# **Stewardship Thoughts**

A theme of perseverance in prayer connects today's Scripture readings. In the Book of Genesis, Abraham persists in prayer by negotiating with God to shield the innocent from His destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah. In this Gospel, the evangelist St. Luke retells Jesus' teaching of the Lord's Prayer to His followers. Christ, too, tells the parable of the man who visits a friend at midnight to request food and, through his determination, is successful in his efforts. Making quiet time for daily prayer is essential, but discerning God's response to prayer is also vital to strengthening our personal relationship, our discipleship in our Lord and Savior. Set aside a few minutes each day for a conversation with Jesus.











# Music Notes from Glenn Miller

# About today's hymns

Our opening hymn, "As we gather at your table" (*Ritual Song,* no. 848) was written by the Reverend Dr. Carl P. Daw Jr., one of the leading figures in

American hymnody in the past forty years. In addition to his experience as a parish priest and university chaplain, he served as the Executive Director of the Hymn Society in the United States and Canada, and served as Professor of Hymnology in the Master of Sacred Music Program at Boston University School of Theology. He has written five volumes of hymns and three volumes of liturgical music for the lectionary. The tune, *Nettleton*, is an American folk hymn which dates from the nineteenth century. The shape of this tune is easy to discern; the first, second and fourth phrases are exactly the same, and the third phrase basically repeats the same melodic pattern twice, which makes it very easy to learn this tune. It is also interesting to note that the tune is hexatonic, which means that uses only six notes of the eight note scale. The tune is named after a nineteenth century evangelist, Asahel Nettleton.

Our hymn for the preparation of the gifts, "Seek ye first" (*Ritual Song*, no. 728), is one of the classic examples of the twentieth century trend of setting Scripture directly to music, and it arose from circumstances strongly connected with its content. Its author, Karen Lafferty, in the midst of her own financial crisis in 1971, attended a Bible study one evening in her home church in Costa Mesa, California. The focus was on Matthew 6: 33, the basis for this song. When she returned home with that verse very much on her mind, she composed the melody. Stanzas two, three, and four arose anonymously from people who have wanted to extend this text. Stanza two is based on Matthew 7:7 and Luke 1:1-9; stanza three is based on Matthew 4:4; and stanza four is based on Matthew 18:20.

Our communion hymn, "Life-giving Bread, Saving Cup" (*Ritual Song* 920), is an adaptation of a text from the *Didache*, a brief anonymous <u>early Christian treatise</u> written in <u>Koine Greek</u>, dated by modern scholars to the <u>first</u> or <u>second century</u>. The text, parts of which constitute the oldest extant written catechism, has three main sections dealing with Christian ethics, rituals such as baptism and Eucharist, and Church organization. The composer, James Chepponis, is a priest of the Pittsburgh diocese, where he presently serves as Senior Parochial Vicar and Diocesan Director of Music.

Our closing hymn, "Lead Me, Guide Me" (*Ritual Song*, no. 712), was written by Doris Mae Akers, and comes from the African American gospel hymn tradition. Akers contributed some of the most notable gospel songs of the second half of the twentieth century. Born in Brookfield, Missouri, as one of ten children, she demonstrated her interest in music at the young age of six, teaching herself to play the piano by ear. By age ten, she had composed her first song, and by age twelve she had organized a five-piece jazz band. When she was told that she possessed a "magic" ability to capture the attention of a congregation, Akers dismissed it saying, "Magic, nothing—it's just letting go and releasing the Spirit of God." This hymn is based on Psalm 5: 8 and 4: 8, and refers to Jesus is one's companion. Stanza 1 acknowledges our need for Christ's "strength and power" during our "weakest hour." In stanza 2, "Satan and sin" attempt to lead us away from the "paths of righteousness." In stanza 3, the poet confesses that she is "lost" without Christ's "hand" and "blind" without "thy Light to see." The theme is reinforced by the last line of each stanza, "Lead me, O Lord, lead me," which segues into the refrain. Akers was honored by the National Organization of Black Catholics in 1987, when they named their official hymnal *Lead Me, Guide Me* after her 1953 composition. She was rewarded for her hundreds of gospel song publications by being called "Mrs. Gospel Music" by some, and was inducted posthumously into the Gospel Music Hall of Fame in 2001.






