The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Half and Half from Msgr. Gary Smetanka

“It is only because God himself is the eternal dialogue of love that he can speak and be spoken to. Only because he himself is relationship can we relate to him; only because he is love can he love and be loved in return. Only because he is threefold can he be the grain of wheat which dies and the bread of eternal life. Ultimately, then, Corpus Christi is an expression of faith in God, in love, in the fact that God is love. All that is said and done on Corpus Christi is in fact a single variation on the theme of love, what it is and what it does. In one of his Corpus Christi hymns Thomas Aquinas put it beautifully, *nec sumptus consumitur* – love does not consume: it gives and, in giving, receives. And in giving it is not used up but renews itself. Since Corpus Christ is a confession of faith in love, it is totally appropriate that the day should focus on the mystery of transubstantiation. Love is transubstantiation, transformation. Corpus Christi tells us: Yes, there is such a thing as love, and therefore there is transformation, therefore there is hope. And hope gives us the strength to live and face the world. Perhaps it was good to have experienced doubts about the meaning of celebrating Corpus Christi, for it has led us to the rediscovery of a feast which, today, we need more than ever.” [Pope Benedict XVI]

These words, though maybe a little “heavy,” remind us again of the significance of this feast today as we celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ. We certainly need to rediscover not only this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, the official title of this day commonly referred to as *Corpus Christi*, but more importantly, the significance of the Eucharist and the celebration of the Mass. The celebration of the Mass is truly awesome indeed and maybe, ultimately, too mind boggling for us! But the Church gives us the celebration of Mass and the Eucharist so we can encounter Christ in our daily life and then be transformed into that image and presence of Christ in the world around us. The readings and homily are meant to point how the Word of God we hear at Mass is being encountered by us and is alive indeed in the midst of our lives as we hear it! With hearts of gratitude for that presence and action of God in our midst, we then offer that sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, i.e., Jesus in the Eucharist. Jesus then becomes food for our daily journey so we can be Christ to others in our daily life!

On this day, may we take the opportunity to be renewed by the mystery of the Eucharist and all that it teaches us, especially how to live our life. May we be renewed to spend time with the Lord, in private prayer, in adoration before the Tabernacle or during Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. May we be especially renewed in our commitment to celebrate the Eucharist each, and every, Sunday, with our families, and allow the depths of what we celebrate transform us in our daily life. Reflecting on the dying of rising of Jesus at every Mass helps us to die and rise every day as well, with Jesus alongside us, walking with us, and guiding us to life.

Last November the US Catholic Bishops decided to embark upon a three year process of Eucharistic Renewal. Some of the focus this year is on Eucharistic Processions and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament outside the celebration of the Mass. These devotionals remind us of our belief in the living presence of Jesus in the consecrated hosts after our celebration of Mass is over. (It is from these reserved hosts that we bring Holy Communion to the sick and the dying.) More information on this renewal in the weeks and months ahead.

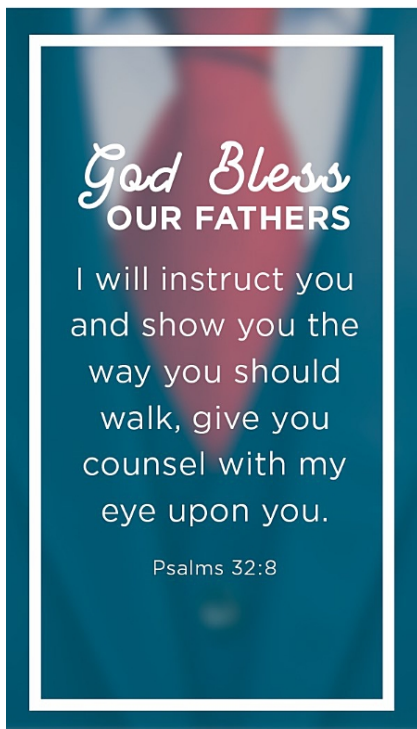
****Happy Fathers' Day to all you dads!!**

Stewardship Thoughts

The Eucharist is a fitting theme for today's Scripture readings. In the Book of Genesis, we learn that the priest and ruler of Salem, Melchizedek, brings out bread and wine to share with Abram (later Abraham). St. Paul, in his First Letter to the Corinthian community, describes Jesus' institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. In his Gospel, the evangelist St. Luke retells of Christ's miraculous healing of the sick and feeding the 5,000. At every Mass, through the power of the Holy Spirit, the priest consecrates common bread and wine into the true Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ for the forgiving of sins and strengthening in holiness. As faith-filled partakers, we are in complete awe of this tremendous gift and, in heartfelt gratitude, let us give back to God a generous portion of our many gifts to our parish and to those in need. On this Solemnity, participate in the Eucharistic celebration of the Mass, partake of Holy Communion, and spend time in Eucharistic Adoration.

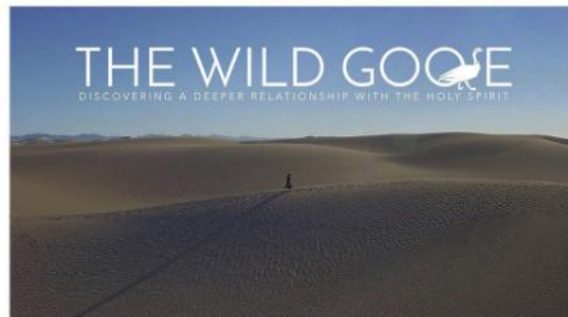

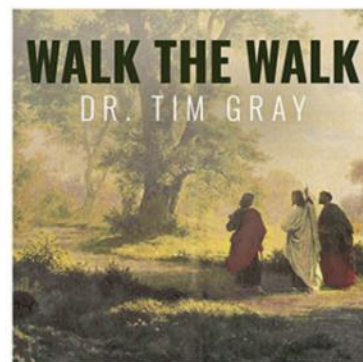

Mission Appeal - The ministry of Polish Redemptorists in the East

Dear Parishioners

The Missionary Cooperation Plan helps to spread the gospel, build churches and communities around the world. This year I invite you to support the missionary work of Polish Redemptorists-Mission in Russia. We are working in the former Soviet Union for 30 years. At present, we have five pastoral centers in Russia, one in Kazakhstan, five in Belarus, and two in Ukraine.

This is an unpresidential time and we need to stand firm for peace working together to bridge the chasm created by war. The Polish Redemptorists with your help will be able to do so in a more efficient way. The COVID-19 pandemic held us back, but as a people of faith we look forward to the future believing that the best is still ahead of us.

As you can imagine, dealing with the aftermath of the war (helping refugees from Ukraine) and continuing to build much needed churches in Togliatti and Minsk is not an easy task.

Currently, over 200 Ukrainian refugees found shelter in our Redemptorists communities and parishes in Poland. You can only imagine how challenging must be the work of our fellow priests in Russia and Belarus. That's why your prayers and support are so much appreciated.

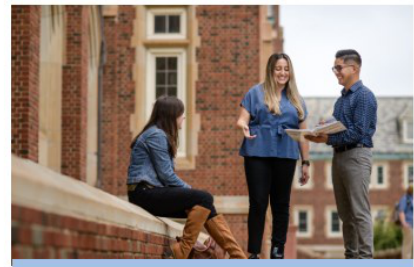

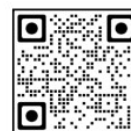

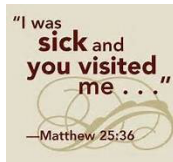
