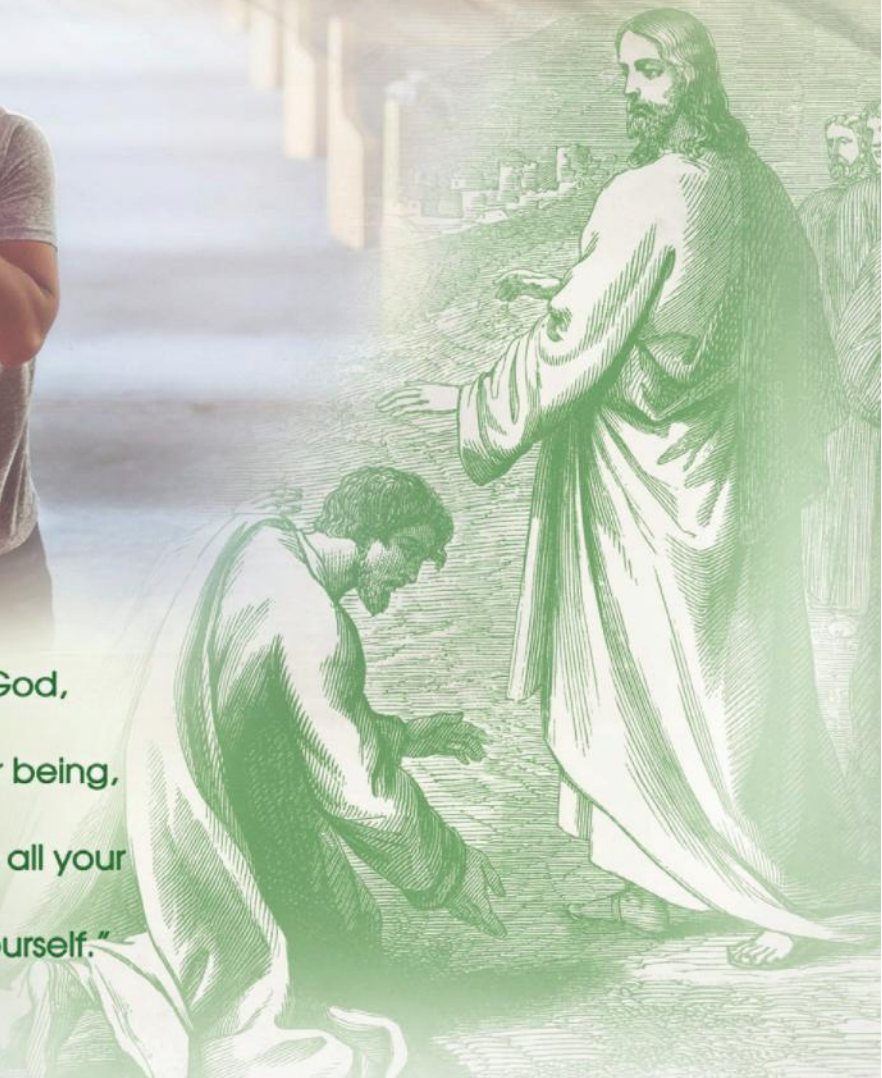

Stewardship Thoughts

God's law connects today's First Reading and our Gospel from the evangelist St. Luke. In the Book of Deuteronomy, Moses points out to the ancient Israelites that keeping God's law is doable for it is *already in your mouths and in your hearts*. In the Gospel, in the parable of the Good Samaritan, we hear Jesus encouraging us to express our love of God through love and mercy for our neighbor. For all Christians, love of God and neighbor are the two greatest commandments — and serve as the foundation for evangelizing through our acts of stewardship. One way to express the love of God is through our devout actions before and while partaking of the Holy Eucharist — the true presence of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord and Savior. Receive Holy Communion regularly for the strength and courage to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and perform other Corporal Works of Mercy.

