Half and Half from Msgr. Gary Smetanka

This Tuesday evening, from 6:30 -7:45, in the church, we have a wonderful opportunity to pause for 75 minutes (not long at all) to get reconnected! We know during the past two years we have lost our connectivity with members of our family, our local community, and perhaps even our Lord! It seems many more people have reconnected with family and friends as they get together for meals, sports, and other activities. Unfortunately, many have not reconnected with their faith and our Lord. They have taken the Covid pause in church and extended it beyond its reach.

Tuesday night is a prime opportunity to get reconnected in many ways but especially with the Lord. We often forget how the Lord accompanies us on our journey of life, in the good times and especially the challenging times. When we think the Lord is not listening to us, we might forget He *is* answering our prayers. Just because we are not getting what we want does not mean He is not answering our prayers. He always walks with us on our journeys!

If you feel isolated due to Covid or any reason, come and get reconnected. If you have been holding back or have gotten too comfortable thinking it is okay to stay home instead of participating in Sunday Mass, get reconnected this Tuesday with the Lord. The evening is geared for the whole family, all ages, all walks of life, all situations in life!

Our former Directory of religious education, Michael King, and pastoral and retreat musician, Tom Clark, will lead us back to the Lord, the source of life, the healer of souls, and source of all blessing. If you have not done anything special this Lent, come Tuesday and open your heart to the Lord and the power of the Holy Spirit! Jesus walks with us with purpose—because of His unconditional and abundant love!

**** If you can't come Tuesday, or even in addition to Tuesday evening, this Thursday is our Lent "Taize Prayer."** We have done this type of prayer for the past number of years, and it is popular in many communities. It is a simple prayer, usually focused on one item (like a cross) in an environment of peace and calm. The music is simple to sing and repeated, like a mantra, to help us really focus on the words. That is Thursday at 7 pm.

**** Many additional times to participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, aka "confession," will be available here at Star and in our neighboring parishes, especially beginning next week.** This is another example of the Lord walking with us as we open our sinful hearts to God and receive his mercy.

Be a blessing to others this week and help them see that are beloved children of God!

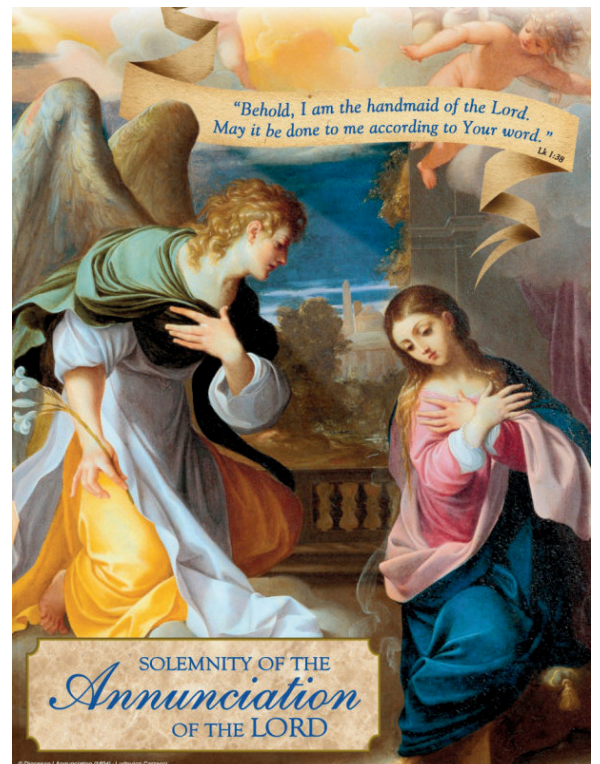

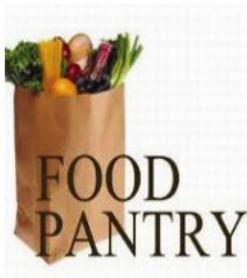

In today's Scripture readings, from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians and St. Luke's Gospel, a theme of repentance emerges. St. Paul advises the Corinthian community to not repeat the sinful ways of their ancestors in the wilderness with Moses. Due to their evil actions and refusal to repent, many of the ancient Israelites did not reach the Promised Land. In the Gospel, Jesus is very clear about the need for repentance. We can be assured that God extends compassion, mercy, and patience to sinners, but Jesus warns us in His parable of the fig tree, a "tree" that fails to produce the fruit of repentance is cut down. Music Notes from Glenn Miller

About today's hymns

Our opening hymn, "Lift High the Cross" (*Ritual Song*, 884) was written in 1887 for use at a Society for the Propagation of the Gospel Festival in Winchester Cathedral, England. In its original form it consists of twelve (!) stanzas and was sung as a processional hymn around the entire cathedral, whose nave (the area where the assembled people sit) is the longest in England, which may explain why it was necessary to have twelve stanzas. The hymn was enjoyed immediate popularity in England, but it wasn't until the latter part of the twentieth century that it found its way to the United States. The text is rich in biblical and baptismal imagery. Its tune name, *Crucifer*, is both literal and figurative. In the former sense, its Latin meaning, "cross bearer," applies to the person leading the procession with a processional cross. But the term also applies more generally, as the third stanza reminds, to all Christians, who bear the cross by virtue of their baptism and whenever one make the sign of the Cross.

Our communion hymn, "In This Place" (*Spirit Song*, 122) is by Trevor Thomson, a contemporary Catholic musician and composer. He has worked as associate Director of Worship for the Diocese of Phoenix and has directed music and liturgy in parishes in Arizona and California, where he now presently resides. "In This Place" is one of his most popular songs.

Our closing hymn, "We are Called to Serve" (*Spirit Song*, 139) was composed and written by Julie and Tim Smith, who are active in music ministry in the Diocese of Phoenix.

The Star Choir is now beginning rehearsals for the Holy Week and Easter liturgies. Do you like to sing, but cannot commit to being in the choir on a regular weekly basis but can possibly sing for a limited time? Perhaps joining the choir for Holy Week and Easter is a possibility for you. The Choir enjoys great fellowship and community and works diligently in its preparations for leading music in worship. The Choir rehearses Wednesday evenings from 7:30 to 9:00 p.m. Feel free to contact Star Music Minister Glenn Miller (g.miller@stargp.org) to learn more about the Choir.
