our overall theme for this lent. How often we feel isolated and alone, disconnected from people and the larger community, So many people experience this perhaps more so now in the past two years than our memory. So it is time to be reconnected!! It will also be a good opportunity to be reconnected with the Lord in His sacramental presence, through our brief period of time with the Blessed Sacrament. Again, over the past few years, more people have put the Eucharist, the living presence of Jesus Christ in our life, to the side, replacing Him with other busy activities that are not essential nor the path to gain eternal salvation. So this parish retreat night can be a good first step to come back home, come back to basics, come back to encounter the Lord is a special way.

Please put in on your schedule and make it a priority, just 75 minutes, that can truly make a difference in your life!

** Thank you for your participation in our Fish Fry! A good number of volunteers turned out for our first fish fry and thank goodness for that because we broke a record with serving 267 dinners. After a two year absence, we didn't know what to expect and we did our best to "oil" the machinery! We know there were a few glitches due to the unexpected large number and some new and different procedures that had to be instituted. Overall it was a good night and we were certainly kept running and busy in doing our best. Come and give us a try some Friday night with the best parish fish fry in Grosse Pointe!!

** You can also save the date for *next Thursday, March 24* for our "Taize Prayer." We have done this type of prayer for the past number of years, and it is popular in many communities. It is a simple prayer, usually focused on one item (like a cross) in an environment of peace and calm. The music is simple to sing and repeated, like a mantra, to help us really focus on the words. That is next Thursday at 7 pm!

Be a blessing to others this week and help them see that are beloved children of God!

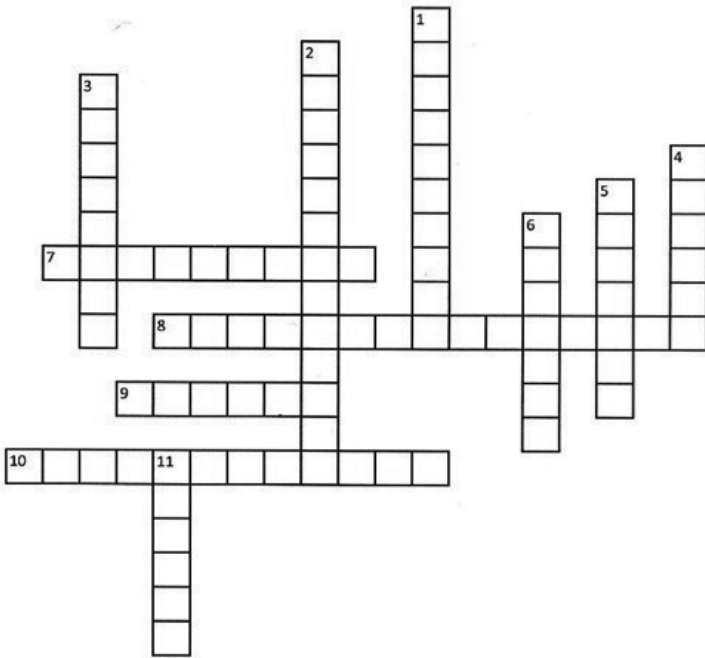

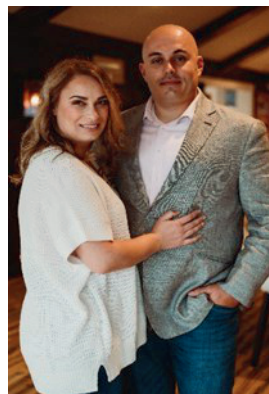

Music Notes from Glenn Miller

About today's hymns

Our opening hymn, "Transform Us," (*Ritual Song*, no. 881) was inspired by today's Gospel lesson. Its author, Sylvia Dunstan, a Canadian hymn writer who was also active in prison ministry and as the editor of a worship resource journal. The tune, *Picardy*, is a French folk melody.

Our preparation hymn, "'Tis Good, Lord, to Be Here," (*Ritual Song*, no. 882) is based on today's Gospel lesson. Our communion hymn, "Take and Eat," (*Ritual Song*, no. 910) was written by James Quinn, SJ, a twentieth century Scottish priest, theologian, and hymnodist who was also in ecumenical affairs.

Our closing hymn, "Christ, Be Our Light," (*Spirit Song*, no. 105) was written in 1993 for the dedication of St. Gabriel's Church in north London, England. Something was needed that could be sung in semidarkness, because initially only the paschal candle would be burning. During the singing of this hymn light would be spread around the church as individual candles were lit. Scriptural allusions in the verses of this hymn include Matthew 5: 14, I Peter 2: 5, John 13: 14-15, Matthew 6:10, Luke 11: 2; and the refrain is based on John 1: 1-9, John 8: 12, and John 9: 5. This hymn's author and composer, Bernadette Farrell, is a British hymnographer and composer of Catholic liturgical music. In addition to her musical activities, she was active in adult education, training persons on the seminary level in lay liturgical ministries, and also was active as a community organizer in regards to immigration, safety, sanctuary, health care.