Music Notes from Glenn Miller

A Singing Pilgrimage to the Holy City – Jerusalem

During the second half of the month of June I was blessed to have been on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land to sing and record Sergei Rachmaninov's greatest choral work, the *All-Night Vigil*, also known as *Vespers* with the PaTRAM Male Choir. The PaTRAM Male Choir is comprised of voices from around the world, including the United States, Canada, England, Australia, Serbia, the Ukraine, and Russia.

PaTRAM, which is an acronym for Patriarch Tikhon Music Institute, is an international organization whose mission is to foster the authentic and original splendor of Orthodox liturgical choral music together with its astounding spiritual depth. It has been the mission of its founder and chief benefactor, Alex Lukianov, to strengthen and heighten the role of Orthodox music not only in the United States but throughout the world through liturgy, concerts, and recording of the highest quality. Alex is a cradle Orthodox, and his father was the Metropolitan (archbishop) of the northeastern United States. A seasoned executive in the medtech sector, it was his dream that if his businesses were successful he would commit one-tenth of his prosperity to foster this tradition and honor his father. The result has been a series of recordings of the greatest works of this tradition, many of which have been Grammy nominees in recent years.

This pilgrimage tour was many years in the making and surmounted many obstacles. Originally it was to take place in Kiev but then the Covid pandemic hit, and then it was moved to Serbia, but again Covid took its toll. Finally it was scheduled to take place in Jerusalem. In retrospect all of us involved believe this was God's plan, to perform and record it in the holiest city on earth. Alex and the PaTRAM organization insured that this tour not only focused on musical matters but more importantly that it be a pilgrimage, going to and in many cases singing liturgies at all of the places central to Christ's life. Our home for most of the tour was the Pontifical Institute Notre Dame of Jerusalem Center, a beautiful guest house located across the road from the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, where Christ was crucified, buried, and rose again. The Church dates back to the fourth century after Constantine the Great converted to Christianity and sent his mother, Helena, to Jerusalem to look for Christ's tomb. With the help of the Bishop of Caesarea and the Bishop of Jerusalem, she found three crosses near a tomb on this site, one which allegedly cured people of death and was presumed to be the True Cross, along with the site of Golgotha, Christ's tomb, and the site of the Resurrection. One of many liturgies sung by the PaTRAM choir was late in the night at the Golgotha Chapel commemorating a significant date on the Orthodox calendar. The liturgy began at midnight and concluded at 4:00 a.m. Many of us would return to this site in the early morning and the evening to pray.

Our daily rehearsals and recording sessions took place on the Mount of Olives in the Church of the Ascension, on the site where Christ ascended. Other liturgies were sung at the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem in the chapel where Christ was born; Mount Tabor, where the Transfiguration took place; and the Church of St. Mary Magdalene in the Garden of Gethsemane. We also made pilgrimages to the Jordan River for a baptismal ceremony; to Nazareth, where the Annunciation took place and Jesus spent his childhood and adolescence and where we sang a concert; to the Mount of the Beatitudes, where Jesus preached the Sermon on the Mount; to Cana, where Jesus performed his first miracle; to the Sea of Galilee and the Dead Sea; and to Judea, the desert region so central to Abraham and the Old Testament. Seeing and experiencing in person these places which are absolutely central to the faith had the deepest effect on all of us; never will we read the Bible or say the creeds or pray the liturgy in the same frame of mind and heart as we previously did.

The choir gathered for this historic undertaking consisted of fifty five voices, with eight very low bass singers like myself providing the foundation that could be thunderous and massive as needed. The term for very low bass singers in Orthodox music is *oktavist*, simply because we sing essentially an octave lower than a normal bass or baritone. Because Orthodox worship is entirely sung with no other instruments, the role of the *oktavist* is especially important, providing support for the higher voices.

