Half and Half from Msgr. Gary Smetanka

Last Saturday, on the Vigil of Pentecost, we began a **Year of Prayer for Priestly Vocations**. It began at our Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament gathered around Archbishop Vigneron at a Eucharistic Holy Hour. It began at the same time we normally gather to celebrate the ordination of men to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Detroit. However, this year, there are no men to be ordained to the priesthood.

This is the first time in 70 years we do not have an ordination to the priesthood.

Unfortunately, we are not often impacted by the shortage of priests.

Mass is available and Anointing of the Sick is available. There have been various times here at Star that people have been impacted with no available priests. If and when it does happen it is not that much of a hardship because there is another Catholic Church about two miles away in any direction you want to go. (That is much better than in the parts in the diocese when the neighboring parish couple be a 20 minute drive.). Our movement toward Family of Parishes, beginning July 1, is one answer for the Archdiocese of Detroit to ease the priest shortage by having a team of priests minister to to a group or "family" of parishes.

Archbishop Vigneron has written a "Pastoral Note" regarding this situation and calling for this year of prayer for vocations. (It can be found on page 4 of this bulletin and also on the Archdiocese website, aod.org.) the Archbishop makes it clear that God has not ceased calling men to the priesthood. It is just it might be a bit more difficult to hear the call today with all the world's distractions. In addition, some men are actually discouraged to follow the call by the parents, family members or friends. God is still calling...more need to hear the call and be encouraged to follow it!

The Archbishop offers some ways we can all together join in the year of prayer for priestly vocations. First, to pray the prayer for priestly vocations that is specific to this year of prayer. Second, to participate in Holy Hours here or in surrounding parishes to prayer for this increase in priestly vocations. Third, sacrifice through fasting or abstaining from meats on the First Friday of every month in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Fourth, pray the Luminous Masteries of the Rosary for priestly vocations. [We pray the Luminous mysteries every Thursday evening, weather permitting, during the summer, at our Rosary Garden on Morningside at 7:30 pm. Maybe you can join us with this intention??]

** With more schools getting out for the summer break, careful driving around the neighborhoods and please watch for children playing!

** Huge congratulations to Mrs. Kelly Fortier, our 6th grade teacher. She was selected as the Bishop John Quinn Outstanding Elementary School Teacher of the year 2021-2022 by the Archdiocese of Detroit! She certainly is very deserving of this award!

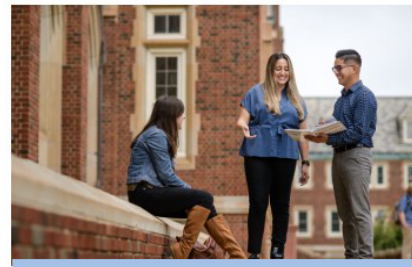
For St. Charles Lwanga and its pastor, Fr. Parker, a century of faith is worth celebrating

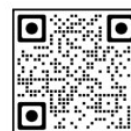

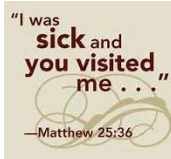
