Half and Half from Msgr. Gary Smetanka

On this Second Sunday of Easter, also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. It was Saint Pope John Paul II that assigned the title "Divine Mercy Sunday" to the Second Sunday of Easter. He personally knew Saint Faustina, the religious sister in Poland to whom Our Lord appeared under the title of Divine Mercy. Saint John Paul II shared in the special devotion of St. Faustina and was the one who helped promote her canonization. How amazing and appropriate that he died the evening before the liturgical celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday in 2005.

The image of Divine Mercy, i.e., a depiction of Christ with red and white rays emanating from his heart, is on display by our Easter cross however you usually find it the rest of the year by our confessional. .

Jesus wants us to know of his great mercy but we need to place our trust in him. Today we need to know of Christ's mercy more than ever. We see many divisions, conflicts, with so many people searching for peace in life. We need to know that it is in Jesus that we find shelter and refuge. Especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we find an abundance of Christ's mercy freely given for us. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, so often talks about our need to open up our hearts to receive the Lord's mercy and to share it with others!

** Thanks to everyone who gave Easter Memorials or Thanksgivings. Thanks to you, we should enjoy the floral abundance of Easter throughout the whole season!

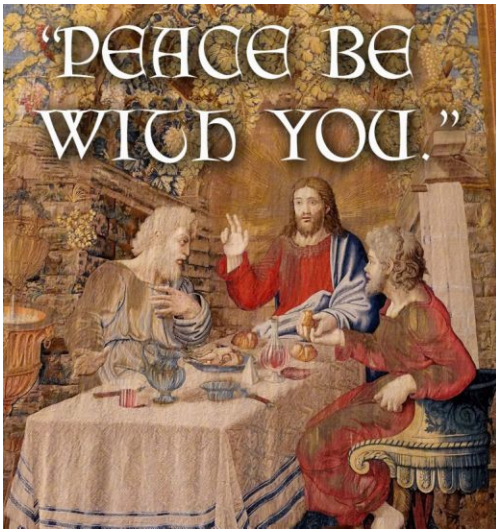

It is a two year preparation process for these 8th graders and they always look forward to this big day. Of course they know it is not the end or any type of graduation from faith formation but now only the beginning of their own commitment to be steadfast in the living of the faith in word and action. Next Sunday, May 1, we have the celebration of First Eucharist for your younger brothers and sisters. Always a big day for them and their families as well. Let us offer some extra prayers and sacrifices this week for all of them!

Music Notes from Glenn Miller

About today's hymns

Our opening hymn, **That Easter Day with joy was bright** (*Ritual Song*, 599) is a translation of a fifth century Latin hymn, "Claro paschali gaudio." It is one of the earliest hymns written for a particular season of the

church year. In its full form it begins with the visit of the women to the tomb and the angel's message reported to the disciples as well as with Christ's appearance to them as recorded in today's Gospel lesson. The tune is of German origin and was first published in 1568. Its arranger, Michael Praetorius, was a German organist, theorist, and one of the most versatile composers of his time, known especially for his arrangements of hymns.

Our preparation hymn, **We walk by faith** (*Ritual Song*, 723) was written specifically as a hymn for the feast of St. Thomas the Apostle (December 21) and is based on the Gospel for that day, John 20: 19-31, which is also our Gospel for today. Besides the Gospel narrative, several other biblical allusions occur: 2 Corinthians 5: 7, Mark 9: 24, and Isaiah 55: 6. The hymn was written by Henry Alford in 1844. Alford was priest in the Church of England, and his career culminated in being dean of Canterbury Cathedral. At the age of six he wrote a life of Paul and at ten a pamphlet, "Looking Unto Jesus the Believers' Support Under Trials and Afflictions." At the age of eleven he compiled his first hymnbook and openly dedicated his life to God on the flyleaf of his Bible at the age of sixteen: "I do this day, in the presence of God and my own soul, renew my covenant with God, and solemnly determine henceforth to become his, and to do his work as far as in me lies." While his literary efforts extend to poetry and hymn writing, he was best known for his Greek scholarship, laboring for twenty years to produce a four-volume edition of the Greek Testament, which became a standard critical commentary. The tune is by the well-known contemporary American composer of liturgical music, Marty Haugen. In addition to composing hymns, Haugen has composed settings of the Mass and also psalm settings, including today's psalm setting.