The Rachmaninov *Vespers* is one regarded as the pinnacle work of the Orthodox choral tradition. It was composed in 1915 on the eve of the Russian revolution and is regarded as major religious statement against the rising Communist tide. While not intended as a liturgical work, it follows the sequence of sacred texts and prayers of the liturgy with a focus on the Gospel accounts of the Resurrection. Vocally it places enormous demands on singers both in terms of range (from the lowest bass to highest soprano) and virtuosity. While Rachmaninov composed it for mixed voices – soprano, alto, tenor and bass - the PaTRAM project presents the work in an historic new version for all-male voices. My association with this work began thirty years ago when the work was being recorded in France by the Robert Shaw Festival Singers under the direction of Robert Shaw, the leading American choral conductor of the twentieth century. This recording was the springboard for my professional vocal career, as I am very frequently the "go-to" person in this country for ensembles performing this work. To date I've been a part of five recording projects, with the one made by PaTRAM in Jerusalem being the pinnacle. It will take approximately one year to produce this recording.

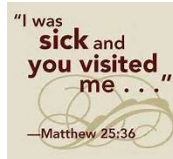

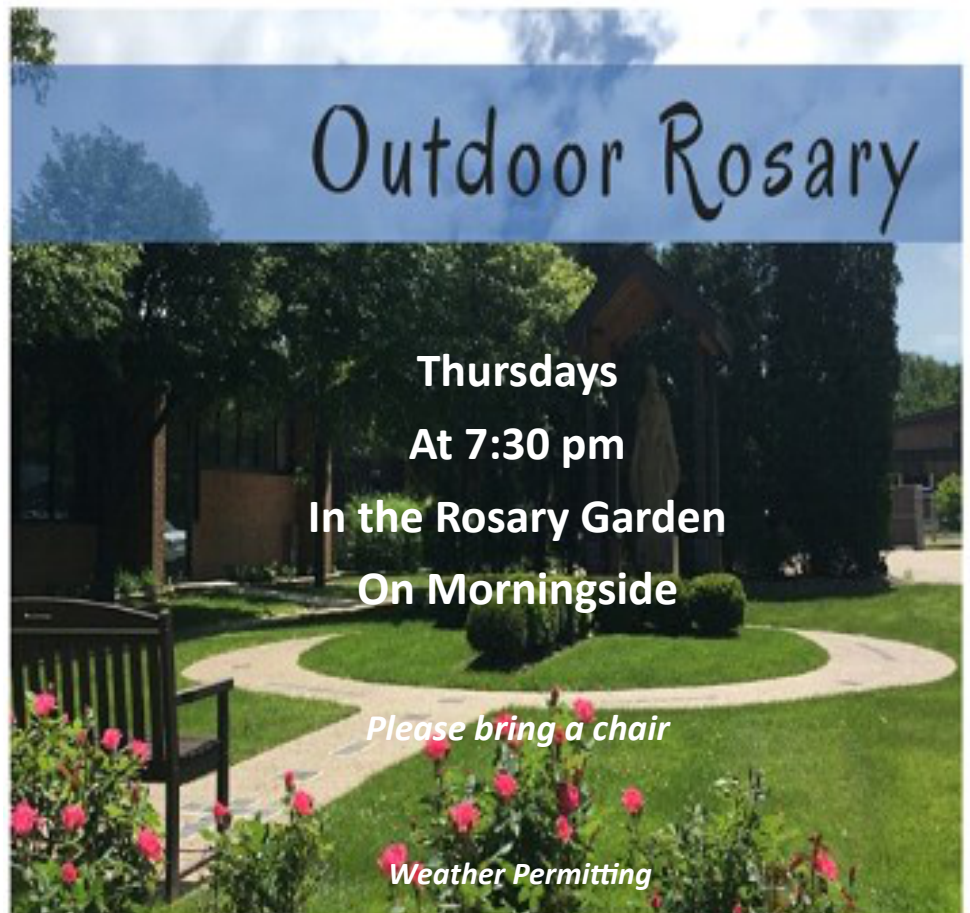