Our communion hymn, **O Sons and Daughters** (*Ritual Song*, 579) was written by Jean Tisserand, a fifteenth-century Franciscan monk in Paris. Tisserand was a preaching friar who founded an order for penitent women. The text actually is in two parts, with the stanzas one through three for Easter Day and stanzas four through nine (based on our Gospel lesson) for the Second Sunday of Easter. It is very likely that this melody is the original tune for this text.

Our closing hymn, **Worthy Is the Lamb** (*Spirit Song*, 116) is based on Revelation 5: 9-14, and was written and composed by Fr. Ricky Manalo. Manalo was recipient of the 2018 Pastoral Musician of the Year Award by the National Association of Pastoral Musicians. He studied composition and piano at the Manhattan School of Music, theology at the Washington Theological Union, and liturgy, culture, and sociology at the Graduate Theological Union, Berkeley. His music has been sung during Papal Masses of John Paul II, Benedict XVI, and Francis. Most recently his *Mass of Spirit and Grace* was the musical setting for Pope Francis' Eucharistic celebration in the Sheikh Zayed Stadium in Abu Dhabi in 2019, an event which was the largest gathering of Christians in the history of the Arab Peninsula, with 160,000+ worshippers, and was the first time a Roman Catholic Mass was ever celebrated in public in this region. He has been invited to six of the seven continents to lecture, preach, and give concerts. When he is not traveling throughout the world, he is based at St. Paul the Apostle Church, New York City.

Stewardship Thoughts

Today’s Scripture readings narrate the Apostles’ actions after Christ’s Resurrection. In the Acts of the Apostles, Peter shows compassion when he heals the sick, which results in a number of conversions to Christ. In the Book of Revelation, John, detained on the island of Patmos for his witness to Jesus, describes to Christ’s followers his heavenly vision, encouraging them to keep the faith. In St. John’s Gospel, the evangelist retells of Jesus’ appearances after His Resurrection to the Apostles on consecutive Sundays. They are jubilant; Thomas indicates he now believes in Christ risen by proclaiming: *My Lord and my God!* Jesus breathes the Holy Spirit upon them and gives them the authority to forgive sins. Beginning with our Baptism, we, too, are called to discipleship in the Lord. As Christian stewards, we strive to express this discipleship through our sharing in prayer, service, and generosity with our parish and our brothers and sisters in need. Today, on Divine Mercy Sunday, learn to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet on your rosary.

Stop the Abortion Amendment!

A committee called Reproductive Freedom for All is working to amend the Michigan Constitution. Led by Planned Parenthood and the ACLU, this committee's amendment would create a new unlimited and unregulated right to abortion in our state.

This radical proposal is not about reproductive freedom, which already exists. This poorly-worded amendment would repeal dozens of state laws, including laws unrelated to abortion. It could affect any law related to pregnancy and abortion and does not exempt minor children.

The following state laws are at risk:

- Parental consent for abortion
- Ban on school employees helping children have abortions
- Laws requiring parental consent for medical treatment related to pregnancy, including sterilizations and hormone therapy
- Late-term abortion bans
- Screening for women being coerced to have abortion
- Health and safety requirements for abortion facilities
- Requirement that only doctors perform abortion
- Conscience protections for doctors/nurses who object to abortions
- Ban on tax-funded abortions
- Michigan's original 1846 and revised 1931 abortion ban
- Bans on statutory rape and incest
- Prostitution ban
- Ban on human cloning

Use an ordinary rosary.

1. Make the *Sign of the Cross*
2. Pray an *Our Father*, *Hail Mary* and *The Apostles' Creed*
3. On the *Our Father* beads say:
Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.
4. On the *Hail Mary* beads say:
For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.
5. Repeat for the five decades.
6. Conclude by repeating this prayer 3 times:
Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

"Adore, in the Blessed Sacrament, My Heart, which is full of mercy" (Words of Jesus to St. Maria Faustina of the Blessed Sacrament, *Divine Mercy in My Soul*, 1572).

"My Heart overflows with great mercy for souls, and especially for poor sinners. If only they could understand that I am the best of Fathers to them and that it is for them that the Blood and Water flowed from a fount overflowing with mercy. For them I dwell in the tabernacle as King of Mercy. I desire to bestow My graces upon souls, but they do not want to accept them. You, at least, come to Me as often as possible and take these graces they do not want to accept. In this way you will console My heart" (ibid, 367).

Make a personal commitment of a day to pray in His Eucharistic presence in the Adoration Chapel.

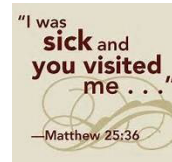
